COUNCIL NEWS - MONEGEETTA WARD

A letter received from Hume Council advises that they have received Vic Roads approval to carry out rehabilitation work on a 700 metre section of Melbourne-Lancefield Road from Gellies Road to north of Sunningdale Avenue. It is expected that the work will be completed before December. On the matter of street lighting, Hume has allocated funds for main Road intersection upgrades. The Melbourne-Lancefield Road and Sunbury Road intersection is a high priority and it is hoped that there is agreement from Vic Roads and Solaris Power to enter into a Shared Lighting Scheme in this financial year. Both these items are good news for those regularly travelling through the area.

Now that the budget has been set for this financial year, it is timely to advise of works that have been agreed to for Monegeetta Ward -

- a/ sealing of the carpark at Riddells Creek stadium,
- b/ refurbishment of Riddells Creek tennis courts.
- c/ purchase of land for pony club so they can vacate their current site in the Riddells Creek reserve,
- d/ construction and sealing of the first kilometre of Mt.Charlie Road,
- e/ completion of Clarkefield Hall extension,
- f/ Romsey Stadium timber floor,
- g/ complete construction and sealing of (final stage) entire Kerrie-Hesket Road,
- h/ major patching of Woodend-Wallan Road west of Darraweit turnoff,
- I/ widening and sealing of approximately one kilometre of Bolinda-Darraweit Road in Darraweit township,
- j/ numerous other minor works.

The new garbage/recycling service has begun. Two matters have been referred to committee for further consideration. One is extension to the current declared garbage district and the other is provision of an extra bin, at nominal fee, to those residences that have dependant relatives residing in a granny flat or similar. It has been suggested that the whole shire could have a garbage pick-up as there are not too many Roads one travels down that there are not numerous houses. Interesting theory, very interested in your feedback. Effects our rural population mainly. Current garbage/recycling charge is \$91.00 per annum.

Once again discussions are being held with Vic Roads in an effort to have the speed limit in Romsey Township reduced from 70 to 60 k.p.h. Also the idea of traffic islands in Main Street, to assist pedestrians, has been floated.

Finally, if you forward correspondence to the Shire, whether as an individual or on behalf of a group, the current internal mail system does not necessary mean that I will see it. IMPRESSIONS OF ROMSEY

President, Robert Clement, gave an interesting address about his family and his impressions of growing up in the Romsey area, at the September meeting of the Historical Society Robert's grandfather settled at Springfield in 1894, and his father married Wynie Mitchell, whose family had purchased the land now known as "Eden Park" at Romsey in 1857, where Robert and his family now live. The bluestone for the house was quarried on the property, as was the stone for the Romsey Presbyterian Church, of which the original Peter Mitchell was the secretary for its first fifty years. Mr Mitchell was a very successful farmer and won awards for his barley in Amsterdam and wheat in Sydney, as well as many other show awards. He also pioneered the growing of chicory in the area. Members of the Clement and Mitchell families have served on municipal councils for a total of more than one hundred years in the Lancefield, Springfield and Romsey districts.

Robert outlined the changes in land use in the area from dairying and potato growing to more grazing of cattle and sheep in later years. Much more work was available before farms became mechanised For example, a threshing machine, probably powered by a steam engine, required ten to twelve men to separate the grain from wheat or oats. He spoke of droving sheep from Springfield to the Romsey railway yards to be trucked to the saleyards at Newmarket, and of Fred White, the grocer, who made weekly deliveries to Springfield by horse and cart on Thursdays. Entertainment included table tennis, dancing, and films in various areas, as well as local cricket and football.

The display of historic photographs was a success, with good interest shown by those attending. The next meeting of the society will be held on 28 October at Seymour Cottage, 20 Palmer Street, Romsey, commencing at 8 p.m.. The end of year barbecue will also be held at the cottage on Sunday, 30 November from 6 p.m..

Not just reading between the lines: Students at Romsey Primary School demonstrated their proficiency in reading and language recently when they competed in the 1997 Australian Schools' English Competition. This year 71 students from the school were awarded certificates in the Australian Schools' English Competition in which students from all over Australia, New Zealand and the Pacific Region competed. record 483,000 students entered the competition which requires students to demonstrate their ability in comprehension, data interpretation, language and English is an essential tool in our society enabling children to succeed in all walks of life. Romsey Primary School will continue to emphasise the teaching of literacy skills and encourage all children to succeed.

