

HOME BUILDING AND RENOVATIONS: Avoiding Disputes with your Builder: If you are about to sign a building contract there are a number of things to watch out for and a number of sources from which you can obtain advice. There are several types of building contacts available. The House Industry Association, The Master Builders' Association of Victoria and the Law Institute of Victoria and the Royal Institute of Architects produce Building Contracts and many building companies produce contracts of their own. Some of the most important clauses in the Contract to check are:

1. Finance: All Contracts contain a payment schedule setting out when progress payments are due e.g. deposit, frame stage, lock-up stage, etc.

- 2. Cost Adjustment: Check whether the Contract contains a cost adjustment provision and whether it is appropriate. This provision allows a builder to claim price escalations for labour and materials that occur during the construction period.
- 3. Damages for Delay: Check in what circumstances damages for delay will be payable either by the owner or the builder.
- 4. Time Limits: Ensure that the contract specifies a definite time period between council's building approval and the start of construction (the H.I.A. contract provides for 20 days, the L.I.V. contract provides for 14 days) and make sure that the contract specifies a definite completion date. Check that the time limits imposed for complaints about incomplete work are adequate.
- 5. Variations: Any variations to the Contract and the builders' written estimate of the cost of these variations and any verbal discussions or instructions during construction should be put in writing, dated and signed by both parties.
- 6. Defects: Check that the Contract provides an adequate period during which the builder must rectify any defects notified to him or her. Any work exceeding \$3,000.00 which is registered with the Housing Guarantee Fund will be guaranteed by the Fund against the builder for collapse, defects or abandonment of the Contract.

You can obtain information about Building Contracts from a number of sources:

1. The Housing Industry Association produces explanatory notes on the Uniform Building Contract.

2. You can check if the builder is registered by contacting the Housing Guarantee Fund.

3. Department of Consumer Affairs has an early warning list of problem companies.

4. The Law Institute of Victoria produces two booklets which give general advice. Before you sign a Building Contract seek legal advice. Seeking professional advice may prevent a dispute arising.

AROUND YOUR ROMSEY HOME NUMBER 4.

Native Ground Covers. As the "user pays" system of charging for domestic water now coming to favour in many towns and shires will mean higher costs for home gardeners with lawns, the time has come to consider other choices. Mulching with either organic or inorganic material is a favoured method and has advantages in weed control as well as water conservation and may be combined with the use of ground covering plants to their benefit as well as of adjacent trees and shrubs. Suitable ground cover plants requiring minimum watering include many prostrate Grevillea, Myoporum, Dampiera, Junezea, pomifera, Gastrolobium, truncatum, as well as the local prostrate form of Platylobium, formosum and pultenaea peduculata which blooms profusely in Nov - Dec. among our trees and shrubs in parts of our garden, is easily controlled and propogated, is frost and drought resistant and discourages most weeds when established. Others include various Scaeuola species, Viola hederacea, oxylobium tricuspidatum and scleranthus biflorus over rocks.

Snail Traps. To protect snail bait from rain - and possibly pets - pierce holes in centres of tops or bottoms of boot polish tins, fit and solder in place a 100 ml. galvanized nail or similar. Pierce or drill same size hole in centre of plastic or metal bottle tops to slide up and down on nail and hold snail bait. Push into ground leaving enough room for snails to crawl under and reach bait. If cleaned and stored when not in use, these may last 40 years or more as have those of the writer made in the 1940's.

THE ROMSEY RAMBLER:

I have previously written in this column about t he dog problem, noting that every member of my family had been nipped by dogs while cycling around Romsey. A more severe attack moves me to re-open the subject. On Saturday 13th April twop members of the family were cycling near the corner of Kathryn Street and Suzanne Court. A dog from Coleraine Drive, roaming free and unrestrained, made an unprovoked attack biting one of them on the upper leg so severely that they have suffered three weeks of constant pain and regular visits to the Medical Centre. Some independent witnesses to the attack claim that the animal had bitten a child only days earlier. However, the Shire Ranger did not receive any report of the earlier incident. Residents can rest easy in that the offending animal and its owner, have "skipped town". Those who share our outrage that such an attack should occur may find some comfort in the knowledge that the ranger hasd informed his counterpart in the municipality where the dog now resides that it is on a "first and final" warning basis.

A few words then to dog owners - whether they be family pets, or you keep them to guard your property.

1. You should ensure that all fencing is sound enough and high enough to

keep the dogs on their own ground;

2. You should also ensure that pedestrians and cyclists who have legitimate reasons to pass by your property, or come to your letter box can do so without fearing for life or limb;

3. See that your dog has sufficient freedom of movement at home to keep it

sweet-tempered and safe for everyone.

Everyone should report ALL attacks to the ranger. By doing so you may be protecting the next victim especially a small child whose body, or whole life, could be horibly scarred. There are people who complain that the Ranger is too strict in his approach. I can only say that the recent experience in my household suggests that the Ranger has to be strict to protect the community.
