

Impressions of Romsey



Mitchell families have served on municipal councils for a total of more than one hundred years in the Lancefield, Springfield and Romsey districts.

Robert outlined the changes in land use in the area from dairying and potato growing to more grazing of cattle and sheep Much more work was available before farms became mechanised. For example, a threshing machine, in later years. probably powered by a steam engine, required ten to twelve men to separate the grain from wheat or oats. He spoke of droving sheep from Springfield to the Romsey railway yards to be trucked to the sale yards at Newmarket, and of Fred White, the grocer, who made weekly deliveries to Springfield by horse and cart on Thursday. Entertainment included table tennis, dancing and films in various areas, as well as local cricket and football.

The display of historic photographs held at Romsey in September was most successful, with good interest shown by

those attending. It was an opportunity to view some of the early views of the district at close quarters.

Historical Society members were delighted with the launching of "From Sublime Solitude", the story of Lancefield, researched and compiled by Dorothy Viney. West Bourke Books Inc. Are to be congratulated on their fine work in recording the history of the former Shire of Romsey.

Luke Burgess was a close fifth in the 10 year Shot Leigh Calder and Matt Little finished 3rd in their heats of Hurdles and 100m, but missed out Others to participate in on a place in the final. Bendigo were Amy Zawila - Shot Put and Discus, Reece Hegarty - Long Jump, Michelle Rowley -800m and Duncan Gray - 100m. All children tried very hard and were worthy representatives of the District.

The school recently presented her with a certificate and school coffee mug, in appreciation of her reliable community service. Year 3/4 Students are currently involved in Bike education and the Year 1 and 2 students are planning to visit the Essendon Traffic School in early December. These experiences will again add to the importance of our safety program

This policy reflects a considerable amount of time and researched findings for which the committee are to be commended. If parents are interested in reading the policy a copy is available on overnight loan.


- To provide community assistance to children while travelling to and from school should they feel unsafe.




