STRAYING STOCK & ROADSIDE GRAZING

SHIRE OF ROMSEY

Stock owners are advised to check all fencing regularly. Increased reports of straying stock are being received by the Shire.

During October, 87 cattle have been reported straying, 48 of which have been impounded and claimed.

Shortage of feed and dry conditions can cause stock to break out of paddocks with seemingly reasonable fencing.

Stock owners who are in need of extra feed may be able to graze road sides in some areas. A permit is required from the Shire Office as the proposed area has to be considered in conjunction with the Roadside Management Plan, the Fire Prevention Plan and road and drainage maintenance. A \$10 fee applies to grazing permits and conditions are applied to the permit holder.

If you wish to graze road reserves please contact the Local Laws Officer, Mr. David Bachelor on 295 201.

DOG REGISTRATION

Is your dog registered? If not, then are you aware that by the time your dog reaches the age of 6 months old - it must be registered.

If your dog has not yet reached the age of 6 months of age - you can still register it if you wish. Registering your dog helps to identify it should it wander away from home and be found by someone else. Registered dogs must wear a collar with a registration tag on it.

Dog registrations have a common expiry date of 10th April each year - which is the same date as the final date for payment of Council rates in full without incurring an interest penalty.

If you fail to register your dog by the time it is 6 months old then it can be expensive if it is found unregistered - the law provides a fine of \$200.00 for failure to register. However, Council has resolved that, within the Shire of Romsey, where non registration is detected by a Council Officer then a penalty registration fee of \$100.00 will apply and a fine will not be issued **PROVIDING** the penalty registration fee is paid within the required time.

Are you looking after a dog for someone else? For your own protection ensure the dog is registered and wearing its collar and tag. Anybody caring for a dog is liable if the dog is not registered or if the dog is found wandering or causing other problems.

Remember - Protect your dog and your pocket - register your dog with the Romsey Shire Council now. Registration forms are available from the Shire Office, Romsey and enquiries should be directed to Council's Ranger; Mr. David Bachelor on (054) 295 201.



HEARTWORM

This mosquito transmitted disease appears to have a low to negligible incidence in the local area, possibly due to the type of mosquito population and dog density.

Dogs that have been born in this area and have not travelled out of the area, at this stage, none have contracted the disease. Where local dogs have had the disease diagnosed they either have visited a heartworm endemic area or have arrived into the area already infected.

If your dog is not on heartworm prevention enquire with your local veterinary surgeon as PREVENTION with this disease is DEFINITELY better than TREATMENT.

PLANT POISONINGS

Spring is the time of the year when most plant poisonings of Domestic Livestock occur-sheep, cattle and horses. It is also the time when these plants are easiest to identify, due to flowering. The most common causes of plant toxicity in this area are-PATTERSON'S CURSE, RAGWORT and BRACKEN FERN, though other toxicities arise if for example horse or cattle graze around old gardens. Many ornamental species of plants are toxic for some or all of the year. With a feed shortage livestock will become less selective and will graze toxic plants more readily.

Young 'leaders' win scholarships

Six young rural Victorians, described as leaders of farming's future, were announced the winners of the 1994 Rural Finance Corporation scholarships last week.

Tony Anderson, Denison, Andrew Callister, Romsey, Andrew Plunkett, Ardmona, Craig Reeves, Bannockburn, Rob Thomson, Condah, and Fiona Warton, Balwyn, were this year's recipients.

Victorian Treasurer Alan Stockdale, who with Agriculture Minister Bill McGrath presented the prizes, described the winners as the leaders of agriculture's future in Victoria.

Mr Stockdale said the RFC awards brought together the major imperatives for Australia's brighter economic future.

"Australia's future is strongly related to capitalising on the world-class capacity of Australian agriculture and education is the key to skilled managers and an adaptive, creative workforce," he said. "Education is an investment in Australian youth who have shown in so many activities that they can take on and beat the best in the rest of the world."

1994 TIDY TOWNS JUDGING REPORT ROMSEY

On Friday 7th October 1994 Keep Australia Beautiful (Victoria) judge Lorraine Edmondson visited Romsey. She was welcomed by Geoff Neil, Shire President Stephen Hendy, Chairman of the Tidy Towns Committee, and Helen Clement, Deputy Chairman. Together they viewed Romsey's achievements in this year's Tidy Towns program.

On entering Romsey, the judge was most impressed with the well cared for gardens and freshly cut lawns showing the resident's pride in their town. The main street is lined with very 90 year old Elm trees which have received tree surgery to preserve their beauty for future generations.

Romsey has a number of notable historic buildings and the community together with the Historic Society conduct working bees to maintain some of the properties. Council has purchased the historic Post Office to preserve the facade and streetscape.

A visit to the Romsey Primary School showed the judge what can be achieved when a school community consisting of Parents, Teachers and Children all work together. The school is only nine months old and yet the gardens and extensive tree planting undertaken would suggest a much older location. The children are very environmentally aware and active in keeping their school litter free. Under the guidance of the Principal, Trevor Turnham, the older pupils created a shadehouse constructed from recycled materials where surplus trees from the Council "Free Tree Day" have been repotted and are maintained for future planting in the school grounds.

Two Grade six pupils read a poem they wrote which reflects their pride in their school. The "Romsey Rag" is a free community publication which is produced at Romsey Primary School and delivered to 1000 homes each month. The "Rag" encompasses environmental issues and every edition carries a major section on the Tidy Towns message.

The principal ongoing project is the Lions Park in Romsey situated adjacent to the Five Mile Creek and is being developed by the Lions Club. The park provides a picnic shelter with tables under leafy trees, barbecue facilities and a large open area and is used extensively by locals and visitors and is the location for the annual "Carols by Candlelight."

Council have developed and master plan and levelled the ground for a future Civic Park which will encompass paths, gardens, a bandstand and mound seating as well as toilet facilities. The park is situated opposite the Primary School and adjacent to the Kindergarten and promises to be a great asset to the town.

A very enthusiastic Committee presented a submission which outlines in some detail the achievements during 1994 and clearly shows that the Tidy Towns Program is being well harnessed to combine Council and community groups in the ongoing development of Romsey.




