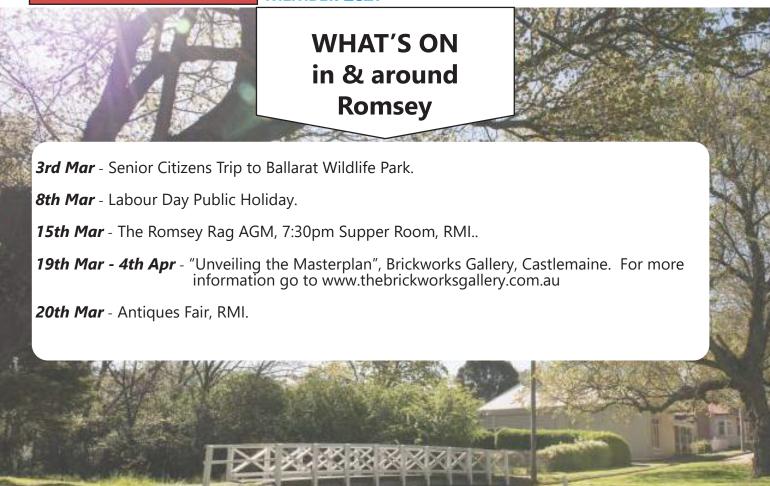

Lets face it, no one likes sore feet. Especially when you want to get out and about in Summer. Thankfully there are things you can do at home to help.

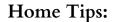
Heel pain

March In Your Garden - Melanie Kinsey

How are your tomatoes doing? For the first time ever, I am finding grubs in my tomatoes! Never had these before. And I spotted a suspicious pin prick that looked not unlike the mark of a fruit fly. I know fruit flies have been discovered in Castlemaine and Harcourt so I promptly covered each bunch of fruit with a fine mesh bag. Hopefully I am wrong and its not fruit fly, although sadly I think they will find their way here eventually. On a happier note my daughter's cucumbers are finally bearing fruit!

In the flower garden my 'Sparkling Burgundy' pineapple lilies have never been so tall or so full – an outstanding display this year! And yet beside them, Penstemon barbatus has not flowered this year – it does not like the rain at all. The inky purple flower heads on my dwarf agapanthus 'Isis' are about the size of a grapefruit and they are so gorgeous! Such a contrast to the cultivar 'Snowflake'! Also looking good is Oenothera 'Whirling Butterflies' (formerly Gaura) their flower stems are up over my head! And the bees just love them.

I took a trip to the Royal Botanic Gardens Victoria in Melbourne before lockdown and enjoyed the newly opened Arid Garden! It was a fascinating landscape with so many things to look at from small planted nooks in the rock walls to enormous tree like euphorbias and cacti. I also took a walk around the adjacent Guilfoyle's volcano planting which was looking amazing too. I had lunch by the lake and was enthralled by the stunning lotus flower display growing alongside the bank. Each enormous pale pink bloom had a pale-yellow boss of stamens surrounding the central flat disc that eventually turns into the seedpod. Quite a gorgeous sight to behold!

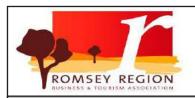

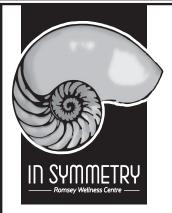

We were incredibly pleased to attend the official opening of the Romsey Men's Shed. Full marks to those involved in bringing this project to completion. Also, the lights at the Romsey roundabout have had their final electrical inspection. Hopefully Powercor will have them switched on by the time you read this.

At a recent meeting, Council resolved to submit on Green Wedge protection and agricultural activities in the Shire's Farming Zone. There appears to be plenty of interest in the Government's plans within a 100 kilometre radius of Melbourne.

For those in the west of the Ward, The Woodend Community Centre Master Plan is out for comment until the 8th March. It is worth a look. Council has also adopted a Community Engagement Policy and Councillor Code of Conduct in line with Government policy. Processes are underway to employ a Chief Executive Officer (CEO). It is hoped the selected person will be 'in the chair' by April. The work of Acting CEO, John Nevins, is very much appreciated.

We will be starting Budget deliberations soon, with many important aspects to consider, including the COVID impact over the past year. Planning permit applications continue to flow in with Riddells Creek prominent. It is pleasing to see the degree of public interest being shown.

Recent damage to public and private property in several locations across the Ward is disturbing. Thanks to those members of the public who report such vandalism to the Shire and Police. Efforts are being made to curtail the damage done (and associated repair costs).

FRIED CABBAGE

1/2 head of cabbage (about 500 g);

1/2 green capsicum;

3 tablespoons butter;

1 clove garlic, crushed;

1/2 teaspoon mustard seeds;

1/4 teaspoon each cayenne, turmeric powder, ground cumin and ground coriander;

2 teaspoons lemon juice.

Remove the worn-out looking outer leaves of the cabbage and the thick centre stem. Cut the rest into fine shreds as if preparing the cabbage for coleslaw. Chop the capsicum into fine pieces.

In a large heavy frying pan over a moderate heat, melt the butter then add the garlic, chopped capsicum and the Cabbage is king! mustard seeds. When the mustard seeds start to pop, add the cabbage and stir. Continue stirring while adding the rest

of the spices. Stir until all the spices are well blended into the cabbage. Cook for 15 to 20 minutes, stirring occasionally to prevent the cabbage from sticking to the bottom of the pan.

When fully cooked, the cabbage will be only half its original size. When cooked, remove from the heat and squeeze the lemon juice over it then serve hot.

Lots of people sneer cabbage, saying amongst other things it smells out the kitchen whilst cooking for days after. I'm not amongst them.

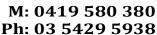

Local residents' experiences during COVID-19 are being harnessed to understand the impact of the many and varied support systems that arose out of the pandemic and use this to inform future responses.

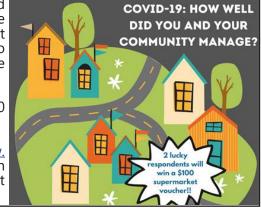
