NOVEMBER NEWSLETTER

HAYFEVER

From now until Christmas is the peak time for Hayfever. It is a condition that can affect all age groups. The most common symptoms are a runny or stuffy nose, sneezing and itchy eyes. The cause is the grass pollens which are around in the air in Spring and early Summer.

There are a number of remedies. Some antihistamine preparations are available "over the counter" and are usually effective. The newer products cause little sedation. It is important to tell your Doctor or check with your chemist if you are taking antihistamines. They can cause harmful effects when taken with some other medications. Simple nose sprays and anti-allergy eye drops can also be bought from the chemist.

In more severe cases, prescription-only antihistamines, eye drops and nose sprays may be given by your Doctor.

For some people, desensitising injections can be very useful. These are given before the start of the hayfever season and are prepared according to the results of skin tests performed by an allergy specialist. They cannot be given during the hay fever season. Your Doctor will be happy to discuss your symptoms and advise on any treatment required.

RIDDELLS CREEK SURGERY

The Riddells Creek Centre is currently underoing renovations. Some took place earlier this year when the "dunny" in the back yard was replaced by an indoor loo.

The new reception area has been completed and has been designed to fit in with the "olde worlde" atmosphere of the buildings. Further alterations will be taking place over the next few months.

ANCILLARY SERVICES

There are a range of paramedical services available at the Romsey Medical Centre. Many are aware of the dental service, physiotherapy, X-Ray and pathology collection. The dental practice hours have recently extended. Bookings can be made through the Medical Centre up to 7.00p.m. on Mondays, 2.30p.m. Tuesdays, 12.30p.m. Wednesdays and 6.00p.m. Thursdays.

The Medical Centre also offers regular sessions for audiology

(hearing service), opthalmology (eye specialist), podiatry and orthotics (orthopaedic shoe fitter).

ST MARY'S SCHOOL, LANCEFIELD

Applications have been received from Grade 6 students to lead Peer Support Sessions with Grade 3 and Cross Age Tutoring with Prep children. Parents can be proud of the attitude of the students towards these responsible positions.

"Ball Bonanza" results were very good. We have received 25 balls and expect another 32 soon. Thank you to all who saved coupons for us.

After a vigorous skipping program, Jump Rope for Heart was conducted in extremely cold, windy conditions. 10% of the funds raised is returned to the School - this will be part of our Mission Effort.

In conjunction with "Heart Health Week" the 4th Term Healthy Lunches menu was launched at the Canteen. Amongst other more healthy lunches the children may now order "Big Bird", "Aussie" and "King Neptune" Pitas - (pita rolls with generous fillings of salad with chicken, tuna or ham).

Miss Hiromi Hagihara, Japanese Teacher at St Mary's, recently taught the Senior Grades to make Origami Peace Cranes. These were sent to Japan and placed in the Peace Park in Hiroshima during services for World Peace. Children from all grades were able to try out their language skills when a friend of Hiromi came to visit. They were delighted when they were able to communicate with a mix of gesture and spoken Japanese.

Tennis enthusiasts have been attending coaching sessions each Thursday morning.

The final Family Life Education Program will be held on 1st November for children in the Junior School with their parents. We are fortunate to have a trained presenter (Mrs Kath Addicoat) on our staff.

Staff at St Mary's continue to broaden their understanding and skills through Professional Development. Places have been gained in highly sought after courses - "Readers, Writers & Parents" - (forming literacy partnership with parents), "Paired Reading" - a cross-age tutoring program and "P.M.P. -Perceptual Motor Skills Program for Junior School students.

Parents continue to make a contribution to St Mary's through many varied opportunities. While many parents work with Staff and children in curriculum areas, the school grounds are being improved through a series of working bees.

St Mary's School Board has its Annual General Meeting on 14th November. Guest Speaker for the evening will be Sr Anne Boyd from the Catholic Family Centre. Sr Anne will speak on the role of the school in the life of the family.

On 20th and 21st November parents will have the opportunity to hear Barry Dwyer, a well known facilitator and lecturer, on Partnership in Education.

A donation from St Mary's Parents and Friends has been used to purchase science resources. The next P. & F. social fundraising activity is the Oaks Day Luncheon and Fashion Parade on 9th November.



