LEGAL NOTE

These notes have been prepared by Maureen Wiltshire of the firm of James Kelleher, 75 Main Street, Romsey - Telephone (054) 295 292.

OCCUPIERS LIABILITY - As occupiers of land you should take all reasonable care to ensure the safety of anyone entering your land or your premises. In 1987 a High Court case laid down the circumstances in which occupiers will be held responsible for the injuries to persons entering the occupiers property. This case involved a lady who injured herself when she slipped on the vinyl tiled floor of a large supermarket. It was a rainy day and the floor was wet. The Court found the supermarket company liable as they had a duty of care to avoid risk of injury. The company has this duty regardless of whether the injured person was an employee, customer, visitor, tradesman or even trespasser. The court was saying that all occupiers have a responsibility to persons entering their land, whether they are invited or not.

There is no restriction on the amount of damages that can be awarded. If the person suffers brain damage or other serious injury, the damages awarded against you may be substantial. All occupiers should therefore make sure that their premises are safe. They should also check that their Household Insurance Policy includes an adequate Public Liability cover. If you are in any doubt as to your obligations as an occupier or if you are injured on someone else's land or premises you should consult your solicitor.

Garden Pest Control Pt.6. As one who has had two bowel cancer operations - 1975-6 and 1986 - as well as numerous potential skin cancers (keratoses etc.) removed, this writer likes to keep abreast of research into causes as well as possible preventatives and cures of all forms of cancer, especially those associated with plants.

An article in a recent newspaper entitled "Pesticide Residue Has Low Cancer Risk", which attracted my attention, therefore seemed worth reading and passing on. While space limitations preclude publication of the full article, the following extracts are offered for consideration for what they are worth: "The American Cancer Society and the American Medical Association have validated the carcinogen ranking system — developed by Dr. Bruce Ames from the University of California, who discovered that carcinogens were contained in items such as synthetic clothing, coffee and many fruits andvegetables which had not been subject to applications of pesticides — according to the Agricultural and Veterinary Chemicals Association of Australia's "Farm Chemicals Today'. Dr.Ames said "Vegetables are good for you, yet vegetables make toxic chemicals to keep off insects, so every vegetable is 5% of its weight in toxic chemicals. these are nature's pesticides."
