Number's up for roads and streets

The rural road numbering system is now in place across Victoria, so it's a good time to remind local residents of the benefits of having our property numbers prominently displayed. Around 150,000 rural properties across the State now have a unique rural address consisting of a rural road number, road name and rural district.

In the past decade local government has developed a plan to allocate and install rural road numbers, to name and signpost roads and to confirm rural districts, so that properties are easier to locate. Macedon Ranges Shire has been a key supporter of this plan. If you need to obtain or re-



place a number, you should apply to one of our service centres. It's important that your property – both rural homes and holdings and properties in the town – is clearly numbered and easy to identify, particularly by emergency services. Rural road numbers are allocated according to the national standard for rural addressing, which uses the distance of each property entrance from the start of the road.

So if your property is 870 metres from the start of the road, then your property number will be 87. The number is rounded down so that odd numbers are always on the left side and the even numbers on the right in the direction of the numbering. In an emergency, every second potentially counts. The distance-based rural road number will help emergency services estimate how far along the road they need to go – and prominent numbers on the property entrance will alert them when they arrive. Reflective property numbers also mean they can be readily seen at night.

And have a happy Christmas!

Christmas and the New Year are quickly looming on the radar, and this is my last opportunity before the holiday break to get a message out to the residents of Romsey and the region.

The Romsey Rag must be thanked for providing me with the space for a regular message to the community.



Term four at Romsey Primary School is always a very busy time for staff, students and parents. During November our junior students had an excursion to the Botanic Gardens, our prep students travelled to Melbourne to the Arts centre for a show "Songs of the Sea" and our 5/6 students had a great time on camp. We have a number of special events coming up such as our Year 6 Graduation, Prep Concert, Music Soiree and other end of year celebrations. While all these special events are going on teachers are busy preparing end of year reports and getting ready for 2008. Listed here are a number of recent highlights from the many programs and activities undertaken at this time of the



Art Show

The Romsey Primary School Art Show was an outstanding success again this year. The students work was again of a very high standard; their work showing their talent and skill as well as an appreciation of a variety of styles and influences from which they drew their inspiration. The Art Show is a reflection of the outstanding Visual Art program at our school taken by Mrs Amy Green. Amy has been the driving force behind the introduction of an annual Art Show for our students; this has become another highlight on our school event's calendar each year.

Sports Award

Year 4 student Lauren Connell has been recognised in the 2007 Loddon Mallee Region Sports Awards. This is in recognition of Lauren's outstanding achievements this year in cross country, athletics and aerobics. Lauren is one of only eight individual primary age students recognised in these awards in the Loddon Mallee Region; this includes all schools from Gisborne to Mildura covering Bendigo, Swan Hill and Echuca. Lauren will be presented with her award on 4th December at a special function in Bendigo. Lauren was a member of the Victorian State Cross Country team and came 5th in the national titles in Perth; she was the first Victorian over the line in this event. She was a member of the school's aerobics team that competed and came 3rd in the National titles in Sydney. Lauren has also made it through to the State Athletics Championships in triple jump and 800 metres.

Free Fruit for Junior Students in 2008

For next year the school has successfully applied to be able to provide free fruit for each of our prep and junior students one day per week. This program is a Victorian State government initiative.

Water Saving Grant

The school has successfully applied for an additional Water Saving Grant. The site works for this project will be carried out early in 2008 and will include the installation of water tanks which will be connected to the toilets in the gym. This project complements other grants and programs that have installed devices to give restricted flow in all taps in the school. These strategies together should result in significant water savings over the coming years.

Transition throughout the school


This term we commenced an internal transition program for all students throughout the school. The aim of the program is to better prepare students for some of the tasks and activities they are likely to encounter in the next year of their schooling. This program has been implemented following feedback from parents in the annual survey. These weekly sessions will cover the core areas of English and Maths in the first two sessions. While at this stage students will be with a range of teachers and students, all children will have the opportunity to meet their teacher and fellow classmates for 2008 in the last week of term.

