They are passionate about people, family & community, building the business whilst raising their two children Jacob, & Tyla who learned everything they could working






alongside them every chance they got! Nothing makes them happier than a restaurant full of people enjoying special moments together.





Our landscaper has arrived! Its quite thrilling to see something on paper brought to life in front of your eyes! All day the digger has been moving gravel or soil from one area to another. The bluestone steppers have been laid and a long trench dug for a hedge. Good soil has been laid in the fernery and I have planted my first two plants in there – a large birds nest fern and a native cordyline. Both have been in pots for awhile so will love being in the ground I suspect.



I was off visiting another lovely garden near Mansfield a few weeks ago. It was great to get away for a few days and visit a region I haven't been to for a long time. It was also great to see Lake Eildon so full and we enjoyed our stay beside it at the Gough's Bay Caravan Park. I also visited the Mansfield Botanic Park. It had an interesting mix of exotic and Australian native plants that were growing really well. The playground in the park was newish and very good too.

All my garden is in pots at the moment so I have been on the end of a hose every few days. The tomato season came to an abrupt end when the landscaper had to move the polystyrene boxes and we found the plants had rooted through the box into the ground. Subsequently I had a lot of green tomatoes and was happy to make a batch of green tomato chutney – my favourite! I got the recipe from one of the old Women's Weekly cookbooks!

As we enter autumn – it is now the time to propagate succulents as they come out of their summer dormancy. You can behead aeoniums and echeverias and new little pups will form on the old stem. The beheaded piece will also form roots. Have fun!

### Did You Know...

### MRSC Has Passed a Draft Gambling Harm Prevention Policy

They now want your comments.

Go to www.mrsc.vic.gov.au and find 'draft gambling harm prevention policy'

The Gambling Harm Prevention report process first read 13 reference reports of gambling by varied interests and ages. Such reports described, in detail, the harm due to gambling in each group eg.:

- Gambling and young people,
- Risk factors & implications for Australian veterans,
- Young people, partner violence and gambling,
- Young women and gambling,
- People with intellectual disability,
- harm to children from Parents who gamble.

MRSC noted strategies that were successful to reduce or prevent gambling harm – to find ways that MRSC could act to prevent or reduce gambling harm in Macedon Ranges communities.

# Gambling harm is now seen as a public health issue.

The draft policy is out for your comment. It recommends that MRSC can reduce harm from gambling by promoting non-gambling events and programs, and by not sponsoring, funding, using or promoting activities that also receive funds from gambling activities. MRSC will not use venues also used for gambling, and opposes any increase in EGM licences.

### **COOKING WITH** PETER RUSSELL-CLARKE

### **AVOCADO.** (MIDSHIPMAN'S BUTTER).

Avocados are harvested by hand with a pair of secateurs and they're cut just at the little button where the stalk joins the fruit. A portion of the button stays in the cavity to prevent any post-harvest disease.

You can grow an avocado tree from a pip but it may not, in fact, get fruit for seven, eight, maybe nine years. Get a glass of water and then poke into an avocado pip three toothpicks so that the pip looks a bit like a sputnik.

Suspend the pip, on the toothpicks, over the glass so that the bottom of the pip is in the water. After a while, out come the roots from the bottom of the pip and the tree grows out the top. It's your real Jack and the Beanstalk business.

Avocados have a higher fat content than any other fruit apart from the olive. They're also full of vitamins A, B and C and a skinful of others which reads like the alphabet. They're often called an 'alligator pear' not because they grow in the alligator swamps of America, but because some varieties have rough skin.

They were once classed as an aphrodisiac. It is said Mae West used to eat them every night before she went to bed, also that she fed them to her boyfriends.

This list of varieties is only those which are commercially grown in Australia. They are Sharwil which comes out in July and August, Haas which is August to December and Fuerte which comes out in April to August.

I believe avocado should be served simply. For instance I just halve an

avocado, then squeeze lemon juice and a little pepper on it. Keep it simple or try Guacamole or my delicious (if I do say so myself) recipe - oh! you can get smashed on a Pinot Gris while you eat it!



