The rains have come!

Good rains have fallen in the district over the last few weeks, whether that means the drought has



finally broken is still a matter of opinion.

What is obvious is dam water levels that we haven't seen for a number of years. Similarly we are starting to see significant growth that, for many farmers and grazi-

ers. is excellent.

Fires Already

Even with the rains there have been a number of fires already this year in Gippsland one getting to around 300 hectares. Fires are currently burning in Southern Queensland and Northern New South Wales where there have already been significant losses.

What does that mean to US

There is always good news and bad news.

The good news is that there will be plenty of water around for firefighting and we won't have far to travel. It also means that we won't be using the last few precious litres at the bottom of the dam.

The bad news is that there will be plenty of growth around that, without ongoing rain, will produce higher fuel loadings than we have had in the past.

What does that mean to YOU

Between now and Christmas there will be commentators making predictions on the 4 length and possible severity of the Fire Danger Period.

"It doesn't matter what they say. We will have some days this year that will be extremely dangerous and we will have a major fire somewhere in the state" said Robert Smith, Romsey's Captain. "We all have our bit to do to make sure that it is not our town that is threatened' he added. "If we make preparations now we will be well prepared for that bad day no matter when it happens". He said.

What steps are WE taking?

All brigades in the area will be undertaking a series of Bushfire Blitz meetings.

Those of you who have been to similar meetings in the past will still benefit from

attending again; there is always something new to be gained.

Details of meeting locations and times will appear in subsequent issues of the Romsey Rag

What steps can YOU take now?

- Seek information on the best possible measures for your particular circumstances
 - Attend a Bushfire Blitz meeting in your area.
 - Encourage your neighbors to attend.
 - Contact the fire brigade for pamphlets and information.
- Consider forming a Community Fire Guard group in your locality.
 - Contact Glen Cockram, CFA Community Safety on 9746 7570 for information on creating your own Community Fire Guard group.
- 3 Develop a Bushfire Plan and practice what you would do if threatened by fire.
 - Ensure visitors, baby sitters and neighbors are aware of the plan.
- 4 Commence a maintenance regime to ensure the area around the home is free of debris and clutter.
 - Regularly clear guttering
 - Relocate woodheaps away from the house
 - Clear overhanging tree limbs.
 - Block under floor and roof space openings to prevent embers entering

Fire Prevention Works on Roadsides

With fire season approaching again, the community is putting effort into planning or undertaking fire prevention works to protect life and property. For many people, these works may include slashing or clearing vegetation in road reserves.

Often people assume that the best place for a firebreak or fire prevention works is in the road reserve. However road reserves are Crown Land, not the property of landowners and complex regulations surround what can and can't be done in a road reserve.

Stan Wilson, Municipal Fire Prevention Officer with the Macedon Ranges Shire states, "Before undertaking any fire prevention or other works in a road reserve contact the council."

When planning for wildfire focus on what you want to and can protect – usually the lives of you and your family, your home/out buildings and livestock or wildlife.

Existing planning regulations allow residents to clear an area around dwellings for fire prevention purposes (fuel modified zones). This is the best area to fight a fire. You need to plan to leave early or else ensure you have resources to fight a fire and shelter from a fire front. CFA brigades cannot be everywhere at once. It is critical that residents use their limited resources to protect the smallest area possible. Given the nature of the Australian environment it is not possible to prevent all fires.

In wildfire conditions flames will cross bare paddocks as easily as forested areas such as roadsides. The key difference is that forested areas with high fuel loads will burn with more intensity and will throw more embers that create spot-fires.

Generally a fire burning beyond your fuel modified zone will have difficulty causing damage to property and life, if you are prepared to combat spot fires. If spot fires establish or the fire front reaches the fuel modified zone, fire intensity will be reduced due to the lack of fuel and may be easier to fight, depending on conditions.

In extreme conditions even fires with low fuel loads may be difficult or impossible to fight.

CFA research has looked at the effectiveness and appropriate location of fire breaks. Ideally breaks should be located on cleared land and can be achieved by slashing, ploughing, herbicide or control burning.

No firebreak will halt a fire 100% of the time as embers may easily cross a firebreak. Firebreaks don't stop fires, they give time for emergency services to arrive or a landowner to take action.

Within roadsides, firebreaks under trees have very little benefit. Firebreaks are most effective on cleared land adjacent to the road reserve. Most often cleared land is on private property.

Where there is forest on both the road reserve and on adjacent private land, firebreaks have very limited value. As the bush is adapted to fire, these areas are best managed by fuel reduction burning and the maintenance of fuel modified zones around houses or buildings. Cleared fire breaks in forested areas spread weeds and scar the landscape for little or no benefit.

