"Back To Romsey" – Special supplement of The Romsey Examiner – Friday, March 23rd, 1928


Back to Romsey – March 10-25, 1928.

- ... "The celebrations commenced on Saturday, the 10th inst., then a special train from Melbourne and scores of motor cars made the largest temporary addition to the population of our town that it has ever received in its history as a civilized community.
- ...A civic reception at the railway station was attended by fully 1,000 persons, whose enthusiasm was not damped by the unpleasant weather, which was cold and showery, nor by the late arrival of the train. As the passengers alighted, the State Public Service Military Band played "Home Sweet Home", and there ensued a few tense moments, when furtive tears were wiped from aged cheeks.
- ...It was there, that friendly eye for them all, and the welcome that went out to them brought joy to their faces and will always be remembered with gladness by everyone who took part in it, or witnessed it. (After official speeches)...There was then a general dispersal, friends going with friends to their homes, and all finding comfortable accommodation in the happiest possible surroundings.

It is appropriate that we should say a word here about the decoration of the station and its approaches, which Mr. C. Smith, the station master, had undertaken and carried out with characteristic thoroughness. Innumerable flags, tastefully arranged, were spread against the breeze, and the words "Welcome Home" were conspicuous on a banner facing the platform. (It was a pleasing coincidence, happily commented on by Cr. Crow, that the day was Mr. Smith's birthday.)

TAKE CARE OUT THERE!

I'm sure there are lots of parents reflecting on how quickly their teenage kids grow up; as the year takes shape it's a good time to remind them that life's precious and every life lost on our roads is one too many. Young people continue to be over represented in accidents on our roads. Each year, 18 to 25 year old drivers are involved in crashes in which approximately 120 people are killed and 2300 seriously injured. This is about one third of the Victorian road toll.

A lack of driving experience is a major road safety problem for young drivers. Research has shown that in the first two years of licensed driving, learners who have had 120 hours of driving experience have a 30 per cent lower risk of crashing.

I understand young drivers are very keen to get their licence as soon as they can, but the **L** plate period is a great opportunity to practice driving in all types of road conditions and to ensure they get 120 hours practice before they are out on the road on their own.

In addition to recording the hours spent driving, it is also important for supervising drivers to record information about the types of weather and road conditions experienced to encourage learners to get experience in all types of driving conditions, including night driving.

Each day dozens of people are admitted to hospital because of serious injuries received in road accidents in Victoria's hidden road toll. These numbers do not take into account the impact of these crashes on families and friends of those killed or seriously injured.

I urge everyone to heed the road safety message and to take responsibility for safety on the roads.

Discussion about a Secondary School at Romsey

In 2007/2008 a review of secondary school needs in Romsey was undertaken. The working party meet several times and held a community consultation seeking input from representatives from Lancefield, Romsey, Bolinda, Heskett, Clarkefield and Riddells Creek. A senior representative from the Department of Education and Early Childhood Development was part of this process. At the time the community discussed what they would like for Romsey. It was decided that they preferred a Prep to Year 12 education facility on this site.

The conclusion to the review found there were insufficient student numbers to justify the building of a secondary school in Romsey. The Department continually monitors population data provided by the Australian Bureau of Statistics. If a school was to be built now it would simply undermine enrolments at Kyneton, and Gisborne. The "trigger point" for the building of a new years 7-12 school is

1100 students. A further review will take place in 2013. Secondary school students in Romsey and the surrounding district can attend schools in Gisborne or Kyneton and Sunbury,



The Parking Issue Keeps Simmering.....

The issue of parking costs for new businesses has received a significant amount of local media coverage since last month's Romsey Rag.

On Wednesday 14th April, the granting of a car parking waiver to a prospective Romsey cafe/providore business was welcomed by the RRBATA Committee of Management as an indication of some discretionary consideration applied by Macedon Ranges Shire Council.

RRBATA COM has decided to continue working towards resolution of the "car parking costs for new Romsey businesses" issue. RRBATA is committed to ongoing dialogue with MRSC and wishes to be an active participant in the review process. Other BATAs will also be engaged by the Romsey Region BATA with a collective approach being taken if appropriate.

Should Romsey Be a Plastic Bag Free Town?

Recently, the RRBATA was contacted by the Lancefield Neighbourhood House with an invitation to consider the notion of, as Lancefield did last year, working toward "plastic bag free status". Most people would be in agreement that plastic bags have a negative environmental impact as rubbish. The RRBATA COM recently decided to consult with local business on this matter, with the view to tying any initiative with a Shop Local incentive program.
