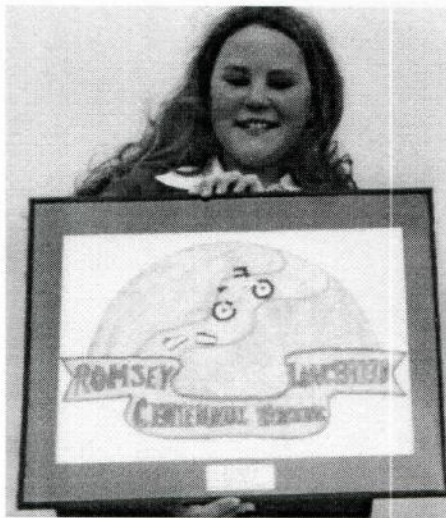
The resting place for all those who journeyed along the proposed track mid way between Romsey & Lancefield

As we were fortunate enough to be given a grant by the Macedon Ranges Shire Council to hold an event to mark Australia Day, 2000 - we had organised a Twilight Family Fun Walk on Australia Day - but due to the heavens opening exactly when it was all just about to happen! the walk was re-scheduled to the Saturday night, 29th January.

Around 60 walkers started out from Romsey Police Station and 70 from Lancefield Police Station and followed the route of the proposed track which had been slashed by Ian Wilkins, (Slashez, Romsey) who had been commissioned by the Macedon Ranges Shire Council to do this on our behalf. We all met in the middle - in Merrill O'Rourke's paddock on the corner of Boundary Road - slashed by Ian as well - and the Australian Flag proudly blowing in the wind! Members of the committee set up the BBQ kindly loaned to us by the Lions Club for which we thank them - pitched a tent (just in case), a porta loo (just in case! - down wind!!) and a few seats and tressles from which we served some 400 sausages on bread and cordial to quench the thirst! - all free for the many weary souls who had had such a great time getting to us! Cans of Soft drinks were also available at \$1 each. The kids played cricket and the adults had a great old chat - many who joined the throng were unable to do the walk but had driven to Boundary Road.

Mrs. Jean Tom, our President, presented a \$50 Dromkeen voucher to the winner of our logo competition - Miss Claire McCrory of New Gisborne Primary School (donated by Cr. Geoff Neil) and a \$50 voucher also goes to her school - (donated by Mr. Joe

John McCarthy (Lancefield Bus Lines) then turned up with his big white bus to ferry all the Romseyites back to the police station and the Lancefield mob just kept on eating and playing cricket until he came back!!! We thank John most sincerely for this fantastic gesture of support.

Time is limited - the track has to be ready to celebrate the Centenary on Australia Day, 2001 - so we must all work together on this one!

NUISANCE ON COUNTRY ROAD

In 1916 a couple who lived next door to a Salvation Army meeting house obtained an injunction restraining members of the Salvation Army from participating in accompanied singing, band playing, loud ejaculations of "Amen" and "Hallelujah", hand clapping and walking and stomping on the floor at their five meetings on Sunday mornings which commenced at 7.00am.

In 1973 another couple obtained an injunction restraining their neighbour from singing, shouting, whistling and swearing out on the street in front of the couple's home when he was inebriated.

In September, 1999 the Supreme Court of Victoria delivered its judgement in *Geoffrey v. Honig* (unreported, 1999). In that case the Magistrate had granted an injunction prohibiting a farmer from driving his cows on a public roadway on the basis that the blocking off of the road, and damage to the road surface and drains, and smells from cow excrement amounted to an interference with the adjoining neighbour's use and enjoyment of his property and constituted a private nuisance.

The Magistrate found that there had been physical discomfort as well as actual damage and granted an injunction absolutely prohibiting the farmer from ever driving any cows along the road in question.

On appeal, the Magistrate's injunction was set aside. In substitution, the Supreme Court ordered that the farmer be restrained from using the road "so as to constitute a nuisance to landholders and/or their tenants". In other words, the farmer could use the road to drive his cows provided that it did not constitute a legal nuisance.

As to what would constitute a legal nuisance in these circumstances, the Judge said:

- closing the road for 15 minutes in the morning and 30-45 in the afternoon, one day in three is not likely to constitute an actionable nuisance;
- substantial damage to the road's surface and neighbouring drains is likely to constitute a nuisance;

- the depositing, without removal to a reasonable degree, of cow excrement in such quantities as to make the road slippery and as to create unpleasant and continuing odours for those living just off the road may constitute a nuisance.

