COUNCIL NEWS:

An application for two strata title brick veneer units in Stawell Str., (near Fire Station) was approved as was a request to use land at the intersection of Crooked Road and Ochiltrees Road for a Strawberry Farm (pick your own). An application to extend Romsey Produce/fuel outlet has been deferred. The applicant has been asked for more details then the matter is to be advertised. A sub-division proposal for land on the south-west corner of Hutchinsons Lane and Tickawarra Road was deferred pending changes to plans submitted.

Currently the garbage collection services 1550 properties. 125 people responded to the big bin survey, 75 for/50 against. Council has opted for the big bin service when the current contract expires (Oct./Nov.?) The R.T.A. has advised they will investigate what speed control devices may be suitable for residential estates in the township. A further \$4,000 is to be spent

DOGS. At virtually every Council meeting the Ranger reports some form of dog attack. This month's report detailed dog v people (Lancefield and Clarkefield) and dog v sheep (Bolinda and Romsey - 1 attack involving 30 sheep 1 with 2 sheep). This made it very hard for us to request leniency for two residents who felt they had been dealt with unjustly by the Ranger. Council re-iterated its policy that NO descretion will be given.

A meeting the V Line reps. to discuss the results of the survey was very promising. A further meeting is to be held in October. V Line has recognised the Shire's need for a between public transport system. After a request from the elderly citz., along with Lancefield Riding reps., we inspected their clubrooms and were unanimous in our decision to construct new clubrooms. The favoured site, at this time, is Council land in Station Str., near the flats. An application for Gov't funding has been submitted. Extensions necessary to bring the current rooms up to required accommodation standards would be too extensive and expensive.

Finally, after discussions with the kindergarten committee, the Shire President will call a Public Meeting at the Mechanics Institute at 8.00 pm on 2.11.88 to receive public comment and form a Committee to oversee the construction and development of a new kindergarten. Please support this meeting, the outcome will effect pre-school education in this town for many years to come.

IN YOUR ROMSEY GARDEN NO. 33:

Garden Pest Control Pt. 3. The following reports of new pest controls have been extracted from "Australian Garden Journal" June 1985 with permission from the editor:

The active ingredient in garlic, ally methyl trisulphide has been synthesized at the University of Minnesota, where research chemists say that it may prove valuable as an insecticide, bactericide and fungicide, as well as being useful in inhibiting blood clotting and possibly lower cholesterol levels. Researchers at the University of Georgia's Coastal Plain Experiment Station have found that citrus oil has tremendous insect killing power. So far it has proved effective against fire ants, flies, fleas and wasps. Although the substance in the oil that kills the insects has not yet been isolated, researchers have identified one of the citrus oil components. It has yet to be determined how strong the oil is in its pure form, how much it will cost to produce and what species of insects are vulnerable. Experiments indicate that citrus oil fumes released from a scratched orange are enough to kill flies.