### **INGREDIENTS**

- 1 medium sized smoked trout
- · small carton cultured sour cream
- juice of 1/2 lemon
- finely chopped parsley
- 1 drop Tabasco
- freshly ground black pepper
- 1 avocado (1/2 per person)
- fresh crisp lettuce leaves.

### **METHOD**

- 1. Take the flesh of the trout off the bone and flake the flesh into small pieces. Mix together the sour cream, lemon juice, parsley and Tabasco and gently add the trout flesh and sprinkle with freshly ground black pepper.
- 2. Take the stone out of the avocado, spoon the mixture into each cavity and serve on a fresh, crisp lettuce leaf.
- 3. It is said that, many years ago, British sailors planted avocados in various places where they landed, to be collected on their next voyage. And that they used them instead of butter. Maybe the sailors should have been called 'Avos' instead of 'Limeys'.



### Project Cultivate

Cemeteries vary... often weedy and unkempt. Neat and well-trimmed is expensive; trimming, weeding, poisoning and mowing. I first heard about Project Cultivate from Kosta on ABC Radio and he was excited... even for Kosta! Project Cultivate plants native plants and local grasses to revitalise cemeteries, complementing monuments, pathways etc. The project consults with families, the local community and Traditional Owners to establish a biodiverse sustainable environment.

A pilot at Melbourne General Cemetery in May- November 2023 saw 1,400 cubic metres of mulch laid, then 120,000 indigenous native grasses, wildflowers and groundcovers. Benefits include 30% less herbicide, 3°C reduction in ambient temperature, better soil quality and less erosion. Runoff increases biodiversity, aided by native insects, worms, fungi and birds. A second mulching area has now planted an extra 150,000 indigenous plants. The Southern Metropolitan Cemeteries Trust (*SMCT*) will mulch and plant 41.78% still suitable by June 2025. MGC has a blueprint for such projects at other cemetery locations.

Opened in 1853, the iconic MGC is an important Australian cemetery. Designed as a public park ie, curved pathways, trees and shrubs, gate lodges and rest pavilions. Prior to this, the site was likely a grassy woodland eg. River Red Gums and indigenous grasses, flowers & herbs with Kangaroo Grass (*Themeda triandra*) as the understory. MGC lacks irrigation - heavy compacted clay with little topsoil. SMCT horticulturists in consultation listed 16 indigenous plants for Project Cultivate, many previously present on site. These will tolerate the soil and lack of irrigation eg. Kangaroo Grass, Wallaby Grass, Native Flax, Tufted Bluebell, Clustered Everlastings and Billy Buttons.

Deep Creek Landcare Group has nesting boxes for bats, birds and phascogales for sale from \$30. We also have Myna bird traps to lend out. Annual Landcare membership is \$20 per family. 



# A warm sunny day greeted all who came to the historic Seymour Cottage Romsey -Community Open Day Sunday 3<sup>rd</sup> of March 2024.

A major event of the Romsey & Lancefield Districts Society calendar of 2024 events. A large number of residents and visitors to the region attended to view through the heritage listed c1856 built farmhouse constructed by Sidney and Elizabeth Seymour which remained in the family till 1915.

The highlights of the day were the two key-note presentations by local gardening and nurseryman celebrity Stephen Ryan.

Two photographic print exhibitions were on display – the first on the history of Seymour Cottage and the ongoing maintenance and essential restoration works, the second photo exhibition contained images of Romsey buildings from the archives of the Historical Society compared with current day images.

The Seymour Cottage property was donated in perpetuity in 1982 to the Historical Society in trust for the citizens of Romsey by the late Mrs Isa Allen. Seymour Cottage was heritage registered in 2011 by the State Government's Heritage Victoria describing it ....as a four-roomed residence constructed in c. 1856, with walls made of prefabricated meranti door panels from Singapore....

### FREE SKIN CANCER CHECK AND AWARENESS UNIT TO VISIT WOODEND

# Australia has one of the highest rates of skin cancer in the world and Lions Clubs in Victoria and Southern NSW are doing something practical about reducing that level and its impact on families.

The incorporated charity, the Lions V Districts Cancer Foundation, has put a Skin Check and Awareness Unit on the road.

The Lions Club of Lancefield-Romsey are proud to announce that the skin van will visiting Woodend, stationed at Marjory place near the visitor centre on Saturday 20<sup>th</sup> April and Sunday 21<sup>st</sup> April.

The van will provide a free skin checking service to local people and will be operated by fully trained, certificated and professionally supervised volunteers. The unit will also be a valuable resource for local people to access not only the skin check, but valuable and timely information about skin care and self-checking techniques.

We know early detection of skin lesions potentially saves lives, so this visit will be a timely support and reminder to local people of the need to take care of their skin.

Following the skin check, visitors will be issued with a referral to their GP if there are any suspect spots or lesions. The Unit is not a medical clinic, so diagnosis or treatment requirements are not discussed – it simply provides the skin check and alerts the visitor to skin lesions that require further checking and attention: a great first step in ensuring urgent needs are addressed.

# Our Continuing Series on Significant Buildings in Romsey'

The Romsey Masonic Lodge was formed in 1883. With no meeting rooms of its own, the Masons met in hotel rooms and later had a room at the Romsey Mechanics' Institute. In 1904 the Mechanics' Institute was destroyed by fire and along with it the meeting minutes, fittings and furniture in the lodge room.

On the 2<sup>nd</sup> of June 1905, the minutes recorded that the Masons were now meeting, in a large upstairs room, at the Macedonia Hotel in nearby Lancefield. They rented this room year by year for a total of 10 years. In 1914 the Lodge decided to purchase the de-licensed hotel, 'The Galway Arms' on the south-west corner of Main and Stawell Streets. (97 Main Street).

From 1915-1953 The former Galway Arms remained the home of the Romsey Masonic Lodge. When it became clear that the former hotel building needed substantial renovation, the members of the Lodge decided to erect a new Masonic Lodge in the Main Street instead.

The current Masonic Lodge, located at 73 Main Street was opened in 1955. It is a red brick gabled, parapeted Masonic Hall with square parapeted porch and Ionic columns to either side of the double door entrance, typical of mid-twentieth century Masonic Halls. The painted door, represents the view of the Lodge Hall, which was added to the building in 2010. Masonic Lodge 97 is now the home of both the Romsey and Riddells Creek Lodges.



### Community Survey to Inform Council's Romsey Hotel Submission

Romsey residents – and those living within five kilometres of the Romsey Hotel – are invited to complete a survey relating to an application for gaming machines, to help inform Council's submission to the Victorian Gambling and Casino Control Commission (VGCCC).

In response to an application to the VGCCC for 50 gaming machines at 90 Main Street in Romsey (Romsey Hotel), Council has commissioned an independent consultant to deliver a Social and Economic Impact Assessment (SEIA).

To inform this SEIA, Council is undertaking a community survey via independent company Insync, using a publicly available database from the Victorian Electoral Commission to target letterbox drops to all Romsey residents and those within five kilometres of the venue.

Council's Director Community, Maria Weiss, said there may be people who have moved to the area more recently – or turned 18 and are newly eligible to vote – who are not captured in this database.

"We know this is an important matter for many Romsey residents and we want to ensure that we are giving as many eliqible people (within five kilometres of the venue) as possible the opportunity to participate in our survey," she said.

"It is important to Council that our SEIA is as well-informed as it can be, to ensure that our submission to the VGCCC best represents the sentiments of our community."

Eligible residents who haven't received a letter directly (expected this week) must "opt in" to complete the survey, showing proof of residency to ensure validity of the data collected. Residents can do this by contacting Council on 5422 0333, or by visiting a Council office in person.

Individual survey results will be completely private and de-identified by Insync and a summary of results will be included in a future Council report, expected to be listed for decision at the April 2024 Council Meeting.

For those residents outside of the five-kilometre survey area that would like to share their opinion on the application, they can make a submission directly to the VGCCC.



### LAYING DOWN ONE'S LIFE

This month, we have the privilege of hosting the Romsey-Lancefield RSL for an "ANZAC Day" church service, 10am Sunday April 28th at Encourage Church, 7 Mitchell Court in Romsey. It will be a Commemoration Service with the RSL marching in, the last post and as usual for our church, a scrumptious morning tea afterwards.

The service will remember those who faithfully served their country in a time of war. Our hearts will be with the wounded whether in body or mind, and particularly those that didn't make it home.

For those that did not return, I am reminded of a verse that is often quoted at Anzac Day Services – "Greater love has no one than this: to lay down one's life for one's friends." (John 15:13, NIV). Think about that – the greatest love someone could show you, is to lay down their life so that you can live. Those that have fought and died, did so for the freedom of their family, their friends and ultimately for me.

'Laying down one's life' is what Jesus did for you that you could truly live. As Jesus Himself said: "I am the good shepherd. The good shepherd lays down his life for the sheep" (John 10:11 NIV); and again, "I lay down My [very own] life [sacrificing it] for the benefit of the sheep" (John 10:15b from the Amplified Bible). Jesus did this voluntarily for you. God's love for you was so great, that His Son Jesus was willing to die for you.







### **ROMSEY MENS SHED REPORT!**

New members! - We welcome new members from the district to come along and join us at the Romsey Mens Shed in Barry Street. We have kept our membership at around 63, probably the largest in the Macedon Ranges Shire. We also meet quarterly with other Macedon Ranges Shire Mens Sheds to exchange ideas on how to improve our services.

Social interaction and friendships are our main objectives. No pressure! Some members engage in woodwork, metal work, welding and automotive activities. A key Auto project is restoration of the 1925 T model Ford.



### T Model Ford restoration project significance:

Local businessman, Doug Newham, donated a 1925

T Model Ford body, in a poor state some time ago, on the condition it stayed in the community for display or other local purposes on restoration. It is now a "signature" project" for us.

It is now stripped to the chassis and being restored "from the ground up". It has attracted attention when displayed on a trailer at several venues.

Thanks to the Bendigo Community Bank we have refurbished the Hickory spoked wheels and rims, as part of Stage I of the project to get the "T" mobile. The T Model Ford series has historical relevance as the first from the Henry Ford mass production process.

**Shed activities:** We have a "safe" comfortable environment, where men can gather. Some work on projects, sometimes community-based ones – while others just mix, for a coffee and chat. As part of our community activity, we recently provided four members to the Romsey Neighbourhood House for a day, to relocate stored goods.

About four times a year we have bus excursions with a federal government grant subsidising trips and making them more accessible.

In March, members visited the glider club in Bacchus Marsh followed by lunch. Other venues of interest to Men will be programmed progressively.

We also occasionally have a guest speaker, the most recent being from the SES with a truck and collision extraction equipment demonstrated.

"Hands-on" and new or enhanced skills: Our section leaders can organise practical workshop training, even glass cutting, by arrangement. We are progressively running training programs on WH&S for those using tools and machines. We also make novelty items for the Romsey Co-Op.

**Thursday** \$5 **BBQ/Light lunch day:** The Thursday \$5 barbeque/light lunch at 12 is well attended by members and occasionally, their guest. 9<sup>30</sup> to about 2pm is the usual Thursday open time.

**Tuesday and Wednesday open times:** Tuesdays from 9 to 4 and the Woodwork group usually gather on Wednesdays, with open times depending on their projects. Other times can be arranged.

**Future expansion plans:** Our new Mezzanine floor has helped with storage and we are negotiating to get our Crown Land lease expanded East a few metres and pending funding, build an extension to cater for our growth.




