180gm butter


2Tablespoons golden syrup

Romsey Golf Club Report October - November Saturday November 20th: The 2nd round of the 2010 Club Championships began on a wonderful, still, sunny, day. The course was in the best condition for over 10 years and both dams were full to overflowing. The conditions were perfect for some good scoring. Players hit off from the 1st in groups of three at seven-minute intervals, first away were current stroke leaders, Mat Hall, Mat Thornton and Daniel Wright.

At the end of the 1st day he was equal 11th at -1 (The round saw a new course record -7/63 was set by David Branston) Chris had a stunning 2nd round, setting a new course record of -9/61 and winning the event by three shots at -10.

Saturday November 13th: The fairways were in wonderful condition, the greens were rapidly improving and the bunkers had been filled and raked; it was round two of the 2010 Romsey Golf Club Championships. Everything was right, except the weather. Steady rain on Friday night and well into Saturday morning saw two greens under water and pools on every fairway when greens committee inspected the course and called the day's golf off at 10.15 am. However, like on so many wet Saturdays in Romsey this year, the members were more than happy to enjoy a warm, dry afternoon in front of the TV allowing Daniel Gaunt to again provide the entertainment. This time it was his wonderful 3rd round, in extremely difficult conditions, at the JBWere 2010 Australian Masters which saw him move to outright 2nd. Daniel's final round had it all, some stunning shots, some good luck and some bad luck but in the end the boy from Cohuna, Stuart Appleby, -10, came over the top of everyone to win by one stroke. Daniel finished in 3rd place at -8.

<u>Saturday November 6th</u>: The 2010 Club Championships began on a wonderful spring day. The air was still, the sun was shining and the fairways were lush, however the greens, whist improving, still had someway to go. All players hit off from the 1st in groups of three and whilst the odd golfer put a ball "Out of Bounds" most got away to a good start. NTPs went to 1 – D Wright, 15 – Les Gaunt and 16 – Paul Noel

Saturday October 30th; Steady rain forced the cancellation of the October Monthly Medal. As the rain continued to fall the hot topic of conversation within the clubrooms was the excellent performance of ex-Romsey player, Daniel Gaunt, in the Apulia, San Domenica Grand Final, at La Puglia, Italy. Daniel's first three rounds of 67, 74, 66 placed him two shots clear at -6 going into the final round. Unfortunately his final round of one under 70 was not quite good enough to win as young Englishman, Matt Haines, stormed home with a 66 to win by one shot at -8. However, Daniel's second placing has moved him up to 7th on the 2010 Challenge Tour Rankings and will definitely see him take a place in the European Tour in 2011. The 2010 4BBB Knock-out final will be between J. White/M. Hall and P. Noel/R. Rea.

The 1st round of the 2010 Club Championships will be on Saturday November 6th.

Saturday October 23rd; Steady rain had fallen during the morning and the players walked on to the course in overcast conditions for the club's Aggregate 4B competition on Saturday. The weather remained calm and slowly improved as the day wore on. Again there was some casual water on a few of the fairways however the greens were much improved.

loddon campaspe Legal First for Missing Persons Order in Victoria community legal centre

Legal history was made today when the Victorian Civil and Administrative Tribunal ordered the appointment of an administrator to deal with the affairs of a missing person. David Rosewall made the application on behalf of his son Daniel Rosewall, who has been missing since January 2010. The application was made possible by recent Victorian legislative amendments inspired by the Rosewalls' experience. Deputy President Anne Coghlan, who heard the application in Bendigo appointed David Rosewall as administrator and congratulated the Rosewall family in their pursuit for legal change.

Prior to the legislative amendments, the Rosewall family had no legal means to take care of Daniel's affairs. **The Lod-don Campaspe Community Legal Centre** assisted the Rosewall family and advocated that the State government change the law.

Anna Howard, a solicitor with the Centre stated that "This order, a Victorian legal first, was made possible today by the fact that the State Government, in particular Attorney-General Rob Hulls, was willing to listen and understood that simple legislative change could make a difference for the Rosewall family and others in similar situations. The legislation was drafted and passed through the Houses very quickly, due to bipartisan support for the reforms."

The reforms amended the *Guardianship and Administration Act* 1986 (Vic) and are based on similar legislation in the Australian Capital Territory and New South Wales.

David Rosewall will now be able to ensure that his son's affairs are kept in order; including the payment of debts, completion of tax returns and redirection of mail.

Ms Howard noted:

"The Rosewalls still face a sea of unknowns but today's outcome provides them with one certainty and some peace of mind."

At year 3 the children from year 2 were engaged in an interactive whiteboard game integrating Maths and music and the current year 4s were excited about going to the new building for their classes. The most excitement was in the year 6 rooms where the year 5s were able to borrow the netbooks for the session. They worked in pairs and each had "\$1,000 to spend on a three day holiday". One pair I interviewed had spent more than \$1,400 staying at the Melbourne Hilton, so had to economise by deciding to make their own sandwiches for lunch and to eat them in the lobby! This program helps prepare children for the next stage in their education and means next year they feel confident and ready for 2011.

