#### Tickawarra Framing Gallery Annual Exhibition

Six years ago this month, Tickawarra Framing Gallery started up in business in Romsey. A couple of years later, a small Gallery was opened to exhibit works by local artists. 

#### **COUNCIL NEWS - MONEGEETTA WARD**

Recently a gentleman from the Department of Treasury and Finance addressed Councillors regarding the provision of natural gas to the unserviced areas of the Shire. He advised that in the spring session of Parliament legislation will be enacted which will 'smooth' the process by which Macedon Ranges can instigate the provision of It is anticipated that we can begin seeking 'service providers' late this year or natural gas in the municipality. The start of a (hopefully, not so) long process will commence soon.

In the week commencing 29th September, 1997, a new garbage/recycling service commences shire wide. next few weeks each house/business etc., will be given a 140 litre bin for garbage and a 240 litre bin (with yellow Every property currently receiving lid) for recycling. Garbage pick-up is weekly, recycling pick-up is fortnightly. a garbage pick-up (those not on separate agreement with current contractor) will now have recycling also. Recycling will also include steel cans and liquid paper board cartons (eg., milk/juice cartons) as well as glass, plastic, aluminium, cardboard and paper but NOT garden clippings and disposable nappies. not be tied in a bundle, though it would still help, prior to placing in bin. It is not anticipated that pick-up days will DO NOT use the new bins before change at this time but if they do then residents will be notified accordingly. It is anticipated that our current garbage contractor will pick-up his bins in the preceding 29th September, 1997. week though it is rumoured that for a nominal fee (\$5.?) he may sell them to you as it has been suggested that with some judiciously placed holes they would make a great compost bin.




