# IN YOUR ROUSEY CARDEN No. 8 Some Lesser Known Fruits Part 1

Browsing through some old files recently I discovered copies of two acticles of a series entitled "Exploring The Fruit Morld", which I wrote for a garden magazine in the early 1950's. The first described a then little known edible fruited plant called "Chinese gooseberry" (Actinidia chinensis) - since changed to "kiwi fruit" by aggressive sales promoters in N.Z. - which I predicted would rise to popularity in this country. The second concerned a South American fruit known as "Harranjilla" (Solanum quitoense) which in my trials at Newport had proved to be unsuited to our climate. A close relative of this plant, Solanum muricatum, has however, been introduced and grown in Victoria in recent years and sold in shops under the native name of "pepino" and on present indications also seems likely to become popular here not only in the fruit trade but as a home garden subject.

Whilst the Actinidia or "Yangtao" as it is known in its native Himalayan habitat, needs lots of water, protection from wind, late frosts, excessive heat, and being a climber, also expensive supports, the pepino is a small shrub which can be maintained as a large pot plant or grown in the garden. Easily propagated from cuttings, the plants although frost tender, survive cold winters and make strong growth in their second year. Reports to date state the yellow fruit which grows to 4 -5 inches long-to be delicious. Comments from other local growers are invited.
