CAMPAIGN TO SAVE OUTDOOR SCULPTURE

The Historical Society has been requested by the Macedon Ranges Shire Council to assist in compiling a record of the culturally significant outdoor sculpture and monuments in the former Shire of Romsey. This is part of an Australia wide project, being undertaken in Victoria by The Victorian Centre for the Conservation of Cultural Material (VCCCM), which will create an inventory of outdoor sculptures and monuments as a basis for establishing a maintenance program for these works and for developing public awareness of them.

As well as the more obvious monuments, such as the memorials to those who enlisted in the armed services and historical markers, details are sought about any fountains, horse troughs, murals, mosaics, pavement inlays, or stained glass throughout the district. These objects which are to be found in public spaces provide ways to unlock and experience the past. The project "Save Outdoor Sculpture (Victoria)" aims to document, promote and preserve these important cultural markers to ensure their survival for future generations. The VCCCM is creating an inventory containing such information as location, the artist, date of construction, condition, history and significance to the area.

Historical Society members are collecting information on these local monuments and would greatly appreciate any suggestions or information for inclusion on the list. This material will be discussed at the meeting on 22 August at Seymour Cottage, Romsey, at 8 p.m. and anyone who can help is most welcome to attend.

ROMSEY MEDICAL CLINIC

HAND FOOT AND MOUTH DISEASE

There is currently a minor epidemic of Hand Foot and Mouth Disease in this area. No, this is not some exotic cattle disease, but a mild viral illness which occurs mostly in small children.

The symptoms to look out for are small blisters on the hands and feet (especially

the palms and soles) and mouth ulcers.

Whilst the ulcers may cause some soreness and the blisters may be sore and itchy, the illness is not serious and usually resolves within a few days. Some children may be more severely affected than others.

Paracetamol, calomine lotion and an analgesic mouth gel are all that is usually

required. If you are concerned about your child we will be happy to see you.

EARLY CHILDHOOD IMMUNISATION

Immunisation of babies and children is an effective way of protecting them from a number of serious illnesses. Many diseases that were once major causes of serious illness, lasting disability and even death are now easily preventable.

At our centres we recommend that all babies and small children are immunised

according to the following timetable.

Please do not put off immunisation just because your baby has a cold. Immunisation only needs to be delayed if your child has a high temperature, is on antibiotics or is otherwise very unwell. If you are in doubt about the advisability of immunisation please discuss the matter with your doctor.

DR PATRICIA FOX

We are delighted that Dr Patricia Fox, a senior Cardiologist (heart specialist) from St. Vincent's Hospital, is now consulting fortnightly in Romsey.

Dr Fox trained at Melbourne University and has spent her post-graduate career at St. Vincent's Hospital apart from one year spent in Oxford (England) as a National Heart Foundation Overseas Clinical Fellow.

Her particular interests are coronary angiography (X-rays of the blood vessels of the heart), angioplasty (balloon stretching of narrowed arteries in the heart) and 24 hour monitoring of blood pressure.

She is also very involved in post-graduate and under-graduate teaching and may in the future bring medical students with her from St. Vincent's Hospital.

Amongst her non-clinical interests she includes speaking Italian.

We look forward to a long and happy association with Dr Fox and feel privileged to have a specialist of such calibre visiting our practice.

You may have heard a silly rumour that we have stopped doing house-calls. This is not true.

As we have always done, we offer, and frequently perform, house-calls to those who are too disabled or too ill to come to our medical centres. We also routinely offer regular house-calls to the elderly and infirm.

Nevertheless, we prefer patients to attend the medical centres, if at all possible, where we have a full range of equipment and facilities for dealing with even very serious illnesses.

Reclaiming identity

A recent publication I receive quotes Peter Senge in his book *The Fifth Disciple - Fieldbook* with the following story:

"Among the tribes of northern Natal in South Africa, the most common greeting, equivalent to 'hello' in English, is the expression: Sawu bona. It literally means, 'I see you'. If you are a member of the tribe, you might reply by saying Sikhona, 'I am here'. The order of the exchange is important; until you see me, I do not exist. It's as if, when you see me, you bring me into existence.

This meaning, implicit in the language, is part of the spirit of *ubuntu*, a frame of mind prevalent among native people in Africa below the Sahara. The word *ubuntu*, stems from the folk saying *Umuntu ngumuntu nagabantu*, which, from Zulu, literally translates as; 'A person is a person because of other people'. If you grow up with this perspective, your identity is based upon the fact that you are seen -- that the people around you respect and acknowledge you as a person."

