Pagers:

Twenty pagers have recently been purchased for Brigade use and these will greatly improve our ability to contact members when required for emergencies. Within the next 2-3 months an autodialler will also be installed. This will automatically set off papers when the siren sounds. The cost of the pagers (\$2,000) was funded by the Brigade Auxiliary.

Fire Calls: The number to call is - 295 333.

Please use this number for emergencies only.

When you call, someone will generally answer the phone. Often more than one person will answer and a conference can be held.

When you call in an emergency, please try to give:-

- * Type of fire or accident
- * Address
- * Nearest cross street
- * Whether you think anyone is in danger
- * Your name. Remember don't hang up until told to do so.

If no one answers the phone:

Hold on for 30 seconds and the siren will sound.

Then wait a further 3-4 minutes and a member

at the Fire Station will answer.

HEART DISEASE RISK SCREENING

Risk of heart disease is usually determined by looking at a combination of factors - some of which are beyond our control, such as age, sex and heredity. However, we can do something about other risk factors such as weight, exercise, blood pressure and cholesterol levels.

Cobaw Community Health Service will conduct a heart risk screening program in March at Romsey, Woodend and Kyneton. For just \$5 you can have your blood pressure and cholesterol measured and your body mass index determined and discussed with you in context with other risk factors. Most importantly we will discuss options with you about action you can take to reduce your risk of heart disease.

GOLF COURSE PART OF THE PACKAGE

Romsey Shire President Cr. Daryl Tranter said today that the proposed new Golf Course at Romsey was part of a development package designed to provide the residents of the Romsey Shire with more recreation land and the provision of capital funds for future infrastructure needs in the Municipality.

"The development is a package with many benefits to the Community. This project aims to provide funds for the construction of future community and recreation facilities for use by the residents. It will provide passive recreational facilities via the walking tracks along the Five Mile Creek as well as the Golf Course Development. This development will be an excellent community asset providing a minimum of 34 hectares of public open space for use by our community. The relocation of the Golf Course will then release much needed additional land in the Romsey Park for future requirements of the residents."

The contract to purchase the land from Mr. Thomson has been negotiated by Council on a schedule of payments structure over some years, making the project from a financial point of view a very viable and flexible development and, subject to compliance with some special conditions, the development will proceed.

Cr. Tranter said that the proposed rezoning of the land as part of the L20 Planning Scheme Amendment and a Planning Permit were the conditions that needed to be met before the development could proceed.

"The Office of Local Government actively promotes entrepreneurial activities and encourages Councils to become resourceful in their raising of funds. Also, as we all know, at the present time there are very limited funds available from the State and Federal Governments to provide for community facilities" said Cr. Tranter.

"This type of development is an area that we have expertise in. Road construction and drainage and the associated development requirements is a major part of Councils business. There is also the potential benefit of employment to local contractors in their various fields of expertise during the development of the project."

"Whilst the current economic climate is very difficult for us all, Council has taken a pro active role in the Community and this development is a long term project which will provide facilities for the residents of the Municipality in the years ahead." he concluded.

RECYCLING

Recycling bags and information pamphlets will be distributed to households during mid March and the collections will commence on the 19th and 20th March.

SHIRE GOUNGIL NEWS ROMSEY RIDING

The Shire Council's total annual budget is in the order of \$5.3 Million for which \$2.2 Million is derived from rates with the remaining \$3.1 Million from grants and other sources. The Council's 1990/91 Audit has been completed and has confirmed that the finances of the Shire are in a healthy state with an accumulated surplus of \$93,920 being achieved last financial year.

Residents may be aware that a three person independant panel has completed hearing submissions in relation to the new planning scheme, AMENDMENT L20, and this panel will be making a detailed report and recommendations to Council in the next two to three months on the new planning scheme.

As a result of requests for improved street lighting Council will be directing the SEC to install 32 additional street lights within Romsey. Works have also commenced on the widening of Main Street at Digby Drive to provide for a safer right turn facility at this location. The Riding Councillors in the next few months will be seeking the opinions of residents as to your thoughts on the future development of existing playground reserves at Coleraine Drive, Collier Close & Newnham Drive.

Several complaints have been received that street numbers are not clearly displayed at numerous residential properties in Romsey. Council wishes therefore to seek your cooperation in ensuring that your residence is easily identified by displaying the street number at either your letterbox, front gate or front door. Should you require any further information in relation to actual street number within a street please contact the Shire Offices on 295201.

Council has also agreed to spend \$5,000 next tree planting season on new street tree plantings in Romsey. Should you wish to see tree planting in your street or additional street trees planted please contact your Riding Councillors.



AROUND YOUR ROMSEY HOME - NO. 11

Safety - **Using jumper leads on motor vehicles**. Despite serious accidents over the years when using jumper leads, and warnings in motoring and safety magazines, many motorists fail to observe the following recommended procedures to avoid accidents:-

- 1. Ensure vehicles are not in contact with each other.
- 2. Switch off all lights, heaters, radios, wipers and other accessories.
- 3. Engage parking brake, put auto transmissions into 'PARK' and others into 'NEUTRAL'.
- 4. Remove vent caps from both batteries and cover with cloth.
- 5. Connect leads in this order:-
- (i) RED lead to POSITIVE (+) terminal of FLAT battery, then other end of same lead to POSITIVE (+) terminal of BOOSTER battery.
- (ii) BLACK lead to solid steel or iron component on engine not near the battery, then other end of same lead to NEGATIVE (-) terminal of BOOSTER battery.
- Start engine in normal way.
- Disconnect jumper leads when engine starts following REVERSE order in which connections were made.

PRECAUTIONS

- 8. DO NOT ALLOW POSITIVE (+) LEAD TO THE BATTERY OF AN ALTERNATOR EQUIPPED VEHICLE TO EARTH ON THE VEHICLE AS THIS WILL RESULT IN SEVERE DAMAGE TO THE ELECTRICAL SYSTEM.
- 9. DO NOT CONNECT THE LEADS IN ANY OTHER THAN THAT IN INSTRUCTION 5, AS THIS MAY RESULT IN EXCESSIVE SPARKING WITH CONSEQUENT RISK OF BATTERY EXPLOSION.
- 10. Where absolutely necessary, a 12 volt booster battery can be used to boost a 6 volt starting system, but it is essential that the jumper leads be disconnected immediately the engine starts. REMINDER FOLLOW INSTRUCTIONS CAREFULLY TO AVOID ACCIDENTS.
