

"Supervise, Separate and See"

Parents are cautious when it comes to their children's safety. However, even the best precautions can't prevent all accidents. One type of accident that is becoming more common is driveway accidents involving young children.

The younger the child, the larger the car, the faster it travels, the more likely a moment's carelessness ends in tragedy. Tragically one child, often a toddler, is run over in the driveway of their own home every week in Australia and two in three driveway fatalities occur in nonmetropolitan areas.

The majority of events occur during the day, particularly late afternoon, and the most vulnerable period is late in the week—approaching and including the weekend

To raise awareness of these tragic accidents Kidsafe has launched a Driveway Safety Campaign.

They have released a driveway safety sticker designed to go on the inside of the drivers car window to remind and reinforce the message "SUPERVISE, SEPARATE AND SEE". The stickers are available from my office (telephone 54 282138) together with a facts sheet with information on how to make your driveway safer.

Some things to remember around your driveway:

- Supervise children whenever a vehicle is to be moved. Hold their hands or hold them close.
- If you are the only adult around and need to move a car, even a small distance, **put children securely in the vehicle while you move it**.
- Never assume someone else is looking after your child. Know where they are at all times.
- Treat the driveway like a small road. It should not be used as a play area.
- Make child access to the driveway difficult for example use security doors, fencing or gates

We teach children to look both ways before crossing the road, we wear helmets riding bikes, have baby seats in cars and we install special locks on cupboards and fence backyard swimming pools. It's time to keep our kids safe and tackle driveway accidents as well.



Local Retailers Pass Tobacco 'Sales to Minors' Test

The latest round of tests by Macedon Ranges Shire Council show that local retailers are doing the right thing and asking for identification before selling tobacco products to customers they suspect may be under 18 years of age.

This is the second consecutive year that Council has worked with an under-age test purchase assistant to conduct random tests of tobacco sales to minors throughout the shire.

Sixteen test purchases were undertaken on 30 and 31 January in outlets such as milk bars, service stations and supermarkets. This time none were found to have sold cigarettes, including six retail outlets who had previously offended during the first program conducted in July 2011. The aim of the program is to reduce the retail supply of cigarettes to people under the age of 18 years by increasing tobacco retailer compliance with the cigarette sales to minors provision in the Tobacco Act 1987 (Vic).

All retail outlets in the shire have now participated in the program and follow up 'Sales to Minors' visits will be conducted by Council in the coming months.

Uniting Church Adult Fellowship Stamp Fund "Sammy Stamp"

Records show that the women's groups in both the Presbyterian and Methodist churches had a Stamp Committee before Union.

The PWMU began collecting used stamps for sale in 1959. In 1963, there was £53/5/- in the Fund and a donation was sent to the II Sin Hospital in Pusan.

Network reported: The Stamp Fund is a sort of 'widows cruse of oil'. It never seems to have a great deal in it, but it is never empty, and it is used for an amazing variety of purposes.

Thirty-eight years later, funds from the sale of stamps are still used for an amazing variety of purposes.

Sales of stamps for 2011 reached about \$33,624 (last year \$24,870.) This is the highest amount raised in one year since Sammy's formation in 1977.

Sales since 1977 now total about \$614,566.

Thanks to those scattered church groups, individuals and firms throughout Victoria and Tasmania and other states who collect, trim and/or sort un-numbered stamps for the UCAF Stamp Fund (Sammy Stamp) so that many worthy causes can be supported.



New Guide Helps Families of Missing Persons

A new guide will be launched to assist families and friends of missing persons to manage the financial and legal difficulties created when a loved one goes missing.

Funded by the Victoria Law Foundation, the Bendigo based Loddon Campaspe Community Legal Centre produced the guide, with the assistance of stakeholders including Victoria Police, VCAT, State Trustees and the Coroner's Court. The Centre believes that the guide will give practical support to recent legislative changes in Victoria that enable the proper administration of the affairs of missing persons.

The legislation, passed with bipartisan support in the Victorian Parliament in late 2010, resolves the legal limbo that faced the families and friends of missing Victorian's - previously unable to effectively manage and safeguard their loved one's affairs.

It enables a family or friend of a missing person to apply to the Victorian Civil and Administrative Tribunal (VCAT) to appoint them with power to deal with missing person's property and financial obligations, such as payment of bills, mortgages or to provide for the missing person's dependents.

The reform followed a swell of community and political support for the reform following a submission made by the Loddon Campaspe Community Legal Centre to the Victorian Law Reform Commission's review of Victoria's guardianship laws. That submission was influenced by the experience of the family of missing Bendigo man Daniel

The guide will be launched by President of VCAT, Justice lain Ross and Daniel Rosewall's father, David Rosewall tomorrow at VCAT in Melbourne. "This quide will be valuable to any person experiencing the heartbreak and stress of a loved one going missing. I only wish it had been available to us when Daniel went missing" Mr Rosewall

Anna Howard, Principal Solicitor at the Loddon Campaspe Community Legal Centre said "the guide give families like the Rosewalls practical information about the legal, administrative and emotional challenges they must confront when a loved one goes missing."

The guide, an online resource, will be available from a number of websites including the National Missing Persons Coordination Centre, Department of Justice, VCAT and the Federation of Community Legal Centres.

Mr Rosewall said that in addition to the guide, families and friends of missing Victorians require a dedicated and funded support group, like there is in NSW. "Families need a voice at the end of a phone; they need to know they're not alone".



