Newspapers

☐ Make a good garden mulch. Use them instead of bark to prevent weeds ruining flowerbeds and paths. Top with soil or gravel to disguise. ☐ Strips of wet newspaper stuck on windows help protect them when you paint the window frames. Afterwards, just peel off. ☐ Individually wrap apples from the garden in newspaper - they'll keep for much longer. ☐ Scrunched up newspapers are great for cleaning car windows.

FUN WITH OLD NEWSPAPERS

Papier Mâché

Making models or masks out of Papier Mâché can be great fun, and a way of using up old newspapers. Here is a useful item for the home gardener, which can be used, given as a gift, or sold at craft markets.

You need:

Plastic plant pots - a range of sizes from "tubes" upwards Old newspapers (make sure everyone has finished reading them) Paste, made from flour and water. Products like "Clag" can be used.

Tear some newspaper into strips about 30 to 40 mm wide 50mm long wide and about

When you have about a bucket full of this paper, mix up the flour and water paste to consistency like "Clag".

Brush or wipe some paste onto strips of paper and lay the onto the outside of a plastic pot. Work around the pot, overlapping the strips in zigzag patterns so that the whole pot is covered.

Add more and more layers of pasted paper, building the layers up evenly around the pot, until the paper is between 5 and 10 millimetres thick.

Make sure the paper does not wrap over the lip of the pot, or get into the whole in the bottom of the pot, as this will make it hard to remove later.

When the paper has dried a little, but before it is too dry, carefully slide the pot out from inside the paper. If the shape sags a little, form it back to round, and leave it in the sun or a warm place to dry.

When dry and hard, carefully cut a round drain hole in the bottom, and trim the top evenly.

If you wish the finished paper pot can be painted, or decorated with coloured paper or pictures cut from magazines.

For the gardener, these pots are excellent for propagation of seedlings, or for "potting-on" of plants from tubes to larger pots. (Care needs to be taken not to over water paper pots.)

When it is time to plant the seedling or plant into the garden, simply cut the bottom out of the pot, and plant the rest into the ground. The paper will decompose from around the roots.



ROMSEY SHIRE COUNCIL NEWS

DRAFT DEVELOPMENT PLAN

Council is considering the future development of the area of land bounded by Main Street, White & Station Streets (next door to the Kindergarten). A plan of possible development of this land into a park with the provision of BBQ, toilet block, rotunda and mini amphitheatre has been prepared and is available for viewing at the Shire Offices. Comments are invited on the proposal.

FREE TREE DAY - THIS SATURDAY 14TH MAY 1994.

Residents are advised that the Annual Free Tree Day is to be held on Saturday 14th May, Main Street - Lions Park commencing at 10-00a.m. until stocks are exhausted.

4 AUSTRALIAN NATIVE TREES PER FAMILY for residents of the Shire are being provided.

SUSPENSION OF KERBSIDE RECYCLING SERVICE:

Council recently entered into a contract with Craigieburn Excavations for collection of recycable materials commencing on 4th April 1994. The contractor has advised that he will now not continue the service due to inability to fulfill contract requirements. Discussions and negotiations with other parties has already commenced but regrettably Council advises that the kerbside recycling service is suspended for the time being until further notice.

ESTABLISHMENT OF A PRISON WITHIN THE SHIRE:

Council was recently requested by the Department of Justice to advise as to whether there were any suitable sites within the Shire for the provision of a Female Prison. After reviewing the matter and receiving considerable Community objection Council has resolved to advise the Department that there are no appropriate sites in the Shire of Romsey to establish a Prison.

MONSTER MUD CHALLENGE:

A planning permit has been issued for a 4WD mud trial event to be conducted on Sunday 29th May 1994 on the former "Muddy Rock" site, Romsey-Wallan Road. The event is expected to attract a crowd in the order of 5000 people.

KERBSIDE COLLECTION OF RECYCLABLE MATERIALS

This is an important notice to all those persons who are within the declared garbage collection district and who separate recyclable materials for collection.

Due to the failure of the Contractor to fulfil his contractual obligations to collect recyclable materials the "recycling" collection service is to be suspended immediately and residents must not place out recyclable materials for collection.

For the time being, residents should place their recyclable materials in their garbage bin for collection and disposal.

Negotiations are underway in an attempt to recommence the service as soon as possible and if this occurs further public notice will be given.

Please note that the garbage collection service is unaffected and will continue as normal.

KILMORE - ROMSEY BOOKMOBILE

The Kilmore - Romsey Bookmobile has been serving residents of Romsey since 1978. Since then the population in the shire has increased dramatically, and the bookmobile service has increased in hours, sites, and resources accordingly.

Last year loan statistics for the bookmobile in the two shires it serves reached 94,819, (an increase of 9.3% over the previous year) and it is anticipated that the landmark figure of 100,000 loans issued on the bookmobile will be achieved in 1994.

Currently the bookmobile serves 6 schools (Lancefield, Romsey, St Mary's, Bolinda, Darraweit Guim and Clarkefield primary schools) and 3 towns (Lancefield, Romsey and Riddles Creek) in the Shire of Romsey.

In February this year, the bookmobile's computer system, along with the rest of the library service, was upgraded from Libs 100 to Libs 100 Plus. For users of the bookmobile this means a more user friendly Public Access Catalogue, a more efficient personal and telephone renewal service, and the ability to give borrowers more patron information such as the number and titles of books they have reserved. For library staff Libs 100 Plus keeps far more statistics on loans, borrowers and branches, more efficient check out and check in procedures, improved bibliographic control, and other features too numerous to mention.

The bookmobile offers a substantial collection of novels, large print books, books for children and teenagers, non-fiction, biographies, videos, and much more. It is the policy of Moonee Valley Regional Library that all its borrowers have equal access to the total collection in its 10 branches, regardless of whether they are using one of the large main libraries, or a bookmobile site that is open for only a short time each week. For this reason, when reservation charges were introduced in January of this year, there is no charge if a borrower requests an item that is indicated on the catalogue as "on shelf" at any branch of the library service. Therefore at any one time the Kilmore - Romsey bookmobile has approximately 5000 items on its shelves, but via the Libs 100 Plus catalogue, the users of the bookmobile have the same access as borrowers in the larger static branches to the 424,000 items held by Moonee Valley Regional Library Service. Any title listed on the catalogue can be reserved on the bookmobile and it will be sent up there to await collection by the borrower as soon as it becomes available.