The case illustrates the principle that in all nuisance actions, a court must be satisfied that the annoyance is substantial and unreasonable taking into account its character and duration, the character of the neighbourhood and the purpose of the activity. This assessment will also involve a balancing, on standards of reasonableness of the co-existing rights of all those involved in the action. In his case the Supreme Court overturned the Magistrate's decision because there was no evidence that his balancing exercise had taken place.



from the Council Chambers

COUNCILLOR GEOFF NEIL - MONEGETTA WARD

Council elections are on Saturday March 18th. Only one nomination was received for both the Monegetta and Jackson Creek Wards. Residents in Mt William Ward (Romsey - north of Romsey Rd/Barry St) and Barringo Ward (Riddells Creek - west of Main Road and South of Sandy Creek Rd) are required to go to the polls. Voting is compulsory.

Fireworks are causing problems around the municipality. I must advise that to possess and use crackers, skyrockets etc a permit from Workcover is required (they are deemed to be explosives). During the fire danger period a permit is also required from the C.F.A. Penalties for breaches of these regulations are quite stiff. Dalys Bridge reconstruction has

been put back until at least April as the job is retendered due to the original quotes being exorbitant. Public meetings for the Residential & Industrial Review strategy will be held in Riddells Creek on 1st March at 7.00pm (Senior Citizens Centre) and Romsey on 9th March at 7.00pm (Old Shire Offices). The tender for works in Main Rd, Riddells Creek (construction of asphalt and brick footpath etc.) has been let for an amount of \$46,000. Works should be starting shortly. There will be some inconvenience to pedestrians but please be patient.

The Rural Addressing Program is virtually complete. A plea to all landowners (irrespective of rural, town

or business) to ensure that their property number is appropriately displayed. This assists visitors, tradespersons and emergency services to locate you quickly. Design work on the bridge over the railway line between Riddells Creek and Gisborne is nearing completion. I am very hopeful (with a substantial government grant) that the bridge will be replaced within the next 18 months.

Finally, another reminder for those that need to vote - Saturday March 18th. Pre Poll voting will be available as it was last time. Further details in local papers.

For some time now, I have been complaining about what I believe is a council that no longer represents the people and has a spending policy that is at the best, 'wasteful'. **Priorities and Democracy** seems to be a thing of the past. I truly hope that changes with a new council. It's often been said to me, "it's easy to complain, but what are you actually going to DO about it?". In answer: I will be running for council in the Mt William Ward at the up coming elections.

So, what can you expect from me if I am successful? What will I promise if you vote me in?... Well, I will **promise** very little. I was always taught that to promise people something that is out of your control to deliver, is to lie to them, and I

will not base my 'campaign' on lies. So I won't promise, the hospitals, industrial estates, lower rates, new industries, jobs etc., etc., that have been promised in other election. Although those thing would be nice, and doubtless everybody would support them if they happened. However, I **will** promise the following...

- I will run for council on the basis of getting the people of the Mt William Ward fair, proper and democratic representation with Local council. It is my intention to represent the ratepayers, not **dictate** to them

- I will fight to get the people of this ward a fair and proportional allocation of resources and services for the rates they pay. Mt William is the third biggest ward and contributes substantially to the Shire, yet we are continually treated like the 'poor ignored cousin'.

- I will make it my business to try to return some reality and prioritisation back into resource and funds allocation. I am at a loss to see how we can limit budget to infant welfare, roads, aged care etc., yet allocate funds to the myriad of 'pet projects' that council has done.

- Councillors are currently entitled to a wage (up to \$12,000 and \$36,00 for the mayor). This is to cover councillors costs (which can be considerable) and provide a personal income to recompense the councillor for his/her time. It is my intention to reject the personal income

and I donate the money back to the Mt William Ward to be used as the residents see fit.

- I will stand against 'pet projects' such as 'grants to sister cities', and the countless 'special interest' projects and 'deals' that happen until all the ratepayers get proper attention to the basic requirements of roads, water supply, refuse disposal and issues such as aged, youth and child care etc.

- I will stand against Council (or State Government enforced) legislation, regulations or costs that impose a further drain on the resources or the finances of the ratepayers unless the ratepayers indicate a true and real majority support for such a move.

- I will not support issues under pressure from vocal and outspoken 'special interest' groups when these issues effect the whole community **unless** the majority of the community show clear support for such action. I will represent ALL ratepayers, not just a vocal minority.

In short, I hope to be able to deliver **PRIORITIES AND DEMOCRACY.**

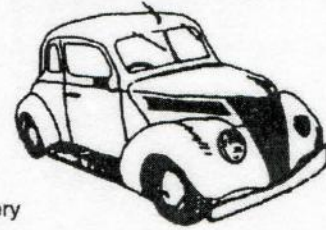



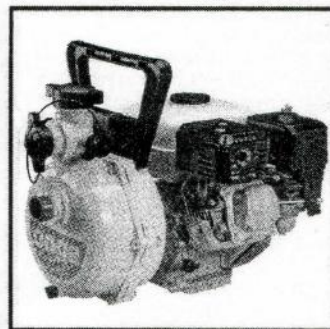
