ROMSEY FIRE BRIGADE

This winter has been relatively quiet for Romsey Fire Brigade. One car accident should remind us to drive responsibly and allow for poorer winter driving conditions.

Two house fires had the potential to be very damaging. Prompt action by the occupants and the brigade minimised damage. Even with small fires, smoke and structural damage can be very disruptive and unsettling to family life.

Please take care with fire and keep your home safe. Many families are drying clothes in front of combustion heaters. Don't place the drying clothes too close - some clothing materials are highly imflammable.

Fire Plugs

Help us and help yourself by tending to your nearby fire plug. When gardening clear around it and make sure the post can be easily seen.

Blue markers on the post make it easy for the brigade to locate the nearest fire plug at night. Faulty plugs should be reported to the Romsey-Lancefield Water Board at the Shire Office.



Almost exactly two months after the proposed commencement date of the new Romsey Primary School complex, the grade 3 & 4 pupils were delighted to see the first earth moving equipment begin operations on July 23rd.


As there have been many queries regarding the development together with a growing anticipation of things to come, I thought that the community would like to see some of the plans for our new school. The construction and total education complex adjacent to the new Kindergarten will be something that we will all not only be proud of but will also be able to use.

The floor plan above details three major, separate buildings that will be linked with covered ways and have additional facitilies that are not shown, such as the asphalt playing area, school oval, bike sheds, off street car parking etc.

The site occupied by the Primary school buildings is just a fraction of the master planned complex for which the land was acquired. Access will be possible to the school from Park Lane, White Avenue and a remade Station St. Eventually the Administration Block, library and Staff facilities will be greatly increased in size, forming the shared link with the proposed Secondary College.

As can be seen from the Western Elevation of the Administration Block, the buildings themselves not only reflect the arichectural brief developed by the Schools Planning Committee but also some of the traditional elements of the old Romsey Primary School building.

I trust that together we will ejoy watching the development of this very long awaited addition to Romsey's facilities. - Trevor Turnham - Principal.



ROAD SAFETY - CHILDREN AND SCHOOL BUSES.

- 1. In reply to a request from Shire of Romsey Secretary, Mr Peter JOHNSTON, (Ref- 35/100/030/KR:RPF) regarding the safety of children when alighting from school buses, I would like to endorse the remarks of the concern expressed by Romsey Shire Councillors.
- 2. It is in everyones interest that children, and Adults for that matter, are extremely conscious of the dangers which exist when alighting buses and crossing our Highways.
- I would urge you to draw this matter to the attention of at least every person who uses our school buses, if not all the children at your school, and Bus Proprieters, would you please draw these matters to the attention of all your drivers in an effort of strengthening the Safety standards of those whom use your buses.
- 4. Too much emphasis cannot be placed on Road Safety. We now must realise that there are far more vehicles using our highways (Roads) and we can no longer be complacent.
- I would suggest that as children are about to alight, keep reminding them of the dangers of the roads and insist they wait until the bus is completely clear of them and that they can cross the road only when they have full vision both ways. It will be far too late when someone is struck by another vehicle.
- 6. If you have any queries or suggestions or would like to speak to me about Road Safety in general or any problems you have, please make contact.



PSYCHIATRIC NURSES JOIN COBAW

New funding by the Office of Psychiatric Services in Bendigo has resulted in two Psychiatric Nurses being placed in the Cobaw Community Health Centre in Wedge Street, Kyneton, with Outreach to also cover the areas of Woodend, Lancefield and Romsey.

PSYCHIATRIC NURSES JOIN COBAW.....Continued.....

The community has acknowledged for some time the need for Mental Health funding in these areas. Up to date some limited psychiatric intervention from the Bendigo Community Mental Health Services at Olinda Street has taken place.

The integration of Community Mental Health Services with the Cobaw Community Health Centre will help meet the various needs of people with severe mental health problems and mental disorders which can't be met without access to housing, accommodation support, social support, community and domiciliary care, income security, employment and training opportunities, which can have a significant impact on the capacity of such a person to manage in the community.

The Cobaw Community Mental Health Services Program

This service is conducted by full-time Psychiatric Nurses, Scott McBurnie and Adele Walker, both whom have considerable experience in Clinical Psychiatry and commitment to excellent service.

They are highly skilled and versatile, offering the following services..

- * Crisis Intervention
- * Counselling
- * Psychiatric Assessment
- * Support and Relationship Difficulties
- * Improving Social Skills
- * Advice about Psychotropic Medication
- * Advice on the Management of Anxiety and Stress-related Problems
- * Individual and Group Psychotherapy
- * Assessment for Child, Adolescent and Family Therapy

AROUND YOUR ROMSEY HOME

An Uncommon Passion Flower - Passiflora 'Empress Eugenie'. In the fourth edition of Ernest E. Lora's "Shrubs & Trees For Australian Gardens" reference is made to several species of Passiflora as well as the beautiful hybrid P.'Empress Eugenie' which was brought to the attention of the author at a Garden Week Exhibition during the 1950's and has since been included in the fifth edition by Dr. James Willis. From information from England in 1963, it would appear that the plant obtained by this writer from Haxelwoods' Nurseries in N.S.W. during the late 1940's originated in France during the second empire and was probably names 'Imperatrice Eugenie' after the wife of Napoleon 3. A presumed hybrid between P alata and P. caerulea, it is mentioned in an article by the nurseryman George Gordon in "Floral World & Garden Guide", June 1874. Information from N.S.W. supports this assumption and a coloured print from U.S.A. of an apparently identical flower labelled "P. pfordtii (syn. alato-caerulea") also supports this view.

With its large fragrant flowers up to 13cm across at its best, pink petals alternating with white sepals, a large purple corona topped by 5 golden anthers and attractive trilobed foliage from December to April in Romsey and for longer periods in warmer climates.
