Police are subject to so much criticism that it is great to have worked with a man who can professionally rise above the negative and get on with the task at hand. There is a message here though for us all. Let us more readily acknowledge the contribution and assistance that is provided. word of thanks and an acknowledging smile doesn't have to cost us anything but yet all those involved become a little richer for the experience. You know you word of encouragement and praise may be thing that keeps us positive and willing to keep going! Thankyou John for your counsel, friendship and professionalism. Be assured that you and Kay will be missed as you tour safely through this great country of ours.

We are currently waiting for a Sgt. to take up John's position. This vacancy should hopefully be filled next month. Meanwhile A/Sgt. Andrew Marciniak is O.I.C and he will be assisted by Snr. Const. Tony Carroll. Please direct routine queries to these men at Romsey Police Station on 54 295 46. If no one is in attendance the call will be diverted to Kyneton Police St5ation and messages will be passed on. If you urgently require Police to

attend your premises dial "000" and the closest Police unit will be despatched.

SHIRE NEWS.....

Further to the Ambulance Station at Romsey...I attended the meeting with Mr. Alan Pegg, Director Corporate Services, North Western Ambulance Service and the Woodend Ambulance Auxiliary. The Ambulance Auxiliary at Woodend had \$28,000 in the bank but Mr. Alan Pegg announced two paramedics are to be stationed at Woodend with Stationwagons. The Woodend Ambulance Auxiliary felt they needed all their money for that so they have offered all the support and advice they can. The Paramedics will arrive in about 18 months - this should be around the time the Romsey Ambulance arrives if all goes well. They will commence a survey very shortly of the needs in the area. I will keep you all posted.

Budget and Rates are a very hot topic - I must say Cr. Neil has put a lot of effort into this - there is no doubt all the former Romsey Shire residents will incur at 5-6% rate increase to bring everyone in the Shire to the same level. This, as well as the unfunded superannuation liability of about 3.6 million is a concern of all councillors. When you look at the hidden costs of amalgamation - the government's story of great savings does not ring true. The rate equalisation was endorsed by the Minister for Local Government about 2 years ago - it is a must - it would be illegal under the provisions of the Local Government Act for us not to do it. Cr. Neil and myself will fight for an increase in services and funding for both the Monegeetta and Mt. William Wards. Most other Councillors are sympathetic to our fight but we will see when they have to show their hand.

We were successful in gaining State funding for the second Youth Project Worker. He or she will start very soon so our youth will see the benefits of that appointment. The Shire of Mitchell are a bit envious because they missed out. I urge you to look at the budget and send us your comments during the public consultation process.

The Liquor Local Law is coming up as well as our Future Direction Plan.



WHAT CAN YOU EXPECT WHEN YOU CALL THE HOTLINE?

You can expect to discuss what you know with the Drug Intelligence Reporting Centre investigator on duty. The officer will be interested in names, associates, addresses, descriptions, vehicles, telephone numbers or anything that could be useful in an investigation. It doesn't matter if you don't know much — the smallest detail can provide a starting point for an investigation.

The investigator will ask questions to make the most of your information. Everything you say is treated in the strictest confidence. You can give as much or as little information as you like, and you don't have to give your name if you don't want to.

The information in your call will be immediately evaluated and checked against existing records, before further action is taken.





COUNCIL NEWS - MONEGEETTA WARD

Residents may recall, approximately three months ago, a public meeting was called to discuss a proposed Telstra facility in Crooked Road, Romsey. Recently a letter was received at the Shire authored by Hassell Consultants. The letter states in part "in light of the opposition to the proposed Romsey mobile telephone base station, it has been decided that the provision of this service to the Romsey and Lancefield areas is no longer a high priority for Telstra. Therefore Telstra is not actively pursuing an alternative location until the issue of community acceptance is addressed." It was interesting to note that after July 1, 1997, telecommunication carriers will be required to obtain a planning permit for mobile telephone network infrastructure.

Budget discussions are ongoing. Residents will soon be aware of and able to comment on our 97/98 budget proposal. Money is very tight and numerous capitol works projects throughout the Shire have been culled. There is no doubt in my mind that former Romsey Shire citizens will suffer a 5-6% rate increase over last year whilst the rest of the Macedon Ranges Shire gain a percentage drop. This strategy (rate equalisation) was endorsed by the Minister approximately 2 years ago.

Roads are still a problem as is Bencons capacity to perform proper/appropriate maintenance. Playground equipment throughout the Shire is undergoing a \$70,000 upgrade with additional equipment on order for installation before next summer. Playgrounds earmarked for urgent attention include the Lions Park in Main Street, Collier Close and the Recreation Reserve, Romsey

Finally, the Shire will hold four township meetings during July, inviting proprietors of registered business premises to become involved in Councils five star business rating system. Although initially being trialled within the local food industry, Council is considering extending its rating system to all business premises. Ratings will be awarded annually as part of the year audit and renewal of registration, and up to five stars can be given based on a number of health and safety criteria as well as presentation and service. Meetings will be at Kyneton Town Hall (8th - 7pm), Romsey Service Centre (15th - 7pm), Gisborne Service Centre (22nd - 7pm) and Woodend Service Centre (29th - 7pm).

