MOUNT WILLIAM ABORIGINAL STONE QUARRY

The Aboriginal stone quarry was the subject of an interesting address given to the historical society by Robyn Poletti at the July meeting, held at "Woodlands", the home of Elaine and George Lobb. This informative evening was enjoy by all present.

Stone from Mount William quarries was traded throughout south eastern Australia for many centuries by the Aborigines for making implements, in particular stone tomahawks. The greenstone from this area has special qualities that allow a sharp edge to be ground on it. The stone was very well sought after. It was traded at tribal gatherings held at traditional meeting places at a time when there was an abundance of food, and drinking water was plentiful. The days were spent in hunting, trading, and performing sacred ceremonies, and in the evening all joined in corroborees. Of the examples found, 29% have been recovered more than 300 kilometres from Mount William, and only 27% within 100 kilometres of the quarry. Strict rituals were observed when Aborigines from other areas came to trade with goods such as rugs, weapons, ornaments, necklaces or belts. A possum rug was worth about three pieces of stone. Isabel McBryde, who retired last year as head of the Department of Archaeology and Anthropology at the National University in Canberra, has studied the quarry for over twenty years. She considers it to be one of the most notable archaeological rock quarries in the world, as well as one of the largest and most sophisticated in its operation.

The Historical Society is most grateful for the donation received from the organisers of the B.& S Ball held at Lancefield this year. The money will be used to help finance the brochures being prepared to publicise the historic places in Lancefield and Romsey.

The next meeting of the historical society will be held at Seymour Cottage, Palmer Street, Romsey, on Tuesday, August 27 at 8 p.m..

The aims of the Challenge project are to Challenge the children to participate, Challenge the parents to let their children become involved and to Challenge the community to get behind the program and give it the necessary support. The Challenge group involves the whole family, in particular other children in the family who are so often forgotten when a child unfortunately becomes ill, needing all the parents' support and attention. They bring the family back together involving them as one and encouraging them to support each other as well. The original "Crop a Cop" challenge began in Victoria with a small group of Police taking up the

challenge. They in turn challenged other Police around Victoria and it has now become Australia wide. Approximately 1800 Police are expected to turn up in Sydney to be cropped on Saturday 17 August 1996. The Lancefield/Romsey "Crop a Cop" will be held on the same day to coincide with the Sydney event.

ROMSEY TOWNSHIP SPLIT INTO 2 WARDS!! DO YOU WANT THIS??

The Macedon Ranges Shire has decided to divide Romsey township into two wards - Mt. William to the North and Monegeetta to the south. The dividing line is to be the Woodend Romsey Road.

The impact upon Romsey is two fold.

-Firstly with reduced numbers it will be impossible to guarantee a councillor can be voted into council from Romsey (we only have to observe the dramatic neglect of the township to understand the effect of no councillors).

-Secondly the unity and cohesion of a township determines how well it will prosper and develop its own identity. Rural people have a common understanding of what they expect from their township and are usually actively involved in maintaining their own town personality. The Council has taken upon itself, without communicating with the people, or seeking feedback, to divide the township of Romsey into two. Any division is negative when it is imposed and not sought after.

The Ministry of Local Government has indicated that with sufficient community outcry the Macedon Ranges Shire boundary proposal can be overturned.





SAFE EXERCISE FOR OLDER ADULTS



Often older adults overrate the benefits of the light and infrequent exercise they do get and also underrate their real ability to exercise.

It is never too late to take up an exercise program - age is no barrier to fitness, although you may need to consult your doctor if you intend to significantly change your exercise regime. Regular and enjoyable physical activity is not a cure for all ailments, but it is an effective and low cost form of preventative health care. It also provides the opportunity for new social contacts and friendships:

Just twenty minutes of the right kind of exercise three times per week can bring about measurable improvements.

With regular, enjoyable exercise, you will experience many benefits. Physical fitness allows older adults to be more self-reliant and improves their quality of life. Studies have shown that a one-fifth gain in heart-lung fitness can extend the period of independence of older adults by as much as six to eight years.

