<u>Baked Mocha Walnut Cheesecake with Coffee Cream.</u> *Ingredients:*

11/2 x 250gm pkt Chocolate Ripple Biscuits 75gm unsalted butter, melted

100gm pkt walnuts, chopped

Filling:

500gm cream cheese, at room temp

½ cup caster sugar

3 eggs, lightly beaten

1/4 cup plain flour

100gm dark eating chocolate, melted

2tblsps cocoa powder

½ cup Milk Choc Bits

Coffee Cream:

300ml thickened cream 2tblsps icing sugar mixture

2tblsps coffee flavoured liqueur

Method:

- Gease a 24cm springform pan & line base & side with baking paper
- \bullet Place biscuits, butter & $1\!\!\!/_2$ the walnuts in a food processor. Process until finely crushed.
- Press mixture firmly over base of prepared tin
- Filling: place cream cheese & sugar in a bowl. Beat until smooth. Add eggs, flour, chocolate & cocoa.
- Beat until well mixed. Stir in Choc Bits & liquer
- Pour filling over prepared base. Sprinkle remaining nuts around edge
- Cook in mod slow oven (160c) for 55mins or until set & firm to touch.
- Stand for 30mins before serving.
- To make coffee cream, place cream & sugar in a small bowl. Beat until firm peaks form. Add liquer. Beat to combine. Enjoy!

Strengthening Student's Coping Skills

For all of us, life is an exciting and often unpredictable journey that provides joys, satisfactions and highlights, but also some difficulties, frustrations, disappointments and hard times. Through meeting life's challenges we grow stronger and gain personal coping skills and a sense of who we are and become more resilient. At Romsey Primary School we use Bounceback to develop these skills in students. Presently all classes are revisiting this program. remembering what each letter stands for and practising these skills. The school finds that not only is this program useful for students it is also valuable for teachers and parents. Students have reported using these coping skills in their lives and some students have taught Bounceback to members of their family. During term three all classes we are also exploring our school values of Learning, Caring, Relationships, Happiness and Inclusion.

In Bounceback we have so far covered

B – Bad times don't last, things always get better, stay optimistic

O – Other people can help if you talk to them

U - Unhelpful thinking makes you feel more upset

Recently an aquatic scientist from Melbourne Water visited the Senior Unit to explain the Waterwatch Program. He showed the students how water quality is tested for salinity, temperature and acidity. He also brought a tub of water from Deep Creek to search for bugs and fish. During the rest of the year students will be visiting Deep Creek to test the water. Our local creeks and rivers feed the waterway which has the rare Yarra Pygmy Perch, a fish that is nearly extinct. We are pleased to be involved in this important local environmental project and to be supported by the Deep Creek Landcare Group in this project.




Solar Boats

Ripper Reads

The Book of Fame – Lloyd Jones

The Age called this book, "starkly beautiful" and even though it is about the 1905 All Blacks tour of Britain I would have to agree that the description fits perfectly. I must also admit that although I have tried to understand the rules of Rugby, even borrowed a basic book about it once, it still strikes me as a fairly brutal and uninspiring game. However Jones has written about the tour, and the Kiwi boys who played in it, with love and awe and the simplicity of the text only enhances the melding of history and imagination. "People stopped them in the streets. 'Mr Gallaher, Mr Gallaher, sir. How does it feel to be famous?" "The pyramids are famous, son." Understated and original - like the team who scored 830 points and conceded just 39. A great read.

My Story - Schapelle Corby with Kathryn Bonella Schapelle Corby continues to protest her innocence of trying to smuggle 4.2kgs of marijuana into Bali two years ago in the form of a 300 page book co-written with journalist Kathryn Bonella. Her story is starting to fade in the Australian public's consciousness so maybe this book is a timely reminder to us that not every legal system operates on the "innocent until proven guilty" premise. No matter what your opinion of Corby's guilt or innocence, and the lack of forensic process argues most favourably in her defence, this book highlights the stark differences between judicial systems and the fact that if the trial had been conducted in Australia a jury would have probably decided in her favour due to a lack of substantial evidence. A very illuminating read.

Warriors of Alavna & Warriors of Camlann -N.M.Browne

Time shift books are definitely in vogue at the moment, but some authors write this genre better than others. N.M. Browne is one of these. Both of these titles deal with the same main characters - Ursula and Dan - who find themselves transported from the present day back to Roman Britain and King Arthur's Britain respectively. The narrative is lively and believable and the strength of the characters is the highlight of the books. No doubt there will be a third title soon.

