## POLICE REMS

Vell we are in the third month of the year add to date we have had only two reported accidents, since before Christmas and they were only minor, are we, as motorists start ing to be careful or are we just lucky, I'd like to think we are starting to be careful.

No doubt, by now you have been the ades on T.V. and in the press about the new penalities for Exceeding $.05 \%$ etc. which became effective as fron the 1st harch and boy' are they tough, just for refusing a Preliminary Breath Test, is a licence cancellation of two years, if you have a reading of $.150 \%$ or higher, Police now have the power to suspend that drivers licence until he goes to Court, so those who now want to drink and drive will have to think very carefully as to whether it is worth the risk.

Also traffic Infringement ilotices (On the Spot Tickets) have increased, in some cases $100 \%$ of more, Failure to wear a seat belt $\$ 110.00$, Failure to give signals $\$ 85.00$, Fallure to give way at an intersection $\$ 135.00$ and thats only a couple of then, there are lots more like that and just as expensive, so when you work it out, if you are stiff enough to get a couple of tickets at the one time and Police can issue up to three at the one time, you have just lost a weeks wages, so really I guess it is now a time of restraint in your driving to save money.

You mey have noticed some rubber marks on the roadway in flain St., the two persons respnsible were intercepted and between the two of them are at present awaiting a Court appearance facing 9 charges, a fair to even chance that they will be walking for quite some time.

Early in the month a man from outside Romsey was apprehended in Romsey as a result of a donestic situation involving a firearm, his firearm was confiscated, Shooters Licence cancelied and he will face the Court on an Exceeding $.05 \%$ and Driving during a period Disqualification, the point that I am making is that you cannot, drink, frive and be in possession of a firearm, it is a definate 11010 .

Over the Christmas period and even up to now, we have had a number of burglaries in the Romsey, Lancefield area, most of the burglaries have occured in Weekend housed which are pretty isolated, plus a few on building sites, if you happen to be around these areas and see any strange cars that you think should'nt be there, jot the number down and give me a ring, thats one way of helping to prevent these problems.

Since School has gone back, I notice that a number of young children are riding bikes on the footpath, as a result a number of our elderly citizens have had some close scrapes, by these riders, the name of the game is one warning and then a ticket will be issued. So not it is up to the parents to start to educate their young ones, a case in point, the other day I saw a woman riding a bike on the roadvay whilst her son, I guess he was about 5 or 6 was riding along the footpath, another one was taking her son to school but they were both on the wrong side of the roadway, riding into oncoming traffic, its great to teach them but please try teaching then the right way from the outset.
So in cloaing, just remember the $.05 \%$ Legislation and on the Spot Tickets its your money and your licence.
