ROMSEY PRIMARY SCHOOL TENDERS:

PCMSEY MECHANICS INSTITUTE:

During this year the Mechanics Institute has undergone renovations totalling \$51,000.

The work carried out has included substantial improvements to both male and female toilets. These are no longer public toilets, as they are accessible only from within the hall now. Handicapped people are provided for, hot water is available, extra basins and mirrors are fitted; vinyl tiles are on the floor and these areas have been painted.

The hall foyer has been painted and so has the main hall. In the hall accoustic tiles have been installed to improve appearance and sound quality. A color consultant advised on the color scheme. Anchor points have been installed on the walls for decorations. All that remains to complete the planned work is to instal new stage and window curtains. Vinyl tiles have been laid in the kitchen and supper room.

The Committee would like to thank those people and organisations who made donations to the appeal held early in the year. An amount of \$2264.00 was raised. The Committee had to borrow extra funds to complete the work and would be grateful for further donations if you have not already done so.

We wish to thank Mr. Duncan Barton who designed the renovations and drew up the plans (at no cost) and the Shire of Romsey and its officers for their assistance - without their assistance the work could not have taken place.