Special Awards & Presentations

On the Monday following Remembrance Day Romsey/ Lancefield RSL President Mr John Lynch attended our school assembly to announce the winners of the Senior Students' writing competition. This year's topic was centred on students' knowledge and understanding of the Kokoda Track. John was again impressed with the students' knowledge of the topic and their outstanding writing and presentation skills. The winners this year were Ashlee Wilson, Jessica Hoctor -Turner and Brittney Carter. The school appreciates the ongoing support of the RSL for our students in sponsoring this annual writing event.

On the following Monday Mr. Jason Patterson from Romsey Mitre 10 presented the school with a voucher from his business as part of the Junior Landcare Grant. These funds will be used for gardening tools and equipment for our students. The school appreciates the ongoing support of the Mitre 10 in encouraging students to care for the environment through their sponsorship on this grant program.

TREES ARE THE LUNGS OF THE WORLD CARING FOR TREES WITHIN YOUR GARDEN AND THE WIDER LANDSCAPE

Trees play an absolute crucial role within our Environment!! Trees produce our oxygen and they filter the atmosphere of pollutants. Therefore it is vital that we preserve the trees we have, maintain their health as well as plant more.

FACT 1. A trees root system can spread as wide as a tree is tall, often travelling much further in search of water and nutrients.

FACT 2. 80% of a trees root system are located within 1.5 metre from the ground surface

TREE HEALTH

<u>Compaction</u>: There are many daily occurrences which are detrimental to a trees health. Compaction is where the soil around a tree is worn to create a hard layer. This prevents moisture moving into the soil and results in water stress, also oxygen moving in and out of the soil is restricted. Compaction is commonly caused by

- a) Vehicles being parked around trees
- b) Building and construction materials stored around trees
- c) Pedestrian traffic
- Sheep, cattle and horses grazing and camping around trees

<u>Soil Capping</u>: This is where soil is laid on top of the original soil level. Often 'left over' soil from earth works is spread around the base of trees. This added soil causes a cap which restricts water penetrating the soil and oxygen exchange. Soil built up around a trunk can cause rot. Soil Capping is frequently associated with

- a) Road works,
- b) building and construction
- c) earthworks, including dam building

Spreading soil around the base of trees is disastrous, and eventually leads the tree death.

<u>Competition:</u> In times of stress, remnant trees (naturally existing) can suffer from competition for water and nutrients from weedy species such as pine trees and willow trees.

<u>Trenching</u>: Digging trenches through a trees root system, often associated with,

- a) laying pipelines, cabling, (services) to a property
- b) footpath construction

Trenching cuts through roots systems (remember the majority of roots in the top 1.5 metres) greatly reducing the trees ability to access water and nutrients.

<u>Nutrient Overloading</u>: Commonly associated with Remnant and Native trees. This is where trees are 'poisoned' by nutrients. Australian trees do not like stock manure and septic runoff. This excess in nutrients will slowly poison and kill these trees. This often occurs with,

- a) sheep, cattle and horses camping under remnant gum trees
- b) gardeners mulching gum trees with stable waste
- c) septic and nutrient rich grey water directed near native trees

<u>Physical Trunk Damage:</u> The trunk of the tree is damaged by machinery or stock. This reduces the trees ability to move water and nutrients up to the canopy as well as be-

ing a site for disease to enter the tree. Typically the trunk damage results in poor growth, susceptibility to pest and disease attack and /or death. Trunk damage is often caused by

- a) mowers and whipper snippers
- b) tractors and machinery
- c) stock chewing / rubbing

PREVENTING IMPACTS ON TREE HEALTH

Preventing problems is far easier than trying to repair problems.