August 2008

Macedon Ranges Shire is receiving a \$50,000 State Government grant to help progress planning for early years infrastructure. We're one of five councils across the State to get a grant, which will help us plan our future needs for young children.

Romsey services are getting two Government grants worth more than \$100,000. They are among three local children's services to have received minor capital funding, More than 900 kindergartens, childcare centres, neighbourhood houses and schools are sharing \$10.7 million in State Government grants.

Romsey Kindergarten has received \$98,610 to redevelop its outdoor area to provide a safe, interactive and friendly play space, and Romsey Primary School's after hours care program has received \$2970.

Riddells Creek Primary School's outside school hours care program has been awarded \$2970 in minor capital funding.

Voluntary Environmental Resource Inventory -Feedback and Evaluation Survey

In May 2008, Macedon Ranges Shire Council sent out 5166 land management information packs to residents on rural land, greater than or equal to 2 hectares.

The Packs included different information depending on the size of the land owner's property and whether the property had changed hands in the past three years. The packs could include a copy of Caring for Country (CC), a Voluntary Environmental Resource Inventory (VERI) Flier or an invitation to request a Department of Primary Industries New Landowners Kit (DPI).

All landowners in the Shire on land greater than or equal to 2 hectares should have received a copy of the VERI flier.

The Packs were Distributed as follows:

Total Mailout - 5166 packs

The VERI is a check list that can be used by land vendors or purchasers as a tool to exchange relevant land management information at the time of sale.

Caring for Country is a full colour magazine style book that details a broad range of sustainable land management issues.

Council is seeking feedback on the VERI and Landcare Communications in General.

Flashing Can Kill You and Others!

As secretary of the Romsey Business and Tourism Association I have the benefit of receiving publications that I would normally not have received as a resident or may not have even known about.

One such notable document received recently was the Macedon Ranges Draft Road Safety Strategy. With most residents being a road user in one way or another this document should interest everyone and is available at the Shire's Gisborne office or online at (www.macedon-ranges.vic.gov.au), comments are invited but must be submitted by August 15th 2008.

Some key points include:

- * annual fatalities have halved since 1991
- * currently there is one fatality every seven weeks
- * 95% of fatalities are male
- * three quarters of fatalities were on dry roads with clear conditions in 100km/h speed zones

In light of such statistics it's disappointing to still see drivers flashing their lights warning one another of speed cameras and breath testing stations. A simple flash today could cost someone their life tomorrow, maybe yours.


With three young children and a fourth soon there often aren't enough hours in a day to accommodate work, kindergarten, shopping, doctors appointment etc however when running late and tempted to speed I always remember a road safety billboard in Scotland that read "Better to be late, than to arrive dead on time".

Micah 6:8

"He has told you, O mortal, what is good; and what does the Lord require of you but to do justice, and to love kindness, and to walk humbly with your God?"

When Micah the prophet began to tear strips off his people for their bad behaviour they turned to the traditional – animal sacrifice, burning oil on the altars, even offering their children. In passing have you noticed how much easier it is to sacrifice other people, rather than oneself? A British politician's actions were once described as "Greater love hath no man than this, that a man lay down his friends for his life!" Micah wouldn't let his people get away with that. He asked," And what is it that the Lord asks of you? Only to act justly, to love mercy, and to walk humbly with your God." Micah asserts that God demands not tokens, but radically changed lifestyle. We are too often content with the possible. We hide behind the "sacrifice", even though we know God really wants ourselves, our egos. True sacrifice involves respecting the rights and living space of others. Taking no more than our fair share, or less justice. Can we leave it that way. Lord?
I'll do my bit and you'll do yours.

There are 2 telephone surveys. If in doubt, ask the interviewer who they are doing the survey for.


- 1. Ballarat University is undertaking a telephone survey based on the Supreme Court decision. It is an independent academic body doing this for the Macedon Ranges Council.
- 2. DBN Consultants of Melbourne, are doing a telephone survey, it seems for pokies interests. They are interested in whether you support improvements at the hotel, and if you will support pokies in order to have these. That is the survey that Jean Tom had rung me about.