INFORMATION FOR LOCAL MOTORISTS

Due to recent incidents involving motorists who create potentially dangerous situations whilst setting down and picking up children form school, Council Local Laws Officers will be patrolling the vicinity of the school and nearby streets.

- Within 9 metres of an intersection

SEYMOUR COTTAGE FOR HISTORIC BUILDINGS REGISTER?

The Historical Society has been notified by the Historic Buildings Council that it is considering adding Sidney Seymour Cottage at Romsey to the Historic Buildings Register, because of its local historical significance. The cottage, named "Barton", in Palmer Street is the earliest building still surviving in Romsey, and is one of the few prefabricated houses from the gold rush days in existence. It was erected about 1855 using ready made panels of meranti from the tropical regions of Asia as the home of Sidney Seymour and his family. In 1982 the cottage was donated to the Romsey and Lancefield Historical Society Inc. by local resident Mrs Isa Allen, to be restored and maintained on behalf of the people of the district.

Since this time a great deal of work has been done by society members to make the cottage available for inspection and functions. The monthly meetings of the society are held there, and the Seymour family hold reunions there every few years. Working bees are held on the second Saturday of the month to keep the nineteenth century style garden in order and work on preserving the building. Any help at these would be greatly appreciated. The next working bee is on 11 November at 9.00 a.m..

A street stall will be held at the Romsey Central shopping centre on Saturday morning, 25 November. Funds raised are needed to pay the rent on the Lancefield Court House Museum and maintenance of it and Seymour Cottage. A special feature will be the sale of tea-towels, teaspoons and mugs with pictures of the courthouse or cottage on them at specially reduced prices -- making them good gifts, especially to send to someone who has left the district.

The society's Christmas break-up will be held on Sunday, 10 December, at Sidney Seymour Cottage. After a barbecue tea in the garden, commencing about six o'clock, Dr Don Garden will present an address on 'The Environmental History of the Macedon Ranges'. All members and any interested people are welcome to attend. Cost to non-members is \$10.

The next historical society meeting will be held at Seymour Cottage on Tuesday, 28 November at 8 p.m.. All welcome.



"Bungawitta News"

An innovative LANDCARE ENVIRONMENT ACTION PROGRAM (LEAP) funded by the Commonwealth Department of Employment, Education and Training (DEET) is challenging commonly held views that young people make little contribution to their local community.

Based at the Old Primary School in Romsey, twelve long term unemployed young people are participating in the Romsey "Bungawitta" Restoration LEAP Project. The project focus is on restoring the facade of the 120 year old primary school building, constructing and designing an environmental playground for children, establishing fences around the boundary of the site, revegetating the grounds with indigenous species and completing an oral history of the buildings use over the past century.

The site will be used by the community for classes such as yoga and as the site for the Romsey Playgroup (hence the name of the project "Bungawitta" which means place of little posssums). The information gained during the oral history component of the project will be documented in the form of a booklet that will be distributed within the local community.

Through participating in the six month project participants are gaining skills in horticulture, carpentrty, painting, computers, drawing up of plans, ceramics and community consultation.

The joint sponsors for this youth training initiative are the Romsey - Lancefield Lions and the Romsey Playgroup. An important feature of the LEAP project is that it encourages and supports participants to make links with local employers through work experience placements.

The participants in the project are also undertaking two days per week of accredited TAFE training. This is being delivered by the Kyneton campus of Loddon - Campaspe TAFE, and some of subjects covered include communications, information technology, problem solving and horticulture.

The Department of Business and Employment is the Broker for this project and others throughout Victoria. Speaking on behalf of the Department, Regional LEAP Co-ordinator, Narelle Staub said.. "This is a great training opportunity for young people living in the Romsey area who are keen to increase their skills and knowledge in order to get back into the workforce or further training. The enthusiasm and effort of the young people involved has been very inspirational to people such as myself, who have been involved since the inception of the project."

Barry Chapman who is the Supervisor of the LEAP Project added that "In addition to the skills and experience participants will gain during project there is a real opportunity for individuals to become actively involved with and make a contribution to their local community. I am confident that the work we will complete will be of great interest and benefit to the community."

LEAP Regional Co-ordinator, Narelle Staub said she was keen to hear from employers willing to give the young people a job.




