ROMSEY COUNCIL NEWS : ROMSEY RIDING



A supplementary valuation for the period 1.10.93 to 31.3.94 has been carried out. It included 43 new buildings and 21 new assessments. The 'new' value of privately owned land in the Shire of Romsey is now \$30,176,335.01.

Council, with the assistance of the Kerrie Community, have purchased the Kerrie School for \$70,000. We are still negotiating with the Directorate of School Education for the acquisition of the old Romsey Primary School

Recycling is on again. Collections will be confined to the township areas and all recyclables will be collected on a weekly basis. It is hoped the new contractor will be successful. Residents are asked to support the recycling program to ensure its success.

Residents will have received an regarding options рарег Council/Municipal Restructuring. Council will be debating the matter at its meeting of 6th July. If you are asking "what benefit is there in restructure /amalgamation for me", the answer is probably "very little". Romsey has virtually the lowest rate and lowest debt in the region. Still, Council has basically been directed to go through the processes, so we, the Council, will do our best to ensure that benefit. circumstances, can be obtained.

Asphalt footpaths at the school crossing and Main Street between Robb Drive and Five Mile Creek will be completed in early July. Concern has been expressed to Vic Roads regarding the maintenance re-seal on the Melbourne Road, south of the town, showing stripping/lifting. Vic Roads have accepted full

responsibility for the faulty re-seal and will repair the work later this year or early next year at no cost to the Shire. They were also 'chipped' about removing their signs when so much loose stone was left







Learning Assessment Project



A new way of monitoring progress in primary schools

TARTING next year, the progress of Victoria's primary school students will be assessed statewide for the first time. The Board of Studies has begun to explore how this might be done.

This exploratory work is being done under the title of the Learning Assessment Project. A group of educators has been appointed to assist the Board, and the details of some basic recommendations will be available

These include recommendations on which year-levels will have the statewide assessments.

The Learning Assessment Project is closely related to another major task the Board is doing - the drawing up of a Curriculum and Standards Framework for Victoria. This new framework will guide the development of curriculum in Victorian schools from Prep through to Year 10. As its name suggests, the framework

has two parts - curriculum content and standards of student achievement.

Like the Learning Assessment Project, the Curriculum and Standards Framework will also be introduced in schools next year.

The Learning Assessment Project will provide ways of expanding the assessment methods used in primary schools, and it will assess the progress of students against the standards described in the Curriculum and Standards Framework.

In this way, the Learning Assessment Project will be closely connected to what is taught in our schools. Moreover, the assessment methods which emerge from the project will be woven in with the kinds of assessments teachers already do in classrooms all the time.

It will mean that twice during a child's seven years in primary school, there will be a point at which his or her progress in the statewide curriculum is assessed against statewide standards. This will give the student's parents and teachers a broader guide than is possible at present about his or her progress.

The Learning Assessment Project was launched in April by the Minister for Education, Mr Hayward.

The assessment methods which emerge will be conducted in all Government schools. The Catholic and Independent school sectors will be encouraged to take part.

The Board is at present consulting educators to determine what form of assessment will be used. At this stage it is anticipated that children will be assessed in a variety of ways to establish their levels of literacy and numeracy, their skills in reading and comprehension, and their knowledge in other important areas. It is anticipated the assessment will eventually encompass the eight Key Learning Areas of the curriculum.

The eight Key Learning Areas are: The Arts, English, Health and Physical Education, Languages Other Than English, Mathematics, Science, Studies of Society and Environment, and Technology

The Minister has given the Board of Studies some important guarantees about how the information gained from the Learning Assessment Project will be used. These include guarantees of confidentiality, and an assurance that the assessment data will not be used to make comparisons between individual students, schools or teachers, or in teacher or school principal appraisal. These guarantees are outlined in more detail on page 3.

The project will provide Victorian education with a clear framework for monitoring, improving and reporting on student learning.

The introduction of the project is in keeping with developments in other Australian states and overseas. Significant assessment programs have been introduced or are being considered in all states and territories except

OECD countries such as New Zealand, Hong Kong, Canada, Holland, Sweden, the USA, and the UK have introduced testing and reporting of student achievement at state and in many cases at national level.

How the project will help students

Students will benefit through the information the project gives their teachers and parents. For the first time each student's progress will be measured against statewide standards set down in the Curriculum and Standards Framework. Furthermore, this will be done during their primary school years when it is crucial to know whether they have acquired basic literacy and numeracy.

With the information provided by the project, teachers will be able to ensure that all students are given a proper grounding in Key Learning Areas. They will also be able to give special assistance to students who are having learning difficulties.

How the project will help parents

Parents have a right to accurate information about the progress of their children. They are entitled to know whether children have learning difficulties and what is being done to as-

In addition to the range of information they now receive from schools about their children's progress, parents of primary school children will now be told how their children are performing against the statewide standards set down in the Curriculum and Standards Framework. In short the Curriculum and Standards Framework will advise parents and teachers what students throughout the state are expected to learn at particular stages of schooling, and the Learning Assessment Project will show how well they have learnt it.

