Our Scratch team (all scores off the stick) and the 1st handicap team had been defeated in their finals in 2009 so both teams were out to make amends.

Captains of the three 2010 teams were; Scratch - Mat Hall/Mat Thornton, 1st handicap - Tyson Ellis and 2nd handicap - Ron Walker.

After five weeks of hard fought golf our results were looking quite good, there was a slight chance that all three of the teams might make the various finals. The scratch team was outright 2nd and went straight in, the 1st and 2nd handicap teams were in ties for second spot; so had to go through a count back to see if they would get a place in their respective finals. The 1st handicap team narrowly got into their final while the 2nd handicap team equally narrowly just missed out.

On Sunday 15th of May both teams played their finals at Broadford Golf Club. It was a wonderful, still, sunny day and the course was in tremendous condition although there were a few very slick greens to contend with. A large group of caddies and supporters had travelled to Broadford, by car or bus, to follow the players and cheer them on.

By mid afternoon things were looking very good with a number of our early players winning their matches. By 5.00pm it was all over and both our teams had won. The scratch won against Woodend 5/2 while the 1st handicap team won against Hidden Valley 4/3. It was a very happy group of Romsey citizens who arrived at the clubrooms just after 6.30pm with the two pennant shields. (Our last pennant shield was won in 2002.)

The 2010 pennant result says a great deal about our club and its future; there was a good number of juniors in all the teams, just as each team also had a number of older. more experienced golfers.

The scratch team will now move up to Divison 1/Section 1 and will play teams from larger clubs such as Kilmore, Euroa, Hidden Valley, Broadford and Lancefield. Our two handicap teams will most likely stay in Division 2 however this will be decided later in the year.

Romsey Golf Club is located at Romsey Park and competition golf is played on Wednesday mornings (ladies) and at 12.30pm on Saturdays (mens) All interested people are very welcome to come down and play a round; golf can be a wonderful, low physical stress way to get consistent exercise and to meet others from your town.

I was pleased to join Tony Robinson, Minister Assisting the Premier on Veterans' Affairs when he presented the Romsey Lancefield RSL Sub-branch with grants totalling \$7,385 for restoration work to the Lancefield and Romsey Cenotaphs.

These Cenotaphs are central places where the people of Romsey and Lancefield gather to remember those that have made the ultimate sacrifice for their country. Like many of these monuments, despite the care taken, over time they have fallen into disrepair and are in need of restoration.

The Lancefield-Romsey Cenotaph restoration project is one of 45 receiving funding this year under the Victorian Government's Restoring Community War Memorials grants program, and will be used to wash, repair and clean the memorials and statues and renew lettering.

Restoring our war memorials shows our community's commitment to honouring those Lancefield and Romsey locals who served, and who are currently serving, in the defence forces, ensuring their courage and sacrifices will be remembered by future generations.

The Victorian Government is committed to honouring our veterans' community by preserving their heritage so their legacy is never forgotten.

So far, more than 300 memorials across Victoria have been restored to their original glory. Under the program, Victorian ex-service organisations, local government, school or community groups can apply for up to \$10,000 to restore or enhance local war memorials.

Business Networking Night Success




Romsey Region Represented at Business and Tourism Meetings

Going it – With God Breakfast

A thousand people have given me my breakfast this morning, but I gobbled it at a gulp and thanking neither God nor man rushed off to work.

There was the cereal harvested from rolling wheat fields by men who had ploughed and planted, and driven tractors through to reap, by men driving transports through the night taking it to the factory, by men who built the processing machines and men who service and operate them. By girls in cheerful colourful lines who packaged the product, by man who work trains and trucks to bring it to the shop, by those in the home who bought it, carried it, and served it.

Then on the cereal, milk, first gathered before dawn by a distant farmer at his cowbail, then processed, then bottled, then transported, then delivered by yet another army of


And on the milk, sugar, growing green amongst the red fields of the tropics, then fired in the night to a sea of black stalks, cut by sweating labourers under blazing sunlight, driven to mills to be crushed by roaring machines guarded by oily hands, delivered to the white-coated operators in refineries, boxed by the nimble fingers of uniformed girls, driven in trains to my town, then carried to my table.

That bowl of cereal has taken a thousand men to produce.

And another thousand have arranged for that egg and that bacon, that tea or coffee, that toast, butter and marmalade.

Two thousand fellow-men have worked to produce the simplest meal of the day.

It makes you think, Lord, of how much we all depend on each other, for without a million mouths like mine at the end of the production line, two thousand men would be unemployed.



It makes you see, Lord, that every man has a duty to his neighbour in the next house, the next town, the next continent, and if in thanks we want to love our neighbour, we shall worry about those thousands of them who have no breakfast.

But loving our neighbour is only the second commandment - there is a first, for I had forgotten, Lord that without your creation there would be -

No wheat for the farmer; no oil for the tractor driver; no iron for the machines; no paper for the packing; no coal for the train; no work for the thousands; no breakfast for

So, Lord, as I fold up my napkin and newspaper and grasp my bag, let me give thanks to you for all your creation and to my thousands of neighbours who have made breakfast

But this thanks is that of a hypocrite, unless I do something for those who were created by you and also have neighbours but - unlike myself - did not have breakfast.

Amen.