Surveys by the National Heart Foundation have found that about half of all people aged between 50 and 64 were overweight or had high cholesterol levels, and about one third smoked or had high blood pressure. All of these factors are associated with heart disease - the leading cause of death in Australia. Exercise greatly reduces the effects of all these factors but only about 10% of people in this age group did enough exercise to obtain health benefits.

The key points to remember about physical activity are - frequency, intensity, time and type of activity.



August is a busy month in the garden preparing for spring!! It is the month for Pruning your roses and fruit trees (except Apricots).

BEAT THE PROBLEM NOW!!

Fruit trees should be sprayed to prevent diseases such as Leaf Curl in stone fruits. Leaf Curl is a fungal disease that affects both ornamental and fruiting varieties of peaches and other stone fruit trees.

This disease causes leaves to thicken, distort and take on a pink appearance. Eventually the leaves fall and the tree can become weakened and much less productive as well as unsightly.

Complete control is easy and takes just one spraying but timing is all important using the fungicide "Cupric Hydroxide" which is sold under the name **Kocide**.

Spray trees all over when leaf buds begin to swell but before any leaves have appeared. Bud swell usually occurs in late August/September. Examine your own trees now to determine their readiness.

Remember - This disease can only be controlled NOW!!

It's still not too late to purchase Bare Rooted fruit trees, ornamentals, roses and weeping trees.





At a Special Meeting called on the evening of 18th July, the following motion was put to the financial members of the hospital:-

"That the Board be authorised to liquidate the assets of the Association to include the sale of the land and buildings - with a view to achieving the best financial results". This motion was moved, seconded and carried with an overwhelming majority in favour of the motion. It was noted that one Proxy vote was opposed to the motion. The Board will now appoint an agent to guide them through the sale of the building and land and this will be done as soon as is practical.

The Board called for public assistance for suggestions as to how to utilise the monies raised from the sale of the assets in December, 1995. We are now in receipt of these suggestions and when the assets are realised we will then be able to assess them in accordance with the Rules of the Hospital, which dictates that the monies be spent in the local community on a health care project. The suggestion to hand are as follows:-

- I. Supply of Emergency Equipment
- 2. Provision of Pilot Actuated Airport Lighting at Romsey and Lancefield Ovals
- 3. Establishment of an Ambulance Service
- 4. Emergency Services Relocation in the Romsey area CFA
- 5. Solar Heating and roof over Lancefield Swimming Pool
- 6. Scholarships to assist Medical Students
- 7. Relocation of Lancefield Kindergarten
- 8. Donation towards the cost of "Caladenia" Kilmore Hostel
- 9. Proposed Recreation/Sports Centre in Lancefield
- 10. Lancefield Fire Brigade consideration for funding

We would point out that these are all the suggestions submitted and some may not come under the criteria mentioned above. They will all, however, be investigated. Please feel free to contact me should you have any questions at this time.



THE GIFT OF LIFE......

SO, you want to be an organ donor but are not sure how to go about it?

In Victoria it is simple, thanks to the world's first computerised organ donor registry.

Set up two years ago at the Royal Melbourne Hospital, Victorians can join the registry by filling out a form which comes with every motor vehicle licence renewal. Potential donors who don't have a car can get the forms from the registry itself (1800 645 899) or in Romsey at the Book Exchange!! Unlike other states, Victorians are issued with a card that is linked to a central computer system and regularly updated. The registry provides a practical way for people to indicate their wishes to donate their organs for transplantation, but of course its best to discuss this with your family - NOW! Compared with other nations Australia has a low donor pool - mainly because of our small population, and being so isolated, - we do not have the chance to trade organs with neighbouring countries - apart from the odd occasion with New Zealand. It is all the more critical that we all think about donation and support the world-leading work that our Australian Doctors are doing in this field. 


