COUNCIL NEWS

An application for a retail wood yard on Lancefield Road, north of Romsey, was granted for a period of 5 years. A 7 lot sub-division north of Romsey town was refused due to an objection from Vic Roads. The applicant is to be advised that a fresh set of plans with suitable adjustments would be considered at a later date. Council has opted to become a member of the Keep Australia Beautiful Council once again. Membership fee is \$100. Works at the Lancefield Swimming Pool will proceed with an \$8000 grant from Council. On Wednesday the 24th July, the Kinder/I.W.C. complex was officially opened by the Shire President. It was interesting to note the total cost of building and associated works (sealing of service road etc) is in the vicinity of \$650,000 of which \$57,000 was a Gov't Grant. Council (the Shire community) paid the rest.

Your Riding Councillors, along with the S.E.C. and John WESLEY-HARVEY of the Shires' Engineering Dep't, recently drove around the town to assess streetlighting needs. A better night could not have been chosen. It was cold, wet and black. More on outcome as information/costings come to hand. have granted the Lions Club consent to set-up their Sunday Market in the Main Street service road(adjacent to school) and Palmer Street on the 25th August. Consent is for this day only with further review. The State Bank has written advising that they will not be installing an A.T.M. facility in Romsey. If you wish to utilize this form of banking then A.T.M.'s are available at their Gisborne and Kilmore branches (fair dinkum !!). Just a reminder that a new glass recycling centre has been constructed in the Rec. Reserve behind the Scout Hall. Also our "Op Shop" is open Thursday (1 - 4pm) and Saturday (9 - 12 midday).

Finally, We would draw to your attention the change in traffic priority in the Romsey Township. The sidestreets now have PRIORITY over the service roads. Please travel slowly in the service roads and be prepared to STOP where necessary. Obey the signs or it may be you that receives the Penalty Notice (\$165 as of 5.8.91).

AROUND YOUR ROMSEY HOME No. 5

Are fences necessary? Like 1983-4, the late summer of early 1991 again produced very little rain and Woodend residents suffered water restrictions for many weeks. Fortunately, residents of Romsey township did not suffer, but with continued development around the town and in other parts of the Shire, this situation is unlikely to last indefinitely.

As demonstrated in media advertisements by the M&MBW, there are many ways of wasting water, and for those seeking an excuse to avoid gardening water restrictions are as good as any. Lack of dividing fences between homes on some new estates are obviously another, as in such areas with no defined boundaries, and hence no deterrent to unwanted intruders, attempts to establish gardens must lead to frustration and despair, and in many cases, excessive use of sprinklers on existing grass and weeds or at most, attempts to establish large areas of lawn which usually require even more water to maintain in dry summers.

As mentioned on occasions in the previous "In Your Romsey Garden" series paling fences have a number of defects such as appearance, and having a relatively short life unless properly constructed with the best material and regularly maintained - a point often causing friction between neighbours. In some locations, depending on soil conditions and exposure to wind, stays may also be necessary, further detracting from the spectacle. Wire fences with rows of well chosen trees and shrubs properly trained and maintained on each side in co-operation with neighbours can have many advantages.
