


Lancefield & Romsey Community BankMANY HAPPY RETURNS FOR THE COMMUNITY

Through my ears you have listened to the egret's squawk as it tries out roosting places on half-submerged bare tree limbs. You hear the mournful cry of the ubiquitous black crow, the chatter of lorikeets, and, in between these, the rare sound of silence.

You, Agape Spirit, have communed with me on this gentle morning, infilling my life with something of your elemental serenity, awakening an awe which leavens the supreme contentment of wholeness, yet leaves me raw and more exposed to threats of existence.

Creator spirit, like your Jesus help me increasingly to trust your serene communion and like Jesus, when it is needed, to accept the holy way of the cross which weighs so painfully on souls made sensitive to beauty.

Missing law sorts legal limbo

New legislation introduced by the Victorian Government in Parliament today will resolve the legal limbo facing families and friends of missing Victorian's - previously unable to effectively manage and safeguard their loved one's affairs.

The legislation will enable a family or friend of a missing person to apply to the Victorian Civil and Administrative Tribunal to appoint them with power to deal with missing person's property and financial obligations, such as payment of bills, mortgages or to provide for the missing person's dependents.

The amendments have been influenced by a swell of community and political support for the reform following a submission made by the Bendigo based Loddon Campaspe Community Legal Centre to the Victorian Law Reform Commission's review of Victoria's quardianship laws. That submission was influenced by the experience of the family of missing Bendigo man Daniel Rosewall.

Without this legislation, Daniel's father David Rosewall has no legal means to apply to manage his missing son's estate. Daniel Rosewall has been missing with no contact or evidence of his whereabouts since January 2010. David has been unable to protect his son's estate and pay his bills and debts. He is even prevented from redirecting Daniel's mail so he might keep track of his debts.

Anna Howard, solicitor from the Loddon Campaspe Community Legal Centre said "the proposed legislation would give families in situations similar to the Rosewalls a simple and accessible means to protect the estate of their missing loved one. It is a sensible, practical change."When the Rosewalls sought our assistance to navigate Daniel's affairs we were astounded to discover that the law was hopelessly inadequate," Ms Howard said.

Commenting on the barrier's facing the families and friends of missing persons, David Rosewall said, "As Daniel's parents, we can't do much more to find Daniel. What we can do is look after his affairs, otherwise they will end up in tatters. But everywhere I turned in Victoria, I was told that I couldn't."

Ms Howard commented, "We are extremely pleased that the Attorney-General and other Members of Parliament have shown such interest in this issue and the speed and commitment with which they have responded to our recommendations. The reforms will allow the Rosewalls to protect their son's affairs from ending in tatters," Ms Howard said.

The new legislation is based on similar legislation in the Australian Capital Territory.

Romsey Region Business and Tourism Association (RRBATA) **UPDATE**

Get on Board for the Big Birthday Party.

As previously reported, Romsey will celebrate the 150th anniversary of being gazetted as a town on 25th February next year (2011). All community groups would have received a letter from the Lancefield and Romsey Historical Society informing them of this important date in our local history.



The RRBATA Committee of Management is currently exploring the feasibility of a number of activities to contribute to the celebrations. These include further development on the concept of an open air *community dinner* in the main street, with as many community members engaged as possible. RRBATA is currently seeking expressions of interest from local businesses to get on board as sponsors of this event in order to facilitate an affordable but very special night in town. The Historical Society has some exciting projects in mind, and it is thought that any funds raised from the big birthday bash could be donated for these projects. So – a message to all businesses – get on board to support this idea! There will be sponsorship opportunities big and small. A message to all other community groups - consider a contribution to the weekend of celebration!

Romsey has a rich history which gives the town its appeal for locals and visitors alike. RRBATA believes the history should be celebrated and appreciated.

Street Beautification Project - Turning On the Romsey Lights

RRBATA has continued discussions with MRSC regarding the proposed tree lighting project. Significant progress has been made regarding feature lighting of the large eucalypt on the southern approach to town near the Lions Reserve. This would not be a "fairy lights" style but, instead, feature illumination from the ground up.

As well as being an aesthetically attractive feature, it is hoped this lighting could also facilitate security in the immediate area. In addition, discussions have continued with both MRSC and the RSL regarding improved exposure of the commemorative Lone Pine tree on the northern approach to town. RRBATA committee is considering some landscaping and possibly some lighting to enhance this important feature which is currently obscured both visually and – unfortunately – in the minds of many residents. A close dialogue with the RSL will continue as this project is further developed. It is hoped that this project could be officially "unveiled" at Romsey's 150th celebrations.

Business Leaders' Forum

Romsey business was well represented at the recent Business Leaders Forum held at Woodend. Jacinta Allan, who is both the State Minister for Regional and Rural Development and Minister for Industry and Trade, was the keynote speaker at an event which saw all three East Ward local councillors and our local state member, Joanne Duncan, in attendance, Ms. Allan spoke about the State Government's recently announced regional development plans, including a focus on tourism initiatives in our region. This was a great opportunity to network with other key business members from the region and underscored the importance for us to think regionally (that is, beyond Romsey's 70km/hour zone!) when in it comes to fostering business relationships and enhancing our town's profile.

Victorian landholders have a legal responsibility to treat locust hoppers on their land. Here's what to do:

If you had locust activity in your area in autumn by now you should have purchased or at least identified the appropriate chemical for your situation. If you are yet to do this, your local chemical reseller, the DPI website

and the DPI Locust Hotline (1300 135 559) can assist you with this decision. You need to be prepared to spray locust 'hoppers' around 14 days after they hatch. At this stage they will be forming bands or groups and are

easiest to treat. A 100% rebate is available on chemicals used in the treatment of locusts by eligible landholders in worst affected areas. Visit dpi.vic.gov.au/locusts, or call the DPI Locust Hotline on 1300 135 559.