Prevent Compaction:

- _Restrict vehicle and pedestrian access close to trees
- -Fence off remnant trees to prevent stock access
- -Fence off trees on building sites

Prevent Soil Capping:

- Never 'add' extra soil on top of existing soil level within the vicinity of trees

Prevent Competition:

- Remove/Kill Weedy species

Prevent Trenching:

Wherever possible use drill or tunnel trenching techniques, this greatly reduces the damage to roots
 Prevent Nutrient Overloading:

Fence off remnant trees to restrict stock

Prevent Trunk Damage:

-Spray out around the trunk and mulch, to keep mowers and whipper snippers away from trunk

- fence out stock

COMPACTION REPAIR

If you have trees suffering from compaction (poor growth, dead wood in canopy, dropping limbs) you can try to combat this by

- removing what is causing compaction
- spray out any weeds or turf
- aerate using a turf/soil aerator
- give root zone a slow, deep water
- mulch root zone, usually from trunk to edge of canopy SUMMARY

It is far easier to care for the trees we have by using common sense and following these simple steps. If you are having earthworks performed, make sure you consult with the operator and they understand what's to be expected when working around trees.

Special Days Commentary December 24 – Christmas Eve

In many churches, Christmas Eve worshippers are the first to celebrate the birth of Christ, and the evening is observed as the start of the Season of Christmas. The tradition of celebrating special days the evening before comes from Judaism, where the day begins at sunset. This in turn comes from the creation story in Genesis 1, where "there was evening and there was morning" suggesting that the day begins with the evening, rather than at midnight.

However, many churches hold worship services at midnight, keeping with the Western tradition of the day beginning at that hour.

December 25 - Christmas Season Begins

This day marks the beginning of a 12-day festival for Christians in the West known as the Season of Christmas. December 25 marks the observed, though not the actual, day of Jesus' birth. The season lasts for 12 days until Epiphany which is on January 6. Because the Eastern Orthodox Church uses the Julian calendar, Christians in this tradition will celebrate the birth of Christ on January 7, 2008.

December 26 – Boxing Day (Australia, New Zealand, Canada, and the United Kingdom)

Some traditions believe this day got its name from the fact that it falls on the feast of St. Stephen, a day when the alms boxes in the churches were opened and the contents

distributed to the needy. Others say that it was a tradition on the day after Christmas for employers to give gifts to their servants. It is a day for remembering those who serve others, by giving them a gift or token of appreciation.

about parenting issues. Unit 1's Jane Whelan also gave an insightful presentation.

Annual General Meeting – This is the second year of a guest speaker at our AGM. Last year's guest was Mr. John Marsden who spoke about language development in children.

Providing a Quality Kindergarten Program for Romsey's Children -The Teaching Staff

A Kindergarten's capacity to be progressive in its provision of a quality program for our pre-school program is highly dependent on the teaching staff. We are lucky to have a most experienced team at Romsey in Jane Whelan, Liz Keily, Catherine Tighe and Kay Futcher. This year, the teachers have been given an in increased opportunity for Professional Development which means they have undertaken ongoing education in many interesting areas. This year, Committee formulated Position Descriptions for the teaching staff in line with KPV (Kindergarten Parents Victoria) guidelines. Committee acknowledges that it has been a challenging year for them, also, as they adjust to the presence of more policy and process, all of which has been deemed necessary to run a kindergarten that is an example of best practice. Committee would like to thank them for their dedicated efforts throughout this year.

A Great Group of People

The ongoing functioning of this Kindergarten does not happen on its own. In addition to the teaching staff, Romsey Kindergarten depends on other individuals in order to deliver its service. Our Bookkeeper, Natalie Moreira, has nearly completed her first year with us, and has handled the challenge courageously! Leigh Ward, our cleaner, continues to be a wonderful asset to the Kindergarten and we thank her, too, for all of her hard work. The volunteer Committee of

Management has been, for me, a privilege to work with this year. The members make considerable personal sacrifice to be involved with the management and day-to-day running of this facility. I want to thank all of my fellow Committee members this year who have displayed grace and class under, sometimes, challenging expectations in this important community service.

The Way Forward

This Kindergarten is a so-called "Community Kindergarten", which means it depends totally on kinder community support to operate. Whether that support is on the Committee of Management or volunteering in other ways, it is vital. The recruitment for Committee is potentially a problem. Even getting the Kindergar ten community to come along and support kinder initiatives has been challenging. The Goods and Services Auction was a case in point. Well supported by the local broader community (it was the single biggest fundraising effort ever), but pathetically attended by the 90 family kindergarten community.

