But the original village is in danger of being swamped by the new development. Can it's character be maintained in the midst of progress? Experience elsewhere indicates that it will take care and commitment to ensure that development - which is inevitable - is carefully monitored.

At present there seems to be little, if any, co-ordination with respect to the layout of the estates or the architecture of new homes.

By the time you read this we will have elected a new look Council. Let us hope that they can take the appropriate lead and guide both developers and settlers along paths that will ensure disciplined progress and an attractive future for Romsey

Now is the time, before it is too late!

Guarding Against Cervical Cancer

The Anti-Cancer Council of Victoria, in conjunction with local Community Health Workers, and local doctors, is launching a new campaign in our region to prevent cervical cancer by encouraging women to have a Pap test. The campaign is commencing August 1st.

Cervical cancer (cancer of the neck of the womb) is one of the most preventable forms of cancer. But every year, Victorian women die from this cancer and many more need extensive treatment. This could be avoided if only every woman had a Pap test regularly.

All women are at risk of cervical cancer. However, cervical cancer rarely occurs in women who have never had sex.

Cervical cancer is no respecter of age - it occurs in both the young and the old. However, women over 40 appear to be at greater risk for two reasons. Firstly, over 70% of invasive cancer occurs in this age group. Secondly, studies have shown that this group of women are less likely to have had regular Pap test than younger women - some will have never had a Pap test at all.

Women put off having a Pap test for many reasons - some don't know about them, others want not to know. Some women think they're too old whilst others feel too embarrassed to ask their doctors. You might recognize these feelings - these are normal but remember, cancer of the cervix is one of the most preventable cancers.

The Pap test is the effective early detection test for cancer of the cervix. It is able to detect early changes in the cervix long before a woman has any signs of a problem. These changes are not cancer but, if left untreated, may lead to cancer.

If abnormal changes that may lead to cancer are seen, effective treatment will lead to cure and also not affect a woman's ability to have children. Women can arrange with their own doctor to have a Pap test. Some women prefer to go to another doctor for this purpose and others prefer a woman doctor. Your doctor understands this.

Special Pap test clinics, particularly for women over the age of 40, are being organised during the campaign period. On August 31st and September 13th from 7-9pm at Kyneton branch of Cobaw Community Health Service.

Don't put off having a Pap test any longer - look after yourself, arrange your Pap Test today - it might just save your life.

NEW DAYS - OLD WAYS. The following is based on an article in Nov. 1982 "Garden Cuttings" with permission from the Editor: At a recent International Horticultural Congress an eminent horticultural scientist referred to the need for educating amateur gardeners in some of the older skills and techniques like collecting and trapping insect pests rather than spraying with poisonous chemicals... Scientists therefore, in their continual quest for knowledge are not unmindful of the elementary skills that have served well past generations of gardeners.

There is an important lesson here for all of us, before we become totally absorbed in new skills or bedazzled by new products. ... Are we forgetting that birds and small reptiles are the best pest exterminators, (their own exterminators permitting - S.W.), and earth worms the best soil improvers ? And do we sometimes forget that Old and rather elementary precaution of giving our deciduous shrubs - and that includes roses - a winter wash ?... We need to know more allelopathic plants as they are called, in other words plants that have an inhibitory effect on unwelcome invaders. It has been suggested that allelopathy may be the "ying" to the "yang" of companion planting, so strongly advocated by the organic brigade.

Perhaps what is needed as well as research into new concepts, is research into some old ideas. It could be, in the long term, more fruitful than the development of more chemicals.
