The Road to Sydney - An Olympic Odyssey A local girl's dream realized

On June 8th the Olympic flame arrives from Olympia at Uluru and begins its 100 day journey around this wide great land of ours to Homebush in Sydney's west where the games of the 27th olympiad will be held. During this time the flame will be carried by 10,000 proud Australians to all corners of our island nation.

The flame arrives here in Victoria on July 30th for it's 21 day 3464km trek around the garden state. It will enter the state from South Australia via Mt. Gambier onto Hamilton, Portland, Port Fairy and Warnambool then along the Great Ocean Road to Colac. From there it will leave the coast and head land travelling through Camperdown, Ararat, Stawell, Horsham, St. Arnaud and onto Swan Hill.

It travels down the Murray Valley Highway via Kerang to Echuca then zig zagging its way back down the middle of the state taking in the townships of Shepparton, Bendigo, Maryborough, Casltemaine, Ballarat and Geelong then onto Melbourne where it will do a lap of the MCG carried by Ron Clarke, the same bearer who ran around the MCG back in 1956 and lit the cauldron to begin the games of the 16th Olympiad.

The flame journeys from Melbourne to Tasmania for a tour of the Apple Isle then returns and heads through Gippsland to Bairnsdale. After reaching Bairnsdale it returns via the Princes wy. to Warragul before heading inland again, wending its way via Seymour, Benalla and Wangaratta then heading up over the Alpine ranges to Mt. Hotham.

From there the flame heads back down to Albury/Wodonga where it leaves Victoria on the 14th of August making a brief return to Mildura during the NSW leg of the relay.

The flame will pass closest to our township during the Castlemaine - Ballarat leg during which one of our own citizens will carry the torch. The person with that honour is Colleen Graham, a 6th grade student from Romsey Primary School, Colleen is also a member of the Lancefield/Romsey Little Athletics Centre and can be seen competing with her peers on almost any given Saturday morning during Summer and Autumn. Colleen also competes and is successful in a number of other sports



within the community including Netball, and Football (where she is the only girl in the under 12's team).

To become a torch bearer, Colleen had to initially be nominated. Only 5000 members of the general public were selected from 43,000 nominees nation wide and then met a number of criteria set down by SOCOG. There is also a minimum age requirement, all torch bearers have to be over 12 years of age before the relay begins on the 8th of June, Colleen turns 12 a mere 2 months prior to this commencement date making her one of the youngest torch bearers in the country.

At this stage we are able to tell you that Colleen will be running her leg of the torch relay, a distance of between 500 and 1000 metres on Friday 28th of July in the afternoon at Tylden. We at The Romsey Rag will hopefully be able to give more precise details closer to the time of the run.

We would like to congratulate Colleen on this great honour and wish her all the best on her Olympic odyssey.

Did you Know?

The olympic torch to be carried by

the 10.000 bearers has been designed and tested to stay alight in winds of up to 65kph and in a tropical downpour. It has a built in safety feature whereby it will self extinguish after 10 seconds if left lying on the ground or inverted.

Weighing just over 1kg (the torch for the 1956 Melbourne Olympics weighed in at over 8kg) and a length of 72cm the torch is made up of three layers, the inner layer is made of stainless steel and contains the combustor to keep the flame lit. The middle layer is blue anodised aluminium and will house the fuel cannister containing a mixture of Propane and Butane which environmentally friendly and will allow the flame to burn for approximately 20 minutes. The outer layer is made aluminium with textured finish. A new torch is lit on every leg of the 100 day journey. 10,000 torches in all.

The dangers of children riding on our main roads

It has come to my attention that there are children as young as six riding their pushbikes to school unsupervised and although there has been no reported cases at this time it is only a matter of time before one or more of these children are injured or worse.

During the last week of school in 1999 I almost knocked down a child that swerved out unexpectedly. Parents have to realise that it can be very dangerous for their siblings to be pedalling down a main thoroughfare even supervised. Children at the age of six or seven have very little if any road sense and it has been proven that the vast majority haven't yet developed the peripheral vison that we as adults take for granted.

The Romsey Primary School has repeatedly requested that students below grade 4 not ride to school unsupervised and they do so for the reasons stated above.

We as responsible parents need to heed this request before the community is faced with a tradgedy.



Smooth Start for new school children at Romsey Primary

With fifty-four new students starting school for the first time, it would be expected that there were some anxious moments for a number of families of these bright and enthusiastic youngsters at Romsey Primary School. Despite the damp start to the day with some unseasonable weather, a visitor to these inviting and exciting junior classrooms were greeted with a lot of enthusiastic chatter and a hive of activity as all children quickly settled into the rhythm of school life. We have put together a very comprehensive Kinder to Prep transition program with many school visits, reported Prep teacher Diana Ellis. The effort has certainly paid off with all the children very comfortable in there new surroundings.

