One of our local identities, Marj Pifferer, turns 90 years of age on the 3rd September!





definitely bagus (good).









COUNCIL NEWS - MT WILLIAM WARD

Letter to the GREAT Mt William Ward Community

How has your month been? Mine has again been very full and interesting. There is a common belief I find that the role of Shire Councillor is an arduous and thankless one. This is not my experience. While it is very time consuming (85-95 hours of actual meetings per month seems to be the norm), I do not find this time hard to give, because it is so stimulating and rewarding. I continue to be amazed at the number of talented and dedicated people who generously give their time to munity groups. I am discovering to my delight, that we are an even greater community and that community involvement is much greater than I had realised.

During the election I wrote about people being our greatest resource. Now I want all of us to know how great this community really is. I think we need to work on our 'community self-esteem'. Like individuals, communities which are unaware of their true qualities may find it hard to achieve what they are capable of. so let each other know what you are doing and actively invite people to come to your groups just for a 'look see'. If ten people come, one may stay and nine will know something of your want and appreciate it more.

Swimming Pools and All That

Weekly three hour meetings of the Aquatic Strategy Working Party have been a big commitment and a fascinating process providing a wealth of information. Now comes the hard part of actually deciding the best approach to providing affordable and equitable pool facilities for our communities. All contributors have been most helpful and generous with time and information. In particular, thank you to Lancefield Pool Committee, for their valuable knowledge and experience and the open mindedness they contributed to the discussion.

The Shire Debt

li-you are concerned about Shire debt and don't mind a few figures, hang in there and I will try to communicate my new understandings as simply as possible. If not just skip this bit!

One way to better understand our debt level is by comparisons with other 'similar' municipalities. Generally we are compared to a group of 17 'large rural' councils. In 1997/98 our total debt was 64 % of our annual rate revenue, the seventh lowest of this 17 councils, where the lowest was 32% and the highest was 107%.

Our loans were also restructured in 1998/99, largely to extinguish the 'unfunded superannuation liability' which was a result of amalgamation, and this has resulted in a \$10.4 million debt locked in at approx. 5.9% per annum for 15 years. Annual payments have been reduced in this restructuring by \$170,000 per annum. The increased borrowings brought our total debt to 86% of rate revenue. For 99/2000 our total debt had fallen again to 68%, and it is forecast to fall again in 2000/2001.

This restructuring of our debt is already working well for us. For instance, in March 2000, variable interest rates were up to 7.2% which meant an annual saving of \$135,000 and of \$2 million over 15 years.

The most important measure of a council's level of indebtedness is the percentage of rate revenue which goes to debt payments (principal and interest), with under 10% being generally considered desirable. The figures of debt repayments in relation to rate revenue below tell an interesting story.

Basically, I am satisfied that we have an acceptable level of debt, which is being well managed and is reducing as part of a long term financial strategy.

Of Fairness and Pre-school fences

I mention this again, mainly because the belief that there is some deliberate unfair treatment going on is very bad for that ëcommunity self-esteemi. Both Romsey and Woodend Pre-school's fences have been funded by the Shire to upgrade to regulations My understanding is that Romsey Pre-school also had plans to make some other improvements to the fence and landscaping, for which they had raised funds. The division of contributions from the Shire and the community was negotiated by the council officer and Council accepted recommendation by the shire officer involved, for both Romsey and Woodend. The Woodend fence works involve only upgrading to regulations. This explains the difference in the level of shire funding.

To me, the real question here is not to compare the two pre-schools on this one matter only. Over time a relationship is built up between the shire human services officer and agencies such as pre-schools. I have been informed that these relationships are working well, that people feel listened to and fairly treated by the officer involved. Of course that doesn't mean that they get everything they would like. The officer must juggle many demands on limited funds, not an easy task. In cases the officeris recommendations are what guides council decisions of this nature, and this is what happened here. If the Council is following the advice of skilled and experienced officers. who acknowledged to have good communication with the agencies concerned, where is the deliberate unfairness?

WHAT'S NEW FOR THE GREEN THUMB

The elms are well and truly budding in Main Street and you don't need nursery advice that spring is all but here.

Anyone waiting for the turn of the month will have already missed the jump as they say in the racing world. Bulbs are already in profusion. Even if you gave them a miss in autumn, potted bulbs in flower are readily available.

Hyacinths are scenting the air in the chilly mornings. Those who purchased bare-rooted roses, fruit trees etc are already seeing winter's skeletal shapes burst into life. New season's seedlings are increasingly available while "potted color" - advanced seedlings - are much in demand. With blossom bursting everywhere, next weekend is certainly your last chance to safely spray against all the traditional pest invaders. Remember - spraying is not a task for younger children or even grandfather without proper facial protection. Wait for still conditions also.

Coming from Sunbury to Romsey Garden World has delighted us with Romsey's better rainfall. Nearly 18 inches to the end of July has saved us heaps in water bills and a further "big inch" promised by the weather bureau at time of writing to add to August's 84 points. Somehow metric doesn't taste the same. Really the only water we've had to use for months has been a precautionary anti-frost spray set for a couple of hours before dawn. Usage down from 6,000 litres a day in autumn to less that that for a week. Happy gardening!



Reader's Digest recently commissioned a survey to find which people/institutions and which products/brands Australians trust the most. 'The Church' did not make it into the top ten most trusted people/institutions. In fact, 10% of those surveyed put 'don't trust at all' for the Church.

It's pretty clear that the Church has a PR problem. For many people of my generation, their last contact with the Church would have been Sunday School in the 70's. I must say that I can't blame them for not wanting to be a part of that Church.

'The only certainties in this world are death and taxes.' Yet even taxes change. We are currently going through a major reform of our taxation system. Similarly with the Church. It has changed, and will continue to do so. It mightn't change as rapidly as society (which for some people is a good thing!), but it is trying. Reform is a part of following God. As we learn more about who God is, we try harder to do what God wants, transforming or reforming those parts of our life that need it.

At the time of Jesus, there was a group of men called the Pharisees. They were teachers of the Law, and sought to know everything about the Law that God gave Moses. In this way, they could know about God, and so strive to do what God wanted.

In the Bible, the Pharisees get some bad press. They are ridiculed for getting stuck on the detail of the Law and forgetting about the spirit behind it. They are called hypocrites and blood-suckers.

If we think about the Church, Christians are also striving to know God and do God's will. We sometimes get stuck on the detail, and are called hypocrites.

The true measure of the Church today is not memories of the past, bad experiences or name calling. It is in the lives of Christians, including your family, friends and neighbours. Why not give them a chance to show you what they believe? If you're interested in what you see, why not ask them about what they believe and why?


