




USEFUL IDEAS FOR RE-USING MILK CARTONS

There are many useful ways to re-use milk cartons such as these two ideas shown below:

HANGING PLANTER

Cut the top from a 1 litre carton. Cut each corner down 20 mm from the top and bend back. Cut openings in four sides. For the roof, cut the gable from a 2 litre carton 15 mm from the gable line. Fit the two pieces together snuggly and glue. Use a plastic cup for the plant container. Your planter is ready to hang or use as an attractive table decoration.





A PATIO DECORATION
Take a 2 litre carton. Cut a hole in the top of the gable. Cut out any desired design on four sides of the carton. Glue coloured cellophane onto the inside of the carton. Reseal the gable top and insert paper clips for hooks.

ROMSEY COUNCIL NEWS

ROMSEY RIDING

During April, Council issued a Notice of Decision to Grant a Permit for a Community Church to hold meetings upstairs above its shop in Romsey Central. Concerns over parking of cars interfering with customer-parking for the local traders were addressed by Permit conditions, which restricted parking of church-goers cars to certain areas away from the shops.

A Notice of Decision to Grant a Permit was also issued for the construction of shops and a medical centre, and refurbishment of the old National Bank building. Also issued in relation to this property was a Permit for subdivision of the land into four allotments and common property, which means each shop will be on a separate title.

The State Minister for Education has refused to see a deputation from the Council to discuss the obligations of the State government to contribute more funds to the upgrading of Station Street. The Minister seems to be of the opinion that the present limited contribution by the State is appropriate, even though the main (or perhaps only) reason that the road is being upgraded is the construction of the new school. The Council is continuing to pursue the matter.

Landowners with open drains on their properties will be contacted by the Council, reminding them to keep the drain free of obstructions such as fencing, shrubs or buildings. The drains are there to carry away surface water and need to be kept clear to do that job effectively.

Unfortunately, little publicity was given to the first hard rubbish collection, which was carried out in Romsey on 21st April. Therefore, another collection is planned for June or July, which will be publicised in this news-sheet. Those who missed the last collection should watch for news of the next.

The Shire of Bulla has responded to requests from this Shire and others, and is carrying out further works at the Sunbury Road-Lancefield Road intersection. A 250 metre acceleration lane is to be provided to enable vehicles turning left out of Lancefield Road to merge with east-bound traffic on Sunbury Road.

Playground equipment is being set up on the Council-owned land in Desmond Court, and more will be erected soon on the land in Coleraine Drive.

A "Tradesman's Board" has been set up in the Shire Office foyer. Business cards can be fixed to this board, to assist local business people and the public to find each other.

ENDURING POWER OF ATTORNEY - CAPACITY OF DONOR

A Power of Attorney is a document by which you appoint a person to act as your agent. Powers of Attorney are especially useful therefore if you are going interstate or overseas or if you are il and unable to conduct your own affairs.

A General Power of Attorney cannot, however, be used if you subsequently lose your mental capacity. This is obviously unfortunate since the person you will have chosen to attend to your affairs will become powerless to act when most needed.

By contrast, an Enduring Power of Attorney will be capable of operating when you suffer loss of capacity. It allows the person you have chosen as your attorney to continue to manage your affairs if you subsequently become mentally incapable of doing so.

The issue of what mental capacity is required at the time of executing the Enduring Power of Attorney was raised recently in an English case. The court said that in practice it is likely that many enduring powers will be executed when symptoms of mental incapacity have begun to manifest themselves. These symptoms may result in the donor being mentally incapable in the sense that she or he is unable on a regular basis to manage his or her property and affairs. But providing the person executing the power does so with full understanding to have his or her affairs managed by an attorney of his or her choice, the intention of the legislation should not be frustrated.

The court ruled that an Enduring Power of Attorney will be valid providing at the time of its execution the donor understood the nature and effect of the document.

It would be wise to instruct a solicitor to prepare the document and to oversee its execution. Solicitor records will then verify the steps taken to establish the capacity of the donor to execute the power and any subsequent challenge to its validity will be avoided.

DRAFT BUSINESS PLAN 1993-1995

Council has prepared a draft Business Plan. This is the first Business Plan ever prepared by Council. It is a document of Council's current operations and future direction and is compatible with Council's financial budgeting. The Plan sets out Council's priorities and the strategies for achieving those priorities over the next 3 years. In other words, the purpose of the Business Plan is to assist Council in determining, in conjunction with it's budget process, the allocation of financial and human resources consistent with it's priorities.

The Business Plan reflects Council's priorities at this time, however, it will be reviewed annually to provide Council with the opportunity to change direction if required. Should economic circumstances and/or community expectations change, then Council will be in a position to address these changes annually as part of the review process and preparation of the budget.

As mentioned above, the 1993-1995 Business Plan is only a draft and Council wishes to seek public comment from the community before the Plan is finalized. The draft Business Plan is on public exhibition until 31st May 1993 during which time written comments can be made. Comments should be addressed to the Shire Secretary, Shire of Romsey, 98 Main Street, Romsey. Vic. 3434. The Plan is available for inspection at the Shire Office, Romsey. It is also available at the Darraweit Guim General Store, Lancefield Post Office, Monegeetta General Shire, Riddells Creek Post Office and Romsey Post Office.

The Business Plan should be seen as embodying statements of intent reflecting the attitudes and aspirations of the general community. 





BREAST SELF EXAMINATION PROGRAM

To begin with, we as women, can learn to develop the skills that can detect breast cancer in its very early stages.

Mammacheck is a program designed by the Anti Cancer Council of Victoria to teach women how to effectively examine their breasts for any lumps or changes that could be a sign of early breast cancer.

Mammacheck is conducted in small groups by a specially trained educator and teaches a method of breast self-examination (BSE) which is easy to learn. Mammacheck takes about an hour and includes a video, a discussion and an opportunity for you to practise on yourself over your clothing and on a breast model which teaches you what a breast lump feels like.

Mammacheck is now available in the Romsey area and we would like to offer you the opportunity to benefit from this program.