Roadside vegetation is valued for many reasons. It provides wildlife habitat, shelter, a seed source for revegetation work and can make driving on country roads a pleasant experience. Road reserves are critical for provision of services such as telephone, water and electricity. Of course the most obvious value of roads is to provide safe access for vehicles.

The Macedon Ranges Shire works in conjunction with the Country Fire Authority to plan for major and minor fire incidents. The Shire is responsible for creating and maintaining the Municipal Fire Prevention Plan. This plan identifies primary and secondary firebreaks. Vegetation on these road reserves is managed to ensure there is safe access for emergency services vehicles and provides suitable areas for fire fighting. These firebreaks are not designed to halt all fires.

"Fire prevention, weed control and managing roadside native vegetation

forms complex web of legal responsibilities that fall between landowners, the Country Fire Authority, service utilities and state and local government" said Lachlan Milne, Environment Resource Officer with the Macedon Ranges Shire. "If you are planning any works in a road reserve please contact the council to protect yourself and others".

A brief summary of activities that can and can't be undertaken on a road reserve are listed below.

Things you can do on road reserves

- Control regionally controlled weeds, eg gorse, blackberry or broom. (seek advice on techniques)
- Collect fine fuels (material less than 10mm diameter) if the road reserve is very close to your house or other buildings
- Mow or slash areas of non-native vegetation

Things you can't do without a permit

- Use earthmoving equipment/ ploughing
- Mow/Slash native vegetation including groundcover plants or grasses (seek advice)
- Collect firewood or other dead wood
- Use herbicides that may damage native vegetation (seek advice)
- Graze road reserves
- Plant trees or other vegetation

The regulations surrounding uses of road reserves have been designed to protect road users, residents and the natural environment. Always seek advice from the council before starting works in a road reserve.


On our sports day all junior classes (prep, year 1 and year 2) competed in an afternoon of fun sport activities.

What's News

Life today is very busy. There are so many more opportunities available to us than in previous generations that we feel like we, or our children, are missing out if we skip something. As a result, we are constantly juggling appointments.

We are also a more mobile society. So even without an extensive public transport system, we are more willing to travel to take advantage of something on offer. Whilst travel times are much less with better roads and cars, a significant amount of time can quickly accumulate going from one activity to the next.

When I was at school, I remember an exercise where we had to plan out our ideal day. For many people, this would include 10-14 hours of sleep. However, I remember allowing only 6 hours for sleeping, thinking that this was the minimum that I could function on. That gave me the most time to enjoy the various things I wanted to do.



SAFE ROUTES TO SCHOOL PROGRAM

The Safe Routes To School Program (SRTS), is a joint safety initiative between VicRoads and the Macedon Ranges Shire Council. (SRTS), is a local community based road safety program. The program aims to help students travel to and from school safely, and to implement a well targeted traffic safety education program throughout the student's primary and secondary years. It is conducted in municipalities where there is a high incidence of 5 to 16 year old pedestrian and cyclist casualties. SRTS is designed to reduce the incidence and severity of injuries to school age children as pedestrians, bicyclists and passengers from Prep to Year 10.

The Macedon Ranges Shire Council, through its Community Development and Infrastructure Units is planning to develop a Safety Kit to assist schools in the Shire. The SRTS program has been in operation in the Shire since May 2002. Four local primary schools, Tylden Primary, Newham Primary, Bullengarook Primary and Darraweit Guim Primary were approached to participate in the first stage of the program.

The overall response of the schools has been very positive. All schools involved their School Council, parents, staff and some students in the program. A number of methods were used to obtain information about the issues that schools faced in regard to road safety. Some issues were specific to only one school, while a number of safety issues were applicable to all the schools. Some issues identified are: parent parking, (e.g. parking illegally, parking in dangerous places, obscuring the view around school crossings), not observing speed limits around the schools, parents not using school crossings, parents not ensuring their children use school crossings, high congestion in car parks, lack of footpaths around schools, lack of signage, etc.

A Working Group, comprising members of school communities, police, council officers and a representative from the Department of Education (Traffic Safety Education), has been set up to address these issues. A survey form has been distributed to all schools in the Macedon Ranges, and once the responses have been collated, a safety kit will be created to distribute to all schools in the Macedon Ranges.

Traffic safety at our schools requires a collaborative effort, it involves four key elements: Engineering, Education, Encouragement and Enforcement, hopefully by bringing all these elements together we can make travelling to and from school safer for our children.
