

WHICH ONE IS YOUR CHILD?



SCOLIOSIS (curved spine) can be detected by your CHIROPRACTOR

SCOLIOSIS can be defined as a lateral (or sideways) curvature of the spine. Early detection of "curvature of the spine" in children is important to reduce disabling conditions in adulthood.


So we want to spoil you and your family at a Night to Remember. Come along and be pampered for a change.

Osteoporosis is a common disease where the amount of bone mineral in the skeleton reduces so that bones become thin, brittle and prone to fracture. Recent studies in Australia suggest more than one in two women and one in three men will suffer some type of fracture related to osteoporosis in their lifetime. The diagnosis of osteoporosis is relatively easy after a fracture has occurred. Fortunately, diagnosis before a fracture occurs is now possible by special tests of bone strength (or bone density). When indicated, results of these tests can enable you to take steps to help prevent the onset of osteoporosis.

In both men and women, bone mineral loss from the skeleton starts from about the age of 40 to 50 years depending upon skeletal site. In addition, bone loss in women can be rapid immediately after menopause. When the amount of bone mineral falls below a certain level, the risk of fracture increases. That's why most fractures occur later in life. Loss of bone mineral has no effect itself on the body, unless a fracture occurs. Common fractures due to osteoporosis include those of the wrist, hip or pelvis after minor trauma, but almost any bone can be affected. Recent studies have shown that peak bone mass is strongly determined by genetic makeup, but it can also be influenced by lifestyle factors such as the amount of

makeup, but it can also be influenced by lifestyle factors such as the amount of calcium in your diet and exercise. Making sure you have enough calcium in your diet is the best way to maximise your genetic potential. The best sources of calcium are dairy foods.

Physical exercise is important for building and maintaining strong bones. Regular, moderate exercise appears to be beneficial.

Smoking adversely affects your health overall and has been identified as a risk factor for osteoporosis. Importantly, if you give up smoking, it appears that you can recover some bone density.

If you have had an early menopause or a strong family history of osteoporosis, you are at greater risk of osteoporosis, so other preventive measures should be taken, such as hormone therapy. Oestrogen (the female hormone) has been shown to prevent bone loss in women after menopause. Oestrogens are generally used with another female hormone called progestogen. Although hormone therapy is most beneficial immediately after menopause when the most rapid bone loss occurs, it is now also seen to be useful for older women by preventing further bone loss and stabilising bone mass.



HISTORICAL EVENING

Another project being undertaken by the Historical Society is the making of a quilt with the names of district residents embroidered on it. This is to match one made one hundred years ago by the Presbyterian congregation which has the names of residents at that time on it. This quilt is on display at the Court House Museum at Lancefield. The society is now seeking names to be put on the new quilt. The names are recorded in a book, where a little about the people can be written, as well as on the quilt. This will be a valuable record in another hundred years, when perhaps someone will repeat the project! A \$2 donation is asked for each name recorded on the quilt.

Romsey Primary School News May 1996

I was recently asked by a parent new to the school, why we had chosen **Indonesian** as our Language Other than English. With its phonetic base, local support and ease to acquire Indonesian was clearly the preferred Asian language to teach at Romsey. The same view is obviously shared by other schools. Enrolments for the language have jumped by 72% since 1994 and this is reflected in secondary schools with 105 offering the subject in 1995. Already this year 270 teachers have expressed interest in Indonesian Language training. Four of our staff are working on the second year of their tertiary studies in this subject. Next year Indonesian will be taught to all classes throughout the school.

Travelling Science Show: On Monday and Tuesday of last week all of our pupils were able to participate in the experiences provided by the Swinburn Travelling Science Show. Through demonstrations ad hands on activities the children were able to gain a greater insight into electricity and solar power. ""We learnt how to use electricity wisely and how it can be generated. Many different types f batteries are used to store power and some can be re-energised through solar cells. More and more families are using solar energy to boost their hot water supplies."

School Conference reflections: Together with hundreds of other principals I participated, early last week in a conference for Primary Principals and was amazed at the some of the procedures and expectations of students overseas. All year 11 students in Japan are required to design and produce a free standing operational robot. Year 9 students in Singapore are pressing their own CD's as a method of reporting their research. A Victorian Yr 5 student wrote the program which added his assignment to the school's Home Page of the inter net. page, I might add, which is referred to more often than any other school's home page. Via e-mail it is a daily occurrence to collect messages from any where in the world in just seconds. This all reinforces the fact that we are educating our children for jobs which have not yet been invented. Our pupils must be able to think flexibly, to read with comprehension, to be able to estimate and check those calculations electronically and communicate clearly. The walls of classrooms have to expand to allow our pupils to experience, to gain a breadth of knowledge that will form a firm foundation as a launching pad for Opportunities may well tomorrow's opportunities. change but a caring, supportive life at home and at school is still essential. Let's shown them that we care and that we are prepared to listen.

For the very first time a state wide conference which specifically focuses on the **Kindergarten /Early Primary School Years** is to be conducted in Melbourne in August. The aim of the conference is to develop understanding ad direct links between the two institutions in order to better serve the needs of education and young children.


