Romsey CFA gets a capability boost thanks to the Bendigo Bank

With appreciation to the Lancefield and Romsey Bendigo Bank for a grant received in 2018, the Romsey CFA took possession of a new piece of fire fighting equipment that will greatly enhance our capability.

The ground monitor is a piece of equipment that allows a large volume of water to be quickly delivered to fires, and also helps reduce fire fighter fatigue for events where water is needed over a long period of time.

The ground monitor is ideally suited to structure fires, such as house and shed fires, of which the Romsey Brigade has responded to several over the past few years.



With the ground monitor now purchased, the Romsey CFA members have been busy training with the new equipment over the past month to ensure members can quickly set it up and direct the water where it is needed.

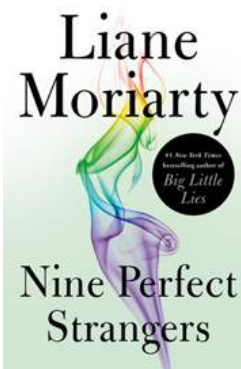

Frances Welty, an aspiring romance novelist, wants to change her life and she believes that Tranquillum House might just be the answer to all her problems. She has

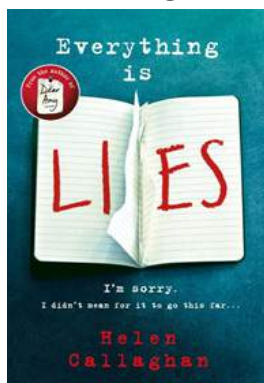
booked a week at the health resort at the

Conductor Required for New Choir

Cobaw Community Health are looking for a conductor to lead a new community choir that they have been given funding to establish. The \$10,000 grant has been awarded to Cobaw by Creativity Australia as part of their With One Voice choir program. The aim of the initiative is to promote social connectedness and inclusion, reduce isolation and improve the health and wellbeing of participants through the benefits of singing.



There are currently 15 With One Voice choirs across Australia with another 7 due to launch in 2019. Neuroscience studies demonstrate that singing makes people happier, healthier, smarter and more creative. With no auditions or singing experience required, Cobaw's With One Voice Central Victoria hopes that it can connect with a broad range of community members and bring them together in song.

With the organisation's strong links to the local community, Carly Visscher, Cobaw's Manager Community Connections, saw the potential opportunities and benefits to local people in the project. Nathan Lange from Creativity Australia said 'We were extremely impressed by the planning and research that went into Cobaw's proposal. They fully understood and aligned with the With One Voice ethos of inclusivity and using singing to bring communities together'.

Applications for the With One Voice Central Victoria Choir Conductor are now being considered and further details can be found on Cobaw's website and on its Facebook, Twitter and LinkedIn pages. The Choir Conductor will work with the choir committee to establish, build and lead the choir. Applications are welcome from school music teachers, band leaders, professional or non-professional musicians. A passion for power of singing together as a group and the desire to nurture a diverse range of singing abilities are a must!

Animal Corner - Gum Disease

After a recent trip to the vets with my cat for her annual check up I discovered two teeth looked "rather ordinary"; in other words covered in plaque with red angry gums. After promptly booking in for a dental, the teeth were thoroughly cleaned however as one tooth was found to be fractured it was removed.

While I ensure I have dry biscuits specifically to help maintain clean teeth, clearly that wasn't enough. There was no nasty smelly breath to indicate any problems and my cat was eating as normal. Hence the importance of regular check-ups at your local vets. Adjacent are more facts highlighted by the Australian Veterinary Association.

There are dental kits that can be used to clean your pets teeth and other products to help prevent gum disease. If you are concerned about your pet or want some more advice please be sure to contact your local vet who will be more than happy to help.

Veterinarian's guide to gum disease in dogs and cats

Facts about gum disease:

According to the Australian and American Veterinary Dental Societies, more than 80% of dogs and 70% of cats develop gum disease by the age of three.

Periodontal disease in pets can often go undetected for years, despite the fact it causes pain and discomfort.

Annual dental check-ups and ongoing dental care can prevent some of the serious side effects of gum disease.

Periodontal disease is the most common disease seen in dogs and cats. It's more common than any other disease including those of the skin, eyes, ears or heart.

Gum disease can lead to infections in the kidney, heart and liver, and even fractured jaws.

Plaque and tartar contain a multitude of bacteria and toxins that can spread to other parts of the body.

Common signs of gum disease include bad breath, inflamed gums, broken teeth and in some cases a reluctance to eat.

And reads a letter many times,
His head upon my knee.

Sometimes I think that he too feels,

Far back to Simpson's run.

Although the author is listed as M. Burkinshaw, this was one of many nom de plumes or literary pseudonyms used by Mabel Forrest (1872-1935). Its actually her former married name. She was known as "the most industrious versifier in the Commonwealth".