There is a web site if you are interested in further information about poker machines - www.pokiewatch.org It reports on what happens after pokies get approved, for example, have hotel applicants done the improvements they promised? You use the search button, and type in a name eg. Brown or a place eg. Wallan

An Interesting Statistic on the Impact of Poker Machines:

The VCGR (Vic Commission for Gaming Regulation) has reported that an average of \$647 for every adult in Victoria was lost on poker machines in 2007-2008. (*The Age*, 26/7) If Romsey is an 'average' area, on the 2006 Census, that equals \$1.97million that would be lost in the Romsey area in a year. (\$1.97m from local adult residents, money that is not then spent on other things).

HELP AVAILABLE TO AVOID SCAMS



Have you ever been tricked into signing a contract or buying a product or service? Or perhaps you think someone has gained access to

your online account, telephone banking account or credit card details...Or you have been scammed using your computer.

Every year, thousands of Australians lose million of dollars to scammers who bombard us with online, mail, door to door and telephone scams. The scams can involve fake lotteries, advance-fee frauds, various get rich schemes, miracle health cures, fake billing to small businesses or charity scams that take advantage of peoples generosity.....and these are just a few examples.

Unfortunately, authorities are not always able to take action against scammers, even when it appears that laws have been broken. While it's not easy to recover money lost in scams, there are ways to reduce the damage. This is best achieved by reporting the scam to authorities and warning friends. This at least reduces the

opportunities of further scamming. If the scammer is located in Australia, there is a reasonable chance of a "cooling – off" period and a chance to negotiate a refund. Security software is essential and it's worth remembering that scammers are able to get access to online passwords so these need to be changed using a secure computer.

Help is available through SCAMwatch.gov.au where information is readily available on the different types of scams and tips on how to avoid them.

New Honour Roll for Army Tank Museum

THE RAAC Memorial and Army Tank Museum at Puckpapunyal would receive a \$3000 grant to help honour defence personnel who had died during service since 1939, said the member for McEwen, Fran Bailey.

Fran said the Saluting Their Service grant would assist with publication of a biographical honour roll. The roll, Green Fields Beyond, would identify and record all members of the Australian Light Horse and Australian Armoured Corps who had died during service since the beginning of World War Two.

"Saluting Their Service" grants were introduced by the Howard Government to assist ex-service organisations and local communities in recording and honouring the service and sacrifice of Australian men and women," Fran said. "They promote wider appreciation and understanding of the role played by Australia's servicemen and women in wars, conflicts and peace operations."

Fran said the Puckapunyal museum now had more than 70 armoured fighting vehicles on display in Hopkins Barracks. "The museum's Army History Unit performs a vital role in preserving, exhibiting and interpreting armoured vehicles, artefacts, icons and memorabilia to help promote and commemorate Australia's Light Horse and Armoured heritage," she said. "The publication of Green Fields Beyond will add to the tremendously important work of the museum."

Fran congratulated the many people who had worked tirelessly over the years to build the museum into the outstanding collection it is today.

They develop a creative and original way to communicate this solution to others, working within predefined parameters such as limited materials, complex challenge criteria and the deadline of Tournament Day. Students present the product of their ideas - their challenge solution - to a panel of judges and an audience on Tournament Day. They have ten minutes in which to present and must do so within a 3 m x 3 m performance area. The teams must also participate in an unseen Spontaneous Challenge on Tournament Day. This challenge requires rapid interchange of ideas, the ability to think creatively, and well developed group cooperation skills. We wish our students



DISCOVER WALKING

"Girl Guides is the Premier Leadership **Experience for Girls.**"

The management of a Guide Unit involves organising the girls into groups called patrols with a Patrol Leader, a more experienced girl, as the leader. She has a number of responsibilities to her patrol, including helping new girls to learn what guiding is about, helping to run activities each meeting night, and providing peer support for the girls in her patrol. The girls enjoy fun and friendship as well as the challenges of leadership in the unit.

Girl Guides Victoria is currently running an Advocacy Project that highlights aspects of what advocacy means in terms of leadership, building confidence, speaking up and telling others. This project, with an activity night for each month, aims to provide learning experiences as leaders, standing up and passing on the message.

There are many opportunities to experience leadership at all levels of the Girl Guide organisation. Girl Guides Australia has announced there will be a Youth Forum in 2009, having been awarded a grant from the Australian Government, Office of Women - Women's Leadership and Development Program. This will give 40 - 50 young women the opportunity to speak up about the direction that Girl Guides is taking in Australia. Giving young women a voice enables them to build a better world and encourages more young women to participate and contribute at more events.

They are also planning to help plant trees for Landcare as a service activity.
