ROMSEY RIDING

December, 1994

The Interim Report of the Local Government Board for the North-Central has been released, and it is proposed that a municipality be created, to be called the Macedon Ranges Shire, comprising the whole of the Shire of Gisborne, the whole of the Shire of Newham and Woodend, part of the Shire of Romsey, excluding the Chintin, Springfield and Darraweit Guim areas, and part of the Shire of Kyneton, excluding the Baynton and Sidonia areas. This creates a new municipality with an area of 946.5 square kilometres, and a population of 31,860.

Further details can be obtained from Romsey Shire office (295 201), and any comments or submissions can be made to the Shire or to the Local Government Board.

Returning to the business as usual department, Council issued a Permit last month for the premises at 106 Main Street, Romsey, to be used as offices.

Council also allocated funds to each of the four Landcare groups operating within the Shire, to assist with the excellent works which those groups perform.

The plans by Council to subdivide and sell its land in Metcalfe Drive have been put on hold following submissions from adjoining residents. The portion fronting Desmond Crescent will now be set aside for use as a park, and investigations are under way to determine the best way to market the balance of the land without causing unnecessary adverse impact on the area.

Two reports have been received by Council in recent times, which impact on the rural nature of our Shire. One is a Land Capability Report, prepared by the Department of Conservation and Natural Resources. This Report details the capability of land in the Shire for agricultural production, for building footings, for dam construction and for septic tanks. In line with State Government policy, these matters should be taken into account when determining planning permit applications in rural areas, and reference to this Report is intended to be included in the Planning Scheme.

The second Report is the draft Roadside Management Plan, which has been prepared in conjunction with Newham and Woodend and Kyneton Shires. The Plan has assessed all roadsides in the three Shires to determine their conservation value, and has developed management guidelines in conjunction with Government departments, the Councils and other community groups. This draft Plan is on exhibition at the Shire Office and public comment is sought.

Sad to say, this may be the last Romsey Riding Council Report. As your representatives, we would like to thank you for your support, comments, and even your criticism over the years. We hope that we have done a good job representing your interests through Council, and also would like to thank the officers and staff of the Shire for all their efforts.

We hope that everyone has a Joyous Christmas and can look forward to a happy and prosperous New Year. Please take care of each other and yourselves, and be careful on the roads.

Whilst driving through Lancefield the other day, I noticed a sign for a gallery. Well I decided that as I had a few minutes to kill I'd stop and have a look. I'm glad I did! I discovered a little treasure house. I've since gone back there and finished all my Christmas shopping. Let me tell you what I found.

For my mother I found a beautiful silk scarf - hand-dyed and Australian made - so I bought another one to mail to a friend in England. I picked up a teddy bear for a young nephew and discovered to my amazement that it was handmade right there in Lancefield. It is simply beautiful. A large glass platter was just right for my brother and his wife. I had been looking for some of those beautiful Windsong wind chimes and found them there, and cheaper than other shops.

Fathers are notoriously hard to shop for but I was given a great idea by the proprietors. I bought a big terracotta pot from the nursery at the property and filled it with delicious edibles. They have wonderful things like cherries and macadamia nuts in brandy, prunes in port, figs and walnuts in rum, port and clove jelly, lots of mustards and vinegars and chocolate coated coffee beans - just the sort of thing my dad would love but not necessarily buy for himself.

I also discovered some absolutely beautiful lead crystal plates and vases and paperweights. I didn't know that crystal was made in Australia let alone Victoria but the owners assured me that it certainly was and that this particular craftsman would be exhibiting his work in Lancefield in March next year. I asked to be put on their mailing list so I will not miss out on the opening.

I bought some glass balls for our Christmas tree, some cute little notepad sets featuring Australian wildflowers that I can send to friends overseas. They are light and won't cost much to post. They have some lovely greeting cards that I hadn't seen before and gift wrap and boxes that are really terrific. I found it very hard to choose from the work of several potters on display - all well made and each so different in style. They have little wooden toys and jigsaw puzzles for little kids, candle making and pot pourri kits for bigger kids and so many other exciting things I had to go back a second time and find something for myself - a gorgeous hand-dyed silk t-shirt that feels so good on my bare skin.