Pupil Road Safety: This is a prime concern to parents, teachers and school councillors and is the reason why School Council have decided to permit only Year 4 students to ride their bikes to school unless younger children are under the supervision of an adult. information evening will be held at 7.30pm on the 17th July (during the first week of next term) and it is planned that this policy will come into force during the second Mr. John Mackintosh who has previously week of term. been a consultant with Vic Roads with relationship to bike safety in schools has agreed to speak to parents and show a video. Sport Safety: Councillors recently endorsed the school safety code which strongly recommends the wearing of correctly fitted mouth guards during all contact sports. Please watch the newsletter next term for further details in regard to this safety initiative. Dental injuries are the most common type of facial injury sustained during participation in contact sports. The majority are preventable if a professionally fitted mouthguard is worn.

A mouthguard should:

* be worn during training and competition by all children who participate in contact sports.

- Be comfortable. * Have good retention and fit.
- * Cause minimal interference to speaking and breathing. Balanced Competition: In order to reduce the risk of injury, it is important to keep competitions balanced. Common sense should be used with consideration being given to the age, size, sex, strength, skill and psychological maturity of the players.

Crop A Cop is returning: School Council have endorsed this program and would encourage your participation. Const. Rob Harper, who takes lessons for our pupils, has given notice that he would like children to donate \$1 for his hair to be shaved off or \$1 for his eyebrows or \$1 for his moustache to be removed. He will look really strange won't he!

Constable Harper is planning a huge public relations day at Kyneton in October to which all children in neighbouring school from grade 3-6 are invited. This should really be an interesting day on which many branches of the Victoria Police will be able to demonstrate their skills and equipment. A Sausage Sizzle lunch will be provided.

HISTORIC QUILTS ON DISPLAY

The quilt worked over one hundred years ago by the ladies of the Lancefield Presbyterian Church will soon be joined by one produced recently with the names of current residents of the area on it. The new quilt has been made by members of the Historical Society to commemorate the centenary of the original one, and will be displayed in the Lancefield Court House Museum. The museum is open on Sundays from 1.30 to 4.00 p.m., and is well worth a visit to view the area's history.

The magnificent quilt made in 1896 was raffled at a Sale of Gifts held in the Lancefield Mechanics' Institute in February 1896 to raise funds to pay off the debt incurred in making improvements to the Manse. These extracts from the Lancefield Mercury tell us something of the event:

The centre of attraction is the magnificent quilt, hung against the wall at the back of the stage. The quilt contains 465 autographs beautifully worked with various coloured crewel silks on a background of royal blue satin, and is lined with old gold sateen. Surrounded by the words "Lancefield Sale of Gifts", in the centre of the quilt is a painting of a rose, thistle, and shamrock artistically executed by Miss Anderson, of Rochford. As is well known the quilt was made and the names worked by Mrs Condon, of Rochford, and she and Miss Anderson have shown singular ability in accomplishing their work. This piece of work alone will realise a large sum, about £23 being in hand, clear of all expense, from the fee charged for having names placed on the quilt.' The lucky winner of the raffle of the quilt was Mrs J. Dunn of Rochford. A profit of £32/15/0 was made through the raffle.

The stalls included two fancy goods, refreshments, Christmas tree, and a toy stall. £35 was raised on Wednesday afternoon and evening. The best dressed doll competition was won by Miss Kitty Harris with her bride doll; Martha Burns was second, and Jessie Hemphill was third, from ten entries, he Sale of Gifts concluded on Saturday night. The left over goods were auctioned at 10:30 p.m. by Mr Ralph Williams. Prices were greatly reduced, but every article was disposed of. The net proceeds were £150/19/8, after expenses of £12/7/7 were paid. This was enough to clear all debt, and it was considered a very successful event. The full balance sheet was published later. The Historical Society wishes to thank all those who supported the street stall held last month. About \$250 was raised to help with the maintenance of Seymour Cottage in Romsey, and the Lancefield Court House Museum. Treatment to eradicate the termites under the cottage has been undertaken once again, and the damaged flooring has been replaced. Mr Jack Parkhurst is to be thanked for his work in repairing the damage.

At the May meeting of the society Jim Hall told of his experiences as a youngster growing up in Lancefield, where his father operated the Universal General Store in the shop now occupied by Lancefield Hair Care. The talk was very good and encouraged other members to recall other occurrences of the times. At present an interesting display of old photographs and relics of Lancefield has been mounted in a window of this shop. Members are continuing work on compiling the brochure detailing the historic sites in Romsey and Lancefield. This should be completed and published by the end of the year.

The next meeting of the Historical Society will be held at 'Woodlands', the home of Mr & Mrs Lobb, on the Romsey-Kilmore Road, at 8 p.m. on Tuesday, 22 July.