Improving Facilities: low brick garden walls which will also serve as seating, & paving have been installed between the Library & classroom block. Additional new play grounds were also installed for infants and senior students during the holidays. All tasks were completed in time for the commencement of the new term and have been appreciated by the children and admired by adults. My special thanks are extended to Mr Norm McAdam who with his son Andrew were able to step in at the last minute and lay the brick walls which support the new garden beds near the library. 52 cubic meters of pine mulch were spread, borders to the new playground equipment created, new garden beds filled with many meters of soil and clearing up the work sites, were just some of the tasks completed by a small group of willing helpers last Saturday morning. The new playground equipment has been well used already and we trust the extended fencing will continue to protect the garden My thanks are also extended to Mr Steven beds.

Our cricket pitch area, which will be used when the new season commences for junior teams, received its final surfacing this week. Thanks to the co-operation of the Romsey Cricket Club and a large donation of soil from Doug Newnham, improvements to the surface immediately surrounding the pitch have been completed. These ventures again indicate the School Council's intent to work with community groups by ensuring that school facilities are available for use out of school hours. The school continues to be the home for a number of community groups and Councillors are only too happy to discuss other uses of our buildings and grounds with members of the community.

"Performing Arts Complex" Update: School Councillors have expressed their appreciation to Mr. Ken Strange (Equinox Building Design Pty.Ltd.) for the plans he has developed for this construction, on the eastern side of the school library. This new asset would not only greatly enhance our music/drama program, provide an extension for Library use, extra meeting & instrumental practice rooms as well as creating additional classroom space but also provide another facility that could be used by the community. Plans have been referred to the D.O.E and following some adjustments are been costed prior to final deliberations by the school council.

Mitchell Mobile Library Service: It may be of interest to Romsey residents that there is a book return box provided for your convenience in the office foyer of the school.



fitness and health

Many older adults believe that at their time of life, they now have the chance to take it easy. However the need for exercise does not decrease as one gets older. It is still important to stay in shape. Much of the physical decline associated with aging is in fact due to inactivity rather than to disease or an 'aging'

Many older adults overrate the benefits of the light and infrequent exercise they do get and also underrate their real

ability to exercise

It is never too late to take up an exercise program — age is no barrier to fitness. Regular and enjoyable physical activity is not a cure for all ailments, but it is an effective and low cost form of preventive health care. It also provides the opportunity for new social contacts and friendships. Just twenty minutes of the right

kind of exercise three times per

week can bring about measurable improvements.

The exercises suggested here will help you to reach a satisfactory level of personal fitness. You don't need gadgets or gimmicks - they are usually unnecessary, expensive or dangerous — and no-one is sug-

gesting that you need to look like an olympic athlete. But to feel and look your best you have to move and improve your own machinery - there is

no substitute.

Of course, hand in hand with physical activity go diet and nutrition. You can obtain advice on these aspects from the Australian Nutrition Foundation in

your State.

With regular, enjoyable exercise, you will experience many benefits. Physical fitness allows older adults to be more selfreliant and improves their quality of life. One study has shown that a one-fifth gain in heart-lung fitness can extend the period of independence of older adults by as much as 6 to 8 years. More of the benefits are listed below

A survey by the National Heart Foundation in 1983 found that about half of all people aged between 50 and 64 were overweight or had high cholesterol levels, and about one third smoked or had high blood pressure. All of these factors are associated with heart disease the leading cause of death in Australia. Exercise greatly re-duces the effects of all these factors but only about 10% of people in this age group did enough exercise to obtain health benefits.

The key points to be remembered about physical activity are - frequency, intensity, time, and type of activity — the FITT principle.



We were blessed with fine weather and a wonderful turnout of the surrounding communities to support a local activity that heavily depends on local input.


The whole school community, including some ex-students and ex-parents, all worked together in a spirit of teamwork and co-operation that demonstrated a very strong family commitment to our school.






