ROMSEY FIRE BRIGADE:

THANKS - Romsey Fire Brigade, like many other community organisations, relies very heavily on local support to continue to operate. In particular local business is very helpful to the brigade.

Recently a number of local businesses have helped the brigade with works at the fire station, byrne's Paving completed the concreting of our driveway at minimum cost. newnham's Earthmoving and Romsey Sand and Gravel assisted with site and landscape works which will greatly improve access to the fire station during winter.

The brigade would like to thank byrne's paving, Newnham's Earthmoving and Romsey Sand and

Gravel very much for their support.

MISTRAL GYRO FANS

I hope that you are all aware of the risk of fire with some early model Mistral Gyro Fans. The brigade has been notified that the coroner has expressed concern with some further models of Mistral Gyro fan and recommends that these be destroyed. The models concerned are:

GA 16-70 (styles 1-21, 24, 32 and 40); GA 16-40; GA 12-10.

SMOKE DETECTORS

There has been a great deal of discussion about smoke detectors in the media and a number of brigade members have been questioned about them. Smoke detectors are required to be installed in new buildings and in existing buildings undergoing building work that requires a building approval. These smoke Detectors must meet Australian Standard AS 3786.

The brigade has received some information on types and locations for smoke detectors. these documents may be inspected at Romsey Post Office or romsey Sand and Gravel. romsey Fire Brigade

is not able to advise individual property owners about the installation of smoke detectors.

WHAT DOES IT COST FOR THE BRIGADE TO ATTEND?

Fairly regularly the brigade is asked how much it charges to attend fires and incidents. If you

have a building or contents insurance policy then there is no further charge.

If you are not insured then a charge is made, though this may be waived in exceptional circumstances. The minimum charge is for TWO UNITS attending for a half hour each and increases for longer periods or more units. All charging is done by the CFA and the local brigade does not receive these fees.

Please keep in mind that your local brigade consists entirely of VOLUNIEERS who are not paid for

their services. In fact, we have to pay for our own personal equipment.


You are invited to the Launch of Our History Book

The history of the Shire of Romsey "When Memory Turns the Key" will be launched by Emeritus Professor Geoffrey Blainey at 3pm on Sunday, 21st June, 1992 in the Romsey Mechanics Institute Hall. All interested members of the public are cordially invited to attend.

After five years' research by a small group of local residents, the story of this Shire has been assembled partly from local families, some of whom trace their histories back to Van Diemens Land convicts and Victorian pioneers such as Batman, Clarke and Fawkner. large collection of previously unpublished photographs and other illustrations complement this record from the days of the aborigines, through the period of exploration and settlement to the present time. The accounts of the development of the Roads Boards, churches, schools, health care, the special role of women, farming practices, vineyards, small businesses and sport are frequently amusing as well as informative. This hard cover 250 page book has an attractive slip cover featuring the earliest settlements in Riddells Creek, Lancefield and Romsey.

SHIRE COUNCIL

ROMSEY RIDING NEWS

During the month of May Council issued a planning permit for a B.Y.O. Licensed Pizza Parlour with seating capacity of 50 people for Shops 1 & 2 Romsey Village. Council also received advice from the Administrative Appeals Tribunal that the appeal lodged by the developer of a subdivision in Tickawarra Road against Council's permit conditions requiring construction and sealing of 300 metres of Tickawarra Road (the last section currently unconstructed north of Dowie Court) and transfer of land to Council was dismissed. The ratification of Council's permit conditions means that ratepayers will not have to pay for the road to be constructed if the subdivision proceeds and also receive title to a residential block of land.

Works have commenced on the construction and sealing of Murphy Street (between Main Road and William Street) and Glenfern Road (short section from Woodend Road) whilst a new concrete footpath has been completed along Main Road (Kathryn Street - White Avenue) . Residents will have also noticed that additional street lighting has been installed by the S.E.C. through out the township.

The Department of Sport & Recreation have recently inspected the Romsey Recreation Centre and viewed the plans for extension of the Centre as part of Council's application for funding by the Department. Plans of the extension are on display at the Recreation Centre with works programmed to commence in July/August 1992.

LICE INFORMATION UPDATE:


