

OUR BANK - SHARING WITH THE SHIRE TO HELP COMMUNITY

Macedon Ranges Council services are being provided from our Romsey Community Bank premises until next year as part of another major step in community support by our Bank. Local Community Bank chair Maureen Wiltshire said selected Council staff would be working from the bank while the Romsey Community Hub is being built. Romsey Service Centre staff are being relocated during the Community Hub construction, and it was seen as important that residents still had local access to Shire services.

"We view this as a very exciting step by the Romsey Community Bank, which further underscores our commitment to the needs of the local community," Mrs Wiltshire said. "Staff were specially selected to provide the Council's services, and will not be involved in our own banking activity. Customers will be able to tell the difference between the Bank and the Council staff by their different uniforms. Our Bendigo Bank Community Bank branches are supporting the Shire in the development of the Romsey Hub, along with the other partnerships we have with the Macedon Ranges Shire Council in terms of its financial needs. Sharing of our premises is a further expression of our partnership with the Council," Mrs Wiltshire said.

Local Community Bank senior manager Rod Browning said the Council operations would move back out when the Hub was finished.

"In the meantime, it's important that Romsey residents don't have to travel out of town to conduct the business they normally do with the Council," he said. "Our Community Bank branch is proud that the close relationship between our Bank and the Council has been able to ensure residents are not inconvenienced."

The Bank branch is at 1/112 Main St.

Bendigo Bank – business as usual

Bendigo Bank's announcement of its intention to merge with Adelaide Bank would not impact on the day-to-day operations of our Community Bank branches, local Bank chair Maureen Wiltshire said.

Mrs Wiltshire said Bendigo Bank had assured her that the proposed merger would provide security to the Community Bank model, with both banks agreeing the model would continue to grow under the new entity. Our local company, Lancefield & Romsey Community Financial Services, operates the branches at Romsey and Lancefield.

From Cr Henry Bleeck Making the grade on road maintenance

The Macedon Ranges Shire has beefed up its program of road maintenance, and is looking to adopt a new Road Management Plan. We have legal responsibilities for maintenance and upgrading under the Road Management Act 2004. And while we take these responsibilities seriously and are keen to respond to our residents, we all need to be clear exactly what we're responsible for.

The Council is responsible for some 1500 km of roads across the Shire – but VicRoads has the responsibility for a number of our major roads, including the highways and major arterials such as the Lancefield-Sunbury Rd. Our Council roads include the road surface, bridges and culverts, paths, kerb and channelling and road furniture. Collectively, these assets have a current replacement value of more than \$184 million. It is unfair to expect our ratepayers to pick up the lion's

share of the maintenance and replacement bill for our local roads. I will be pushing through Council for a better deal from government in helping to fund our road and footpath maintenance program.

The Macedon Ranges Shire is a key tourism region on Melbourne's northern doorstep, with most of our attractions barely an hour's drive from the city. With our wineries, Hanging Rock, the Cobaw and Macedon Ranges and our host of other tourist attractions, our roads are subject to heavy and constant use from non-residents. Acknowledging that we do receive grants from government for roadworks, I believe that more funding is needed to maintain our roads to the standards required. And it shouldn't be the ratepayers who pick up the bill for this work.

The Council's new Road Management Plan sets out the schedule for when all our roads and footpaths should receive inspections and cyclic maintenance. While we have accepted our responsibility to enhance this program, we need more funding to enable us to do it to the standard expected of us. Copies of our road maintenance schedule and Council's Road Management Plan is soon to be posted on our website, www.macedon-ranges.vic.gov.au

Our Bank and Shire – working together

It's wonderful to see the co-operation between our Shire and our Community Bank while the Romsey Hub is being built. Proving that anything can be done if we are committed to working together, an agreement was reached for Council service staff to be located in the Romsey Community Bank while the work takes place. It means that Romsey residents can still get face-to-face service from the Shire in their town during the rebuild. Well done to Bank Manager Rod Browning and his staff for facilitating this, and it's yet another example of how our Bank works to the benefit of our community.

School crossing

We've been advised by VicRoads that work is soon to commence on installing upgraded electronic speed signs at the school crossing on Main Street. The Council supported a petition signed by around 210 residents for the upgraded signage at the crossing near the Skate Park, and I'm pleased that VicRoads has now responded. The bright signs will ensure motorists know the limit is 40kmh during school hours, and will be a major improvement on the old, faded signs. VicRoads however did not support the proposal to reduce the general speed limit on this stretch of road to 50kmh at all times.



eaters, shrikes, whistlers and spinebills - it is totally different kettle of fish in regards to the magpies. How about you just Google "swooping magpies" on your computer - stacks of solutions there as well as why they do it. And don't worry, it only lasts around 2 weeks of 52.

Unfortunately there have been a been quite a few kangaroo road casualties - and some of our carers are now substitute mothers for orphaned joeys (Billy, Kirra and Guido, just to name a few.)

Did you know joeys are totally dependent on their mums for approx 2 years?? And that means if a human has to care for a little joey it is just like having a new born baby. It means feeding them around the clock every 4 hours, (sometimes more, depending on it's size,) changing nappies/pouches, making up formula, washing and sterilising bottles, doing loads of washing. The only difference is we don't have any school fees!! We have stacks of vet fees though.

Did you know that kangaroo mums are actually rather amazing? They have 2 teats in their pouch and produce different milk to cater for a joey at foot as well as a joey in the pouch!! Not only that - in case of severe drought like we just had – they can regulate the nourishment in the milk. Meaning that the developing joey can be put "on hold" till conditions improve. And to top it all off – in cases of extremely unfavourable conditions, kangaroo mums actually can dissolve a foetus back into her system and not give birth at all!!!

A female Eastern Grey roo can have in ideal conditions 6 - 8 joeys during her fertile life. However not all make it. In our Shire the biggest killer of the little ones are dogs, foxes, viruses from introduced species (e.g. cats / toxoplasmosis), various sicknesses (e.g. coccidiosis) and as well as cars and getting caught in fences in built-up areas. Next month is "Wildlife Awareness Month". Depending on our workload you might be able to say 'hello' to some of us at the local farmer's markets. 