Christmas Toy Shop

For the last six years Cobaw Community Health has held a Christmas "Toy Shop", for families living in the Macedon Ranges Shire who are struggling to afford Christmas gifts for their children. The Toy Shop has provided gifts to approximately 100 families or 250 children from across the Macedon Ranges.

In the past the Brotherhood of St Laurence has been the main provider of gifts which they obtained from the Kmart Christmas Appeal. The shop was further supported by the Uniting Church Woodend Target tree

appeal, churches from across the shire, Probus and direct donations from the service clubs and members of our community.

The Brotherhood of St Laurence is no longer able to support the Toy Shop as the Kmart toys are now going to the Salvation Army for distribution. Without any toy donations, the Toy Shop was threatened with permanent closure, with many families in our community going without this special program. The local church community has seen that this is an invaluable outlet for many families and has agreed to co-ordinate the toy shop this year with the support of Cobaw Community Health.

In the absence of a major donator, this year Cobaw Community Health and the Combined Churches of the Macedon Ranges are really calling on the local community to support this program. To reach out in the spirit of generosity and love to take care of some of the most vulnerable people in our community, we require the donation of approximately 250 -300 toys, each at around \$20 value. The gifts are for boys and girls, ages 0-12. How to donate:

The Uniting Church and Target are again running "Operation Santa" and have kindly agreed to donate all toys from the Target Woodend Tree to the Toy Shop. Members of the public can donate by locating the Operation Santa Christmas tree in the Target store, taking a gift tag off the tree and buying a gift to leave under the tree. RRBATA AGM Roundup

On Monday 8th November, 2010, RRBATA's Annual General Meeting (AGM) was held at the Community Hub. A new Committee of Management (COM) was elected as follows:

Cr. Henry Mclaughlin and Cr. Joan Donovan were in attendance, with Cr. Henry McLaughlin conducting the election of COM positions. The President, Jenny Stillman, thanked all of the dedicated COM members who had served in the following year, as well as thanking Tracey Newnham and Greg Powell for their hard work with Romsey Online (www.romsey.org.au).

The Year in Review:

AGM 2010 – Less than ideal interest in COM positions with no applications for critical role of secretary. This was covered for the year by another executive member at, probably, a lower level to that which had taken place the previous year when a dedicated member developed the position. Being a RRBATA COM is a potentially fulfilling position which is not onerous if sufficient local business and tourism owners are prepared to share the responsibility of advancing the RRBATA cause.

Christmas Lights Competition – This was revived in 2009, largely due to the enthusiasm of Tracey Newnham. It received only limited support from Romsey businesses re prize donation but was widely promoted in the community. MRSC East Ward councillors judged the competition and prizes were awarded early in the New Year. This has not yet been promoted for 2010 and will depend on COM/RRBATA personnel numbers available.

Christmas Display – RRBATA erected an illuminated Christmas tree display in the Community Hub facilitated by MRSC funds.

Christmas Flags – MRSC funding to RRBATA provided the opportunity to supply Christmas "Bali-style" flags for local businesses to display leading up to Christmas.

Key issue advocacy – RRBATA provided a forum for discussion on issues of interest and concern to members. One such key issue was that related to parking costs for prospective new businesses in Romsey. In addition to an active discussion, RRBATA lobbied MRSC on this issue in order to promote the prospects for new business establishment in the town.

Involvement of Romsey in MRSC Economic Development and Tourism – Very close links have been forged with this MRSC unit which has facilitated dialogue with MRSC on business and tourism matters related to the town as well as special projects considered by the COM. The relationship developed by RRBATA over the last 2-3 years was key in MRSC choosing Romsey as a host town for one of its business networking evenings this year. RRBATA Executive members have participated in two BATA workshops and also a recent business leaders' forum.

Tourism Macedon Ranges (TMR) – RRBATA has been represented in this association and, with Lancefield BATA, has been a strong advocate for tourism promotion of the East Ward of the Shire. RRBATA subscribed to a TMR prospectus for a Tourism Victoria allied project to promote the "villages" of the Macedon Ranges.

Romsey Online – The Romsey website established last year has been managed with the generous input of Greg Powell and Tracey Newnham. Some improvements have recently been made to make it more user friendly ahead of a second wave promotion campaign to begin over the next week

Membership – There is still seemingly considerable work in convincing businesses of the value of membership in their local BATA. This appears to be a shire-wide problem (except for some standout examples such as the Piper Street Traders Association). The subscription of \$50 will not be reconsidered until just ahead of the 2011-2012 year.

RRBATA Business Breakfast – This was held in August with great guest speakers and an enthusiastic large crowd at Soltan Pepper restaurant. There was no charge to attendees at this event. COM recently decided to schedule another such event next year, but perhaps with some sort of nominal charge (more for non RRBATA members).

Tree Lighting Project – RRBATA COM has committed funds to the illumination of the large eucalypt near Lions Reserve. MRSC is facilitating RRBATA in this project with the lights to be hopefully switched on in the evening of 25th February 2011 (Romsey's 150th Birthday).