GIVING LEARNER DRIVERS THE KEYS TO DRIVE TODAY

Federal Member for McEwen, Rob Mitchell today urged learner drivers and their supervisors to get online and register for the Government's keys2drive free lesson program to help reduce the incidence of road crashes involving young drivers.

"Keys2drive offers free driving lessons to learner drivers and their supervisors, with accredited local driving instructors." Mr. Mitchell said.

"The Australian Government has funded 50,000 driving lessons through the keys2drive, and I would encourage all learner drivers to sign up today."

Keys2drive is an Australian Government funded program that has been developed by the Australian Automobile Association (AAA), with support from the driver training industry.

"Many driving instructor schools across McEwen are involved in this free lesson program, which provides support to both L Platers and their driving supervisors, who are usually their parents or older siblings, to best prepare them for solo driving." Mr. Mitchell said.

The keys2drive program is the single largest national learner driver safety program to be rolled out in Australia, and the first of its kind undertaken anywhere in the world. It is a program squarely focused on saving lives through education.

Mr. Mitchell said every parent with a child learning to drive should take the time to have a keys2drive lesson with their child.

"Unfortunately young drivers are more likely to be involved in a car crash. This is because they are not yet experienced driving solo. This is particularly true for drivers in the first six months of their provisional license. As a former tow truck driver and emergency service volunteer, I have witnessed firsthand the terrible results that occur due to car accidents and the pain and suffering that families feel," Mr. Mitchell said.

"The good news is that the risks in these early stages of driving can be reduced with more supervised driving practice during the learner period. Keys2drive is invaluable for equipping both parents and learner drivers with driving skills and information for supervisors."

Keys2drive was developed by the Australian Automobile Association (AAA), with support from the driver training industry. It provides on-road technical skills and off-road learning with an interactive website, videos and educational games.

Fringe Benefits Tax (FBT) Year Ending 31 March 2012

Businesses can minimise their FBT liability by keeping appropriate records.

Car Fringe Benefits - Statutory or Operating Cost Method

To ensure flexibility of choosing the most tax effective method, it is important to maintain current log books and to record:

- Car odometer reading at 31 March each year; and

Changes Affecting New Car Contracts

Discounted Microchipping Day for Pets

Macedon Ranges Shire Council is holding a microchipping day for cats and dogs on Saturday 24 March 2012 from 10am until 2pm at Buffalo Stadium

Microchipping your pet can help ensure that you are reunited with your pet if it

goes missing. However, it does not replace the need to register your pet.

State legislation requires that all new applications to register your pet cannot be accepted unless the animal has a microchip.


If you are planning on attending the microchipping day, all dogs must be kept on a leash and cats in a cage.

What is a pet microchip?

A microchip is about the size of a grain of rice and contains a barcode that is linked to your contact details and recorded on a national database. In the event that your pet is lost, a vet or Council officer can use a handheld scanner to identify the microchip and trace the barcode back to your contact details held on the national database.

How is the microchip inserted?

The procedure is simple – one quick injection under the skin by a vet and the microchip causes no discomfort or pain to your animal.

I am researching the 1920 Soldier Settlement on Chocolyn estate, north of Camperdown in south west Victoria

Thomas Humphries was a resident of the Romsey District and hopefully I can locate a relative. I am seeking relatives of Thomas Humphries who served in the 3rd Aust Pioneer Battalion from 25/2/1916. Thomas took up a block in the Soldier Settlement Scheme at Chocolyn, north of Camperdown in south west Victoria. His parents Thomas Humphries and Euphemia Furphy were married in 1877 and lived at Romsey when he enlisted. He was brother of Deborah, Alexander, Sarah, Robert and Gilbert and Eileen. Thomas did not marry and remained at Chocolyn until 1944. He died in Heidleberg Military Hospital 6 September 1951 aged 65.

I understand family members are interred at Romsey. The Chocolyn Fire Brigade is planning to erect a plaque to honour the 35 ex servicemen involved in the Chocolyn settlement and are trying to make contact with all families

Ash Wednesday 22nd February begins the special time of preparation for Holy Week and Easter. This is a time of deeper prayer and good works to prepare our hearts to celebrate the centre of our Christian faith.

Read Romans 7 sometime, live with the agony of Paul and see that he's just like every one of us. Why do I do what I don't want to do? I hate myself for doing it. And I don't understand myself, woe is me. Paul says, "Who will rescue me from this body doomed to death?" There you can feel a man almost tortured with self-hatred, trying to get out of his body. Haven't all of us, at some point in our lives, disliked the person we'd become?

Church people set out to be nice people. Yet, in our moments of honesty, we know much of our soul is not of God. We have negative, destructive, even violent and vengeful thoughts toward other people.

Romans 7, thank God, is followed by Romans 8. St. Paul leaps to the most ecstatic chapter in the New Testament: "This I know, in Christ there is no condemnation" (8.1).

What allowed Paul to jump out of the immense self-hatred of Romans 7 into immense hopefulness? Whatever it is-Grace? Enlightenment? Conversion? Powerlessness? Surrender? - it's the most important thing to pray for: "Lead us not into temptation, deliver us from evil..... Thy kingdom come." God will answer that Our Father will deliver us from Romans 7 to Romans 8. Depend on it.



Romsey Business Supports Romsey Community


For Romsey businesses to survive and thrive, they need to be supported by their local community. This is not always easy when a significant proportion of the residents commute to work away from the town.