In some ways I believe we also live like this. In a small rural community we have a feeling of belonging, and to be unnoticed gives a very lonely feeling. The restructuring of the Shire has caused some of us to feel that we are unnoticed. The identity that we had because the shire held our name has been lost.

But as we continue to acknowledge each other, to greet each other warmly in the street, this 'lost' identity can be reclaimed, and become even stronger than before. We have our identity because we are Romsey, and that's enough.

Christians believe that 'our identity is based on the fact that we are seen' - that we are seen, respected, acknowledged, loved, forgiven by God. Romsey, too, as a community, is seen by God. That's sufficient for me!



SUPPORT URGENTLY NEEDED FOR AGED PERSONS HOSTEL!!

The huge success of the Caladenia Nursing Home (which is part of the Kilmore Hospital) and its use by such a wide range of district residents, has identified the need for an Aged Persons Hostel to provide independance with medical care for those who are no longer fit to remain in their own homes.

A Federal Government Grant of \$900,000 has been made available to the project, but a sum of at least \$500,000 must be raised by the local community.

The land is already available on the site of the Kilmore Hospital on which to build this much needed facility.

Despite the fact that some 12 Romsey/Lancefield residents have been accommodated in Caladenia in the last 12 months, the Commissioners of the new Shire of Macedon Ranges have declined to provide assistance - claiming that they have the necessary beds existing in the Shire.

The Fund Raising Committee is now asking residents of the old Romsey Shire to assist in raising the necessary local contribution.

The Committee meets on Wednesday nights at the Old Section of the Kilmore Hospital and anyone wishing to attend in order to find out more about this project would be made very welcome.

DEATH WARRANT OUT FOR YELLOW FIRE EXTINGUISHERS.

The CFA is calling on owners of yellow BCF extinguishers to dispose of them immediately because they contain Halon gas which is causing serious damage to the environment.

After December 31st this year the yellow BCF fire extinguisher will be banned and will not be able to be sold, refilled or used.

To emphasise the importance of disposing of these units as quickly as possible, CFA fire stations throughout the State are acting as collection centres for BCF fire extinguishers.

Captain Ron Cole said that the disposal of these units can be a problem and that is why the CFA has undertaken to provide this collection service. The CFA can replace it with a new dry chemical Quell fire extinguisher (red with a white stripe) at minimum cost. Halon gas, together with cholorfluorocarbons is responsible for the depletion of the ozone layer, which provides protection from harmful ultraviolet radiation. 

" THE EXCURSION (February, 1895)

The culmination of a fortnight's joyful expectancy on the part of two or three hundred children in this district (not to speak of nearly the same number of grown people, who artfully concealed their excitement) was a most delightful day spent on the water and at the seaside on Tuesday last. The special train left Lancefield at twenty minutes past seven, bringing with it about 250 passengers, and about 200 more were taken in at Romsey and nearly a hundred at Monegeetta, Bolinda and the Junction. Arrived at Flinders Street a number of the excursionists got off to spend the day in Melbourne, but the large majority went on to Port Melbourne and thence by the Hygoia to Mornington, or Dromano, or Sorrento, according to their respective fancies. Mornington, however, was As we were unfortunately unable to join most generally favored. the excursion ourselves we are unable to describe in detail in what particular ways the folks enjoyed themselves, but we are assured on every side that, exhilirated by deep draughts of pure sea air, and freed from the care (or the monotony) of everyday life, the excursionists were all exceedingly happy - the children gambolling about on the sands like young lambs; the older folks unbending from their accustomed sedateness and assisting the sun with smiles of contentment and appreciation.

The homeward journey was commenced from Mornington at about six o'clock, and Port Melbourne pier was reached at 8. Thence to Lancefield Junction, Bolinda, Monegeetta, North Monegeetta, Romsey and Lancefield was accomplished in the slowest time on record, the train not reaching Romsey until a quarter past eleven. The tediousness of this part of the journey was seriously felt, especially by the children, but the pleasure of the day more than compensated for concomitant inconveniences, amongst which must also be mentioned an over-crowding of the carriages going down. This might easily have been avoided, either by putting on extra carriages or running two trains instead of one.

Mr. F.W. Dawborn, of Rochford, was again the "Thomas Cook and Sons" of the excursion - arranging everything, forgetting nothing. His cheerfulness, too, was perhaps no less instrumental in making the outing a success than his indefatigability, for he had a smile and an encouraging word for everyone, and moved about so quickly as to appear omnipresent."