In coming years, now that we are able to get more water out onto the course, we should have a greener and cooler golf course and Romsey Park.

Well, the Long-Billed Corellas have been at the park during this summer and have done some damage to a few of the greens but nowhere as bad as over the past 5-6 years. We have also hung a number of reflective items above and around greens. Also, the birds eat the Onion Grass bulbs, it may be that after 5-6 years of harvesting these bulbs there is now not enough food to support the once large (800+) flock of birds we have had in past. Probably a bit of all three.

Origins of Romsey District Names

It may be of interest to some to learn the source of some of the names of the Romsey District.

Clarkefield, Monegetta and Bolinda were all part of the Clarke family run of 137,370 acres, which extended from Fenton Hill to Romsey. The land was purchased by "Big Clarke" and run by his son Sir William Clarke and the property was named Bolinda Vale. Sir Rupert, of the next

generation, subdivided and sold off much of Bolinda Vale between 1905 and 1909 and leased the remaining 5,000 acres

Bolinda Vale – Bullanda was an aboriginal name for "old man" which was later anglicised to Bolinda by the early settlers.

Monegetta – the name Monegetta was derived from the Moonee Jetty run. This 12,800 acre run was owned by Melbourne founding father John Pascoe Fawkner.

Romsey – This name is derived from a town in Somerset in England.

Springfield – The Springfield district was named by the original James Tom, after their farming property near Orange in NSW where the Tom family were early settlers.

Rochford – The Rochford district takes its name from the locality near the mouth of the Thames River in Essex, England although it is uncertain who gave the district its name.

We also don't know the origin of the mysterious convict leg irons found buried in the Rochford soil in the early days of settlement.

Lancefield – The first settlers in Lancefield were Fulton and Jardine who arrived in 1838 and were later joined by their manager Patrick Main. All came from Glasgow, Scotland, the home of the Lancefield shipyards.

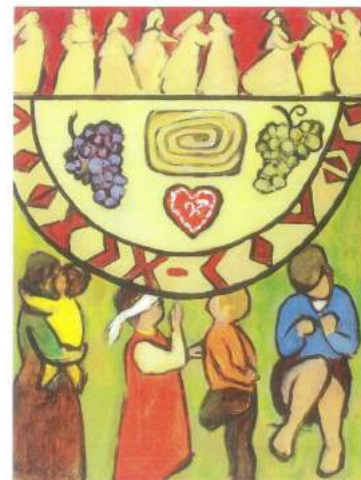

What is Pancake Day?

In the Christian tradition, Pancake Day, also called Pancake Tuesday, Shrove Tuesday, is the last day of feasting before Lent begins on the following day, Ash Wednesday. It is called so due to the custom of eating pancakes on this day, a tradition that comes from a time when any remaining rich foods were eaten on the day before Lent to use them up and fasting begins. It is observed mainly in English-speaking countries, especially Ireland, the United Kingdom, Australia, New Zealand, Canada and the United States, but also in the Philippines and Germany. Pancake Day is a moveable feast whose date is determined by Easter, and it's celebrated exactly 47 days before Easter Sunday. The date can vary from as early as February 3rd to as late as March 9th.

FORTY DAYS

Lent is approaching and we think of JESUS and His forty days of fasting in the desert wilderness, alone, except for the company of wild animals and birds and SATAN. For centuries the Church has encouraged Christians to follow HIS example of fasting, prayer and self-discipline in the forty days leading to Good Friday. Sundays are excepted because they are feast days celebrating His Resurrection. There is so much to ponder and learn from this desert experience of our Lord's so we are limited to a few thoughts. 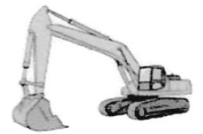

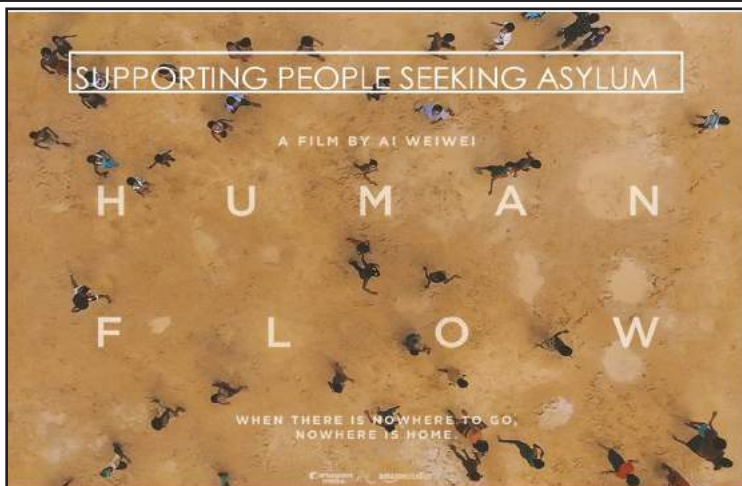