The time has come for this community to seriously consider their commitment to a "Community Kindergarten". Committee set up a working party this year to evaluate kindergarten management systems, including our own, that of Council administered kindergartens and those kindergartens run by other cluster managers (such as Early Childhood Management Service). We are presenting and discussing the findings of this review in a forum to be held here on **Monday 3rd** December at 7.30pm. We encourage you all to attend this very important discussion.

For me, my time as President has been rewarding, challenging and educational (sometimes all at the same time!). I want to thank everyone who has assisted me this year for their wonderful efforts, and encourage the committee members of 2008 to maintain the current momentum at Romsey Kindergarten.



What's happening at the Hub?

Building works remain well on target for completion in early 2008. A lot of "behind the scenes" activity is going on with several committees meeting regularly to monitor building progress, and to develop a management model for the facility once it is up and running. All the proposed user groups, including the community House, have representation on this committee.

The Romsey Community House committee recently put in two submissions to the state government for funding for co-ordinator hours, and for a grant for training volunteers to help with the operation of the House. We had mixed success with these submissions. We did receive a grant of over \$3000 for volunteer training, and plans will be developed for a volunteer training program after our Annual general Meeting in late October. We were not successful in obtaining on-going funding for paid co-ordinator hours. We are in dialogue at the moment with the local MP Joanne Duncan and the Department of Victorian Communities to find out why we were unsuccessful, and to explore whether there will be future opportunities to apply for funding for this purpose. We note that Riddells Creek Neighbourhood House were successful in their application for paid co-ordinator hours, so this offers us some hope that we may also be in the future.

Our Annual General Meeting will be held on October 30th at Romsey Primary School. We are looking forward to welcoming new members on our committee, with many of our existing members indicating that they are willing to continue as committee members. This is a great opportunity to expand the membership of the committee, to make it more representative of the community we seek to serve. At our most recent committee meeting we discussed the specific tasks that now need to be undertaken to ensure the future growth and usefulness of the community house, and to this end we encourage people to attend our AGM and offer their talents, services and ideas.

Greetings from the Romsey Toy Library!

The Toy Library has just held its AGM for 2007 and celebrated a year of consolidation and achievement. The current committee executive – president Leanne Manton, secretary Anna Quigley and treasurer Marg Redmond – has agreed to stay on for a further year, which will greatly help streamline the process of the toy library's relocation to the new Romsey Community Hub early next year.

The President's report at the AGM reported the library had great success with grant applications – we received \$2717 from the Federal Government's fund to help volunteers, enabling us to buy a laptop, digital camera, software, storage containers and a portable first aid kit. A subsequent \$500 grant from the Macedon Ranges council will enable us to establish a party pack for hire which should generate some much-needed income. We made more than \$500 from our annual Bunnings sausage sizzle which should amply cover annual rent, insurance and Toy Libraries Victoria membership costs.

Membership numbers have been up and down but are steady and we look forward to increased membership when we have a better 'street presence' in the hub. The appeal for grandparents to join has been a success and we hope this will continue.

Leanne and Anna attended Romsey Community Hub planning meetings throughout the year and all is on track for the Toy Library's relocation, likely to be in March/April, 2008.

Stocktake has not been done for 2007 and this will be delayed until hub relocation so we can have a clearer idea of what new/replacement items are required and of our storage capacity.

A special thanks to all who have helped this year, especially Marg and Anna.

The Toy Library will close for 2007 on Saturday, December 15. Members, please remember ALL TOYS MUST BE RETURNED BY THIS DATE. Over the school holidays the committee has decided to add to the popular Leapster series, with another console and more games. These will be available for borrowing when the library reopens on February 2, 2008.

Don't forget, if you have any board games, educational toys or good quality large toys (i.e. Little Tikes cars) which your children have no further use for, please think of your local toy library! We especially need new board games, so if you have any tucked away in your cupboards which are hardly ever used or that you children have grown out of, we would love to receive them. 