Romsey parents with children in all classes will have an opportunity to meet their child's teacher and discuss the individual needs of all students in the coming weeks. During this time learning goals are to be set. "The school strongly values the input from parents and their knowledge of their children's learning needs", said Principal Mr Barney Healy. "We view responsibility for children's education as a partnership between home and school. We are very anxious to maintain a positive relationship with all parents to best meet the learning needs of our students".


Tracy will be taking on a number of oles including the coordination of the school's pupil welfare programs, gifted education and the school library as well as a number of administrative duties.

Focus on Pupil welfare

With a great deal of press coverage on Pupil Welfare issues in the media of late, parents and community members naturally may be keen to know what action is taking place on the local scene.

Romsey Primary School has established a welfare team of teachers to implement a coordinated whole school approach to behaviour management. At the commencement of the year, clear expectations of standards of behaviour are established. It is important that consequences for particular behaviours are clear and consistently applied. A program for



facilitating a positive social climate for all children is established.

While the school works hard on ensuring that a pro-active approach is adopted, children are also taught strategies to deal with unacceptable behaviour in others. This includes having a positive relationship with teachers and other adults in the school so those negative incidents do not go unreported.

Again establishing a team approach between home and school will give all students the confidence they need to feel secure in a safe and caring environment at our school.

COUNCIL NEWS MONEGEETTA WARD COUNCILLOR - Geoff Neil

Welcome to Year 2000.

Council is now back to full strength with the election of Cr. Donna Petrovich (Hanging Rock Ward), replacing Cr. Gilbert Gordon who passed away in September last year. At the December meeting council awarded the local roads maintenance contract to Bencon again. The contract runs for 3 years with a two vear option. Although Bencon were not the lowest tender received. Council felt their proposed methodology was of higher quality, particularly grading, than almost all of the other tenders. The most interesting point of Bencons tender for myself was that they stated they would use the same number of personnel this time to provide the service that 3 years ago Councils then "in house team" stated, in their tender, were required to properly do the job. At the same meeting, Council also adopted its 5 year financial strategy with one significant amendment, that a 'future' Council may amend the road maintenance portion from time to time to allow for more road construction. At the request of the Romsey School Council, the Shire has agreed to provide a disabled parking bay to the north of the main gate/vehicle access point. It will be appropriately signed and I advise that those who park in this bay without the appropriate accreditation will receive a fine for their transgression.

The contract for renovations to the Romsey Mechanics Institute was awarded to Belagna P/L of Deniliquin (Victorian tenderers prices themselves out of the race). Works, to commence shortly, will include facade repairs and enhancements, upgrade of female toilets, internal painting, roof repairs, installation of stormwater drainage system, replacement of main exit stairway, new floor lining in foyer and supper rooms, upgrade of emergency lighting and fire extinguishers and other carpentry and glazing works. The Residential and Industrial Review strategy will be placed on exhibition for six weeks. Notices will be placed in the three local papers advising inspection locations and dates of public meetings to be held in Romsey and Riddells Creek. This is another very significant document which has the capacity to change the shape of our towns. I urge you to take the opportunity to both read it and have input into its final form. Its amazing where snippets of information turn up. On page 17 is a little item regarding reticulated gas supplies to townships with the Shire. It is suggesting that there are two alternatives. The first is the standard Calder Corridor option, i.e. Kyneton to Woodend and Gisborne at No tariff increase, or construction of a gas reticulation scheme to service ALL towns with an INCREASE IN TARIFF rate (undisclosed) spread across the Shire. If ever there was a time in which Romsey, Monegeetta, Bolinda & Lancefield etc ratepayers need to stand up and be counted, assuming like me you want natural gas, this is it.

At the January meeting Council adopted its Open Space Strategy. Copies are on display at all service centres or can be purchased for \$20. This document, which has undergone an extensive public consultation process guides the Council in developing parks along waterway in main towns with improved facilities, settings and access, WITH COMMUNITY AGREEMENT dispose of surplus open space and use the proceeds to acquire land or improve existing open space WITHIN THAT TOWN, amongst other things. Effective immediately, Council has also implemented a parks Improvement Program. This program is divided into three groups with varying \$ amounts allocated for projects within those groups. Maximum grant available to community group or individual will be 50% of the project cost, including the value of donations and in kind support. First one is Central Town Parks where \$5000 per project is available. In Romsey is is the parkland along Five Mile creek including the Lions Park. Second category is cemeteries where either \$1000 is available or \$3000 on a pure \$ for \$ basis and the last category is other parks where assistance of up to \$500 for groups and \$250 for individuals is available. If your are interested in one of these grants, contact Rod Clough on 54 27 8226. Finaly, there is only \$40,000 for Park Improvement Grants - first in best dressed.