Once parents have an accurate assessment of their children's progress they can be more effectively involved in helping their children.

The project will also help validate and give parents increased confidence in the information they already receive from schools about their children's progress.

How the project will help teachers and schools to help students


The project will build on excellent work already being done by teachers at all levels of schooling to assess and report on student achievement. It will give teachers a new source of information about their students and help validate their own assessments.

The project will:

- help teachers identify difficulties experienced by students and develop programs to tackle these dif-
- give teachers a yardstick for measuring their students' strengths and weaknesses against statewide standards at two crucial points of their primary schooling;
- · help teachers prepare teaching programs;
- help teachers prepare students for the transition to secondary school.

It follows from all this that the project will provide schools with a new and valuable source of information to help them develop teaching programs and policies.

The Victorian community will benefit from improvements in primary schooling as the data from the project are used for programs to improve literacy and numeracy and to help students with learning difficulties. •

DOG REGISTRATION

Is your dog registered? If not, then are you aware that by the time your dog reaches the age of 6 months old - it must be registered.

Dog registrations have a common expiry date of 10th April each year - which is the same date as the final date for payment of Council rates in full without incurring an interest penalty.

If your dog has not yet reached the age of 6 months of age - you can still register it if you wish. Registering your dog helps to identify it should it wander away from home and be found by someone elsc. Registered dogs must wear a collar with a registration tag on it.

If you fail to register your dog by the time it is 6 months old then it can be expensive if it is found unregistered - the law provides a fine of \$200.00 for failure to register. However, Council has resolved that, within the Shire of Romsey, where non registration is detected by a Council Officer then a penalty registration fee of \$100.00 will apply and a fine will not be issued PROVIDING the penalty registration fee is paid within the required time.





RAT BAIT POISONING (except QUINTOX)

Rat Poison's affect animals by interfering with the blood clotting mechanism, so it kills rats and mice by causing them to bleed to death. All animals and man can be affected in the same way.

Bleeding, particularly in the gastrointestinal tract occurs in the body on a daily basis, however no signs are seen if However if anticoagulants, Vitamin K antagonists eg. Ratsack is there is an effective clotting mechanism. ingested or the animal suffers from one form or another of haemophilia, bleeding will not be controlled and significant blood loss can occur. when mouth or gut bleeding occurs detection is easy, however if there is a knock to the chest bleeding may occur into the chest and until laboured breathing is observed a bleeding problem will go unnoticed.

Suspect Rat Bait poisoning as a POSSIBILITY when:-

- [1] Lethargy, not eating, pale gums
- [2] Faeces very dark (black) or covered in fresh blood.
- [3] Persistent bleeding from mouth and/or nostrils.
- [4] Prolonged vaginal bleeding in unspayed bitches.
- [5] Laboured breathing.

Dogs are affected more frequently than Cats due to their different eating habits however Cats will eat ratbait if accessed.

Secondary Poisoning ie. eating dead/dying rodents poisoned by ratbait has not been reported. develop immediately after a single intake and may occur days to weeks later. Modern rat poisons have a longer duration of action therefore prolonged treatment is required. If severe blood loss has occurred a blood transfusion may be required together with Vitamin K injections, and sometimes drainage of blood from the chest after effective clotting has been established to allow normal breathing.

It is imperative when placing Ratbait to confine it to locations inaccessible to pets and storage of unused packets kept such that animals and children cannot access.

AROUND YOUR ROMSEY HOME No. 20

Fruit Trees - Winter Pruning. As the pruning of fruit trees and to a lesser extent other trees and shrubs, requires a certain amount of skill which can be acquired only by a considerable amount of observation of tree growth, understanding of principles and practice and hence a fair amount of commitment, it is strongly recommended that home gardeners obtain a good book on the subject or at least, some of the relevant "Agnotes" from the Dept. of Agriculture & Rural Affairs and attend demonstrations whenever possible.

However, to clarify any confusion in the minds of those with little or no gardening experience, it should be pointed out that one of the main objects of pruning is to promote strong growth as soon as possible after planting by severe cutting back of any existing branches of young trees to develop a strong framework growing in the right direction and ultimately capable of carrying satisfactory crops of fruit with little or no damage to the tree. While this may have to be continued for several years, it should be remembered that severe pruning is not conducive to fruit production as most deciduous trees bear on the weaker, more horizontal growths of last year or older which should be thinned out over the ensuing years according to cropping requirements consistent with the production of good quality fruit of reasonable size.

Finally, to obtain maximum results with minimum effort and cost, it should be borne in mind that most fruit trees can each produce hundreds of fruit over a short season when mature and a few well-maintained trees will be more rewarding than a large number of neglected ones, therefore multi-grafted trees will give a greater variety over a longer season with less labour and expense than single-grafted trees of several different varieties sometimes necessary to ensure cross-pollination for satisfactory Windbreaks, mulches, fertilizers and adequate water during growth are other necessary requirements. - Syd Wheller.
