

### SUCCESSFUL FUNCTIONS

Two recent events proved very successful for the society. The evening held in the Anglican Hall at Romsey produced some very interesting items for discussion. These ranged from delicate porcelain to farming tools, household items, books, maps, seamen's indentures and certificates from the days of sail, badges and medals, and a fossil trilobite millions of years old. All of these had quite a story attached to either the local district or the family concerned. Those present enjoyed the ensuing discussion, as well as the delightful meal and supper provided by the historical society. Also in May a sale of goods at the old Farmers Arms Hotel in Lancefield by Miss Helen Broad, assisted by members of the society, resulted in a substantial donation to the society funds. Many thanks to Helen for her thoughtfulness.

A display of photographs is being prepared to join the "Main Street' collection for the Royal Historical Society of Victoria. Each society has been asked to provide a group of photos of their main street through time, mounted on a display board with some descriptive text. These boards will be sent as a travelling exhibition around the state and possibly interstate. There is a very interesting selection to choose from in the society archives. One photo added recently came from the Railway Historical Society. It is of the Lancefield railway taken in 1954 showing the basic toilets and a hut where the train drivers slept when they were to take the train back to the station at Lancefield Junction (now known as Clarkefield) early the next morning.

### ROMSEY PRIMARY SCHOOL NEWS: JUNE 1996

Parents are the child's first and most important teachers and it is their influence and assistance that schools need to continue to use throughout all stages of formal education. Children use language as they interact with their parents and other people in their They learn the language of the home, how language is used and the attitudes and values that their parents have about language and communication. is no wonder then that some educators have said that children have done the most difficult learning of their lives before they ever come to school. They have done it largely by themselves . Using their own initiatives and exploring, discovering the opportunities that are provided for them. Clearly, learning is innate, natural. Wanting to learn and grow is a basic human characteristic that we all need to Acknowledging this has led teachers into a vital, positive partnership with parents. This too was the reason that we have just released a booklet entitled "Suggestions for Parents - Children and Language Development." This publication, launched during Education week, is specifically designed for parents as they encourage children to become thinkers, problem solvers and independent learners.

Education Week provided yet another opportunity for members of the public to see our school in action and for us to acknowledge the support provided to the school by so many people. During our special assembly last Wednesday morning our School Council President, Mr Stephen Hendy, took the opportunity to make ten year service awards to staff and present framed certificates to members of the public, selected by School Council, who had provided voluntary service to the school over an extended period of time. Heather Turnham received a ten year award as a teacher and Mrs Anne Skinner received a ten year award as a cleaner at the school. Mr Neil Rowley's positive contributions to the school through sport, outdoor education, classroom programs, Educational policy and school Council membership, was recognised with the presentation of a certificate. Although Mrs Meagan Smithies was not able to be at the assembly, she was presented with a certificate of appreciation at the Soiree that evening, for her initiatives taken since 1994 to establish, coach and encourage the children in our growing string group. All these people continue to provide invaluable assistance to the school and its programs and we are greatly indebted to them and the huge number of other parents and staff who support The fourth annual Soiree held at your school. 7.30pm last Wednesday, provided the opportunity for all children learning a musical instrument to perform to an appreciative and proud group of 135 parents. Clarinet, flute, guitar, strings, recorder choir and percussion groups performed, thanks to the assistance of their tutors, Christine, Sue, Danuta, and Meagan. Our thanks are also expressed to Mr Philip Calder, who accompanied the choir. Student Citizenship Awards were presented by the Principal to Alyce Wadden, Michael Blicblau, Tim McNamara, Norman Hocking and Jessica Crofts - for setting a great example to other students. Thanks are also expressed to the staff at the Commonwealth Bank & Kilkenny Real estate for allowing our School displays to stand in the Bank and shop windows throughout Education Week. ### **FERTILISING**

Annuals and Vegetables need to be kept moving with Liquid foliar feeds. Thrive, Phostrogen or Aquasol are excellent products for this purpose.

#### PRUNING

It is too early to start pruning deciduous shrubs and trees such as roses and fruit trees. In cold climates such as ours, not before August.

#### **SPRAYING**

Winter spraying with Kocide (fungicide) should be applied now to fruit trees as a precaution against shot hole and leaf curl.

### BARE ROOTED STOCK

Will become available at the end of the month. This includes many different varieties of fruit trees, roses and ornamentals. A space saving idea may be to purchase a multi-graft fruit tree, where two or more different varieties are grafted onto the same rootstock, which is very useful if cross pollination is required.




