Scouting - 90 Years Young !

Victoria's Scouts will be celebrating a real mile stone on August 11 & 12 as they celebrate the 90th Anniversary of Scouting world wide. As part of these celebrations 1000 boys and girls from the movement in Victoria will be planting 90,000 trees at Bass near Phillip Island.

"Scouting: The way to Success" will also be launched to commemorate this special event. The book features many Australian achievers and the contribution that Scouting has made to their success. The Scouting movement also has a new logo as is depicted on this page. It has also launched a CD-Rom on Scouting and an Internet site for the Jamboree in Queensland next year. 1st Romsey will be represented as part of the Victorian contingent and you can support their fundraising efforts at the next Romsey market.

Scouting in Australia continues to recognise and encourage the participation of a whole range of ethnic groups which make up the mosaic of Australian Society. The Scout commitment to honor and respect the traditions and beliefs of Australia's Multi cultural society. is embodied in the values and principles of the world wide movement.

Scouting is Victoria's largest youth organisation with more than 30,000 members who are supported by 5700 adult volunteer leaders.

The first experimental Scout camp was held at Brownsea Island in the south of England which was organised by the movement's founder Robert Baden Powell and was held between August 1st -9th 1997. Scouting began in Victoria in late 1907 at the Tooronga Rd State school in Caulfield. In 1912 the first Victorian Sea Scouts (the first in the world) were established at Albert Park Lake. The first Victorian Jamboree was held at Frankston and was visited by Lord Baden Powell & his family.

Youth programs now involve both boys and girls. It includes Joey Scouts for those aged (6-7) Cub Scouts (8-10) Scouts (11-14) Venturers (14-17) and Rovers (18-26). The world Scouting Movement has 25,000,000 members and operates successfully in 217 countries. 

NIGHT OF AUSTRALIAN POETRY

A range of Australian poems recited by Mr Laurie Thomson was the highlight of the Society's July meeting, held at "Woodlands", the home of Elaine and George Lobb. Laurie's great presentation and well selected verses were a delight, bringing back memories of evenings around the fire with songs and poems before the advent of radio and television. This was aided by the pleasant atmosphere and glowing fire on the cold wintry night. We are most grateful to Elaine and George for inviting us into their home for this midwinter meeting.

The recent death of Mrs Isa Allen has saddened the members of the society. Mrs Allen gave "Barton", Sidney Seymour's former home, to the Historical Society for preservation. Mr Seymour was a very early settler in Romsey, and his unusually constructed home dates back to the early 1850's. Mrs Allen will be remembered always for her generous donation to the people of the Romsey district.

A minute of appreciation marking Mrs Allen's contribution to the history of the district was moved by the President, Mr Robert Clement, at the commencement of the meeting. Mr Clement said that Mrs Allen was a Life Member of the Historical Society, which owed her a great debt for her generous donation. Mrs Allen was very active in the Romsey district during her residence of about thirty years.

The Historical Society has a great range of photographs covering the former Shire of Romsey, many of which will be included in a display to be held at Seymour Cottage, Romsey, over the weekend of 13 & 14 September. This is an opportunity for people to view these records of the past and the present, and also bring along any pictures that they may have of the area or their family's activities. The society would welcome contributions from residents, either for display, or possible copying for the archives.

The next meeting of the Historical Society will be held at Seymour Cottage, 20 Palmer Street, Romsey on Tuesday, 26 August at 8 p.m., when the layout of the brochure for historic sites in Romsey and Lancefield will be discussed. All welcome!

COUNCIL NEWS - MONEGEETTA WARD

Over the last two months I have mentioned that budget discussions are in progress. Last month I intimated a rate rise of 5-6%. This minimum rise is all but confirmed. You are no doubt aware of the dollar 'black hole' of the Local Authority Superannuation Fund which was basically caused by Shire Amalgamations and Compulsory Competitive Tendering (both Gov't initiatives!). The Minister has now informed Council of our liability portion (\$210,000 this year) and advised that rates can be increased by 2.04% to cover this 'shortfall'. Macedon Ranges superannuation total debt is \$3.64 million and we have been given a 15 YEAR installment plan. Thus, rates will now rise by approximately 8% for residents living in this sector of the Shire. In dollar terms, for the residential rate, a further increase of between \$6-\$309 and for farms \$4-\$750 (actual dollar increase will depend upon value of your property). Fact: Monegeetta Ward has the greatest number of farm assessments. Fact: Monegeetta Ward has approximately 20% of the Shires unsealed road network. Fact: Monegeetta Ward provides the most dollars on rate assessments.

With some persistence, Council has been convinced to extend, by 15 minutes, the time School Crossing Supervisors are in attendance in the mornings. This is of particular relevance to Romsey and Riddells Creek residents. Rumor has it that Optus may be making a planning application for a mobile phone tower in the near future. They will share the facility with Telstra.

Safe Travel to School: The staff and School Council continue to be concerned about the abilities of children to handle traffic situations and for this reason we have continued a safety emphasis with children and recently conducted an information night for interested parents. Children are not little adults but we often expect them to act as adults are expected to do. Traffic accidents are the biggest killer of school age children. These children, especially those up to the age of 9, do not have the skills and abilities needed to be safe in traffic. Why are children at risk?

- Young children have a narrow vision, a bit lit looking through a tunnel, so that they may not be able to see cars out of the corner of their eyes as easily as adults.
- Children have trouble judging the speed of cars.
 They may let a slow car go past and then suddenly cross in front of a faster moving vehicle.
- They also have trouble working out from where sounds are coming.
- Because children are small, they often can't see over bushes and parked cars. This also means that they cannot be seen by motorists.
- Often children concentrate for only a short time. In traffic this can be particularly dangerous.
- Because they are constantly on the move, children have trouble stopping at the kerb and may dart out into traffic. Please don't take safety for granted. Speak with your children and reinforce the messages that are provided at school.


The outcome was that an application has recently been lodged with the Government to try and secure funding for this project - with the local community funding probably between 30-50% of the costs. This in fact, in round figures would mean that local funding would amount to some \$250,000. The time frame, if the application is successful will be hopefully, mid-1998 - which means that the funds that the local organisations are sitting on at the moment can be earmarked for this very urgent and necessary life-saving project.

So what we have to do - is push this very hard - so that it is not forgotten about yet again! An interim auxiliary will be formed in the near future from the representatives who attended the above-mentioned dinner - with the aim to be ready to act as soon as the go-ahead is given by the Government - or if not to fight to make sure it happens! I will keep the community posted....Margaret Howatson.