Lone Pine Development – The Lone Pine at the north end of town has become a little obscured and neglected in recent times. RRBATA, in conjunction with the RSL, plans to landscape and feature light this area in time for Anzac Day 2011.

Romsey 150th Birthday Gala Community Dinner – RRBATA has a subcommittee organizing this very special event to be held on Saturday 26th February 2011 to celebrate the 150th anniversary of Romsey being gazetted as a town. It is hoped that some funds can be raised at this event for the Historical Society to develop some projects (such as historical building plaques). Local sponsorships are being sought to support the fixed costs of this event which will feature a culinary team comprising The Bay Tree, Soltan Pepper and Sicilian Vespers working together for a very special night.

From Monday to Saturday two separate bus services pick up passengers in Romsey and Lancefield and carry them to Kyneton via Newham and Carlsruhe. There are also two separate services taking the reverse route from

New V/Line bus services which commenced on Oct 11

On weekdays the earliest bus to Kyneton leaves Romsey 9.20am and Lancefield 9.30 and arrives in Kyneton at 9.55am. The second bus leaves Romsey at 11.40am and Lancefield at 11.55 arriving in Kyneton at 12.15pm. On Saturdays the departure time for the early bus to Kyneton is the same but the second bus leaves Romsey at 12 noon, Lancefield, 12.10 and arrives in Kyneton at

The earliest Lancefield/Romsey bus out of Kyneton departs at 10.05am Mon-Fri arriving in Lancefield at 10.30 and Romsey 10.40. The later weekday bus out of Kyneton departs at 1.35pm reaching Lancefield at 2.10 and Romsev at 2.15.

On Saturdays the buses leave Kyneton at 10.20am and 1.20pm. In Kyneton, passengers can board and alight the service at the Kyneton Hospital stop, the railway station and the Jennings Street terminus. The service will also set passengers down at the stop at the Mechanics Institute in Mollison St upon request.

Tickets purchased on the new services are integrated with the Kyneton Town Service. That is, someone travelling to Kyneton on the bus will be able to use their ticket to get around Kyneton on the Kyneton Town Service at no extra cost.

The bus stop at Carlsruhe is behind the old weighbridge and Newham's stops are near the primary school. There are 3 sets of bus stops in Romsey that service both ends of the town and the centre of town. In Lancefield, the service utilises the existing 3 stops and there is an additional stop on the Woodend-Lancefield Road near Foy St.

Light Pierced the Darkness "...and lo, the star which they had seen in the East went before them, till it came to rest over the place where the child was. When they saw the star, they rejoiced exceedingly with great joy; and going into the house they saw the child with Mary his mother, and they fell down and worshiped him." Matthew 2:9-11

The world that Jesus entered was cruel and inhumane. Slaves composed one half of the Roman Empire's population. Thousands of gladiators were murdered every year in the Roman Colosseum simply as a spectator sport. Infanticide was a commonly accepted practice throughout the ancient world. Children were the property of the fathers, and they could be killed with impunity. Hospitals were unknown. The Romans considered helping a sick person as a sign of human weakness. The Irish sacrificed prisoners of war to the war gods and sacrificed newborns to the harvest gods. The Aztecs and Mayans practiced daily human sacrifices on a massive scale. They frequently tortured their victims before sacrificing them on altars to their sun and war gods. The Prussians, Lithuanians, Chinese, Mongolians, and others also practised human sacrifice. Cannibalism was rampant throughout Africa, Asia, and Central and South America. Life was cheap. The world was dark.

But a light pierced the darkness at the birth of the babe in Bethlehem. He illuminated the night. He said: "I am the light of the world; he who follows me will not walk in darkness, but will have the **light of life**." His life and teachings transformed whole societies. The individual's worth was elevated. Life was no longer cheap.

Instead of killing and sacrificing one's enemies, Jesus said, "Love your enemies."

Instead of disposing of unwanted babies and children, Jesus said, "Let the children come unto me for such is the kingdom of heaven."


Instead of ignoring the sick and wounded, Jesus said, "Heal the sick" and "Blessed are the merciful." However, He came not just to transform societies but to transform individual hearts. He wanted to reconcile man to God, but He requires a life yielded to Him so that man might gain eternal life. As He said in John 3:16:

"For God so loved the world that He gave His only Son, that whoever believes in Him should not perish but have eternal life." A light led wise men to Jesus, and Jesus led wise men to the light. He still does!



Victorian landholders have a legal responsibility to treat locust hoppers on their land. Here's what to do:

If you had locust activity in your area in autumn by now you should have purchased or at least identified the appropriate chemical for your situation. If you are yet to do this, your local chemical reseller, the DPI website

and the DPI Locust Hotline (1300 135 559) can assist you with this decision. You need to be prepared to spray locust 'hoppers' around 14 days after they hatch. At this stage they will be forming bands or groups and are

easiest to treat. A 100% rebate is available on chemicals used in the treatment of locusts by eligible landholders in worst affected areas. Visit dpi.vic.gov.au/locusts, or call the DPI Locust Hotline on 1300 135 559.
