#### BANK PROJECT WELL ON TRACK

ank "Community Bank" program is progressing steadily and is well on track.

The community company established to carry out the project, Lancefield & Romsey Community Financial Services Ltd, is steadily working through the maze of fine detail needed to ensure that the project is successful and of lasting benefit to the community.

"Some people may have been wondering what has been happening over the past few months, but let me assure them we certainly haven't gone off the boil," said Bank chairman Brian Russell. "We have made a commitment to open community-owned banking facilities in both Lancefield and Romsey with the support of the residents businesses of both towns, and we are well on the way to achieving this. There is a wealth of fine detail in establishing the community company, liaising a satisfactory

The project to establish community- franchise agreement with Bendigo Bank and owned banking facilities in Lancefield and getting the legal and financial requirements msey through the innovative Bendigo just right, and the Board of Directors - John Chisholm, Maureen Wiltshire, Doug Newham, Colin Smith, John Haslett, Russell Pattinson, Graeme Walker, Tammy White and myself, have been hard at work over the past few months doing exactly that."

> Mr Russell said he expected that the Board would have the bank prospectus - the formal document which sets out the history, background and business plan of the Bank and contains the official share application form - would be issued by the end of October.

> The prospectus is the means by which all the people who made a pledge during the project are able to turn their commitment into shares and provide working capital to establish and run the bank.

> "This vital final stage requires us to convert all our pledges into shares - and if we do that successfully the Bank WILL

open for business within a few months," Mr Russell said. "Converting their pledges into shares ensures that the people of the district truly do become owners of our Community Bank and our future. Our prospectus will also allow for an 'over-subscription' of shares, which will allow people to take out more shares than they had originally pledged for, and provide a last chance for others to be part of the community ownership of our Bank. Extra share capital will generate a stronger and wider base for our Bank, and also furnish us with the base to more quickly realise our aim of providing communityowned banking facilities in Romsey as well," Mr Russell said.





#### **REMEMBERING - Part 2**

#### John Christian MacCullagh 1832 - 1917

John Christian MacCullagh was born on June 6th, 1832 in John's Town, near Dublin, County Kildare, Ireland, and migrated to Australia, in 1863. At the direction of Bishop Charles Perry, Bishop of Melbourne, he came as a Lay-Minister to the Anglican Parish of Lancefield/Romsey and in 1866 became its first Vicar. When he came the Parish was languishing but by 1870, he had established other congregations in the district and overall there were five hundred children attending Sunday School.

The main body of Christ Church Lancefield was built in 1870, but sadly the first service there was the funeral service of his wife of five years, Elizabeth, who died aged 27.

Forty Years Ministry in Bendigo: After Elizabeth's death John went to St Paul's Bendigo, (later the Cathedral) and preached his first sermon there on November 13th 1870. He remained there until his death in 1917. His Ministry covered every aspect of life affecting those who came under his care - whether the need was spiritual, medical (premedicare), maternal, (pre-social welfare), or education (pre-government schools).

He was particularly concerned for the material, educational and spiritual needs of the Chinese community of Bendigo, the descendants of those who had come to Bendigo in the Gold Rush days. John was greatly loved by the people of Bendigo and over nine hundred attended his funeral. He was buried along-side his wife on September 25th, 1917 in the Lancefield Cemetery, the grave he faithfully visited each year on the anniversary of her death, 22nd October. There is one other buried in this grave, John's nephew, who was buried there in 1876, aged eighteen years.

You may learn more of this remarkable man by coming to the special afternoon on Sunday November 26<sup>th</sup> at 2.30pm in Christ Church Lancefield. Pilgrimage to the grave then afternoon tea at Christ Church.

#### ROMSEY-LANCEFIELD CENTENNIAL TRACKING





#### from the Council Chambers



#### COUNCIL NEWS - MT WILLIAM WARD

Hello everyone. I hope you're enjoying the spring and the good rains - and not feeling too pushed by mowing and weeding and all the other activity which seems to speed up at this time of year. I really don't believe another month has come to an end - there's something wrong with the calendar surely! One thing I know had something wrong with it a while ago was my diary. I was all ready to go to the Western Water meeting in Lancefield about the sewerage possibilities on Thursday 12th Oct, when I discovered that the meeting had already been held on the previous Tuesday! Please accept my apologies for this error. I have since spoken with Rob Franklin from Western Water about the meeting and am aware of the issues which were raised. Western Water had already briefed council on two occasions about their projects in the Shire so they are keeping us very well informed. You can be certain that they are taking your concerns very seriously, and that the decision about where a treatment plant would be located if the town is connected to a sewerage system has not been made. The process of community consultation has been restarted because of the new State Government policy, which offers a much better deal in relation to costs to residents. It is good news that the landowners would pay a maximum contribution to capital costs of \$80 per year for 20years (or \$800 up front) plus connection costs, and there is a hardship relief scheme in place. But remember this is only stage one of the consultation. Actual options and their costs will be considered in the next phase of the process. So watch out for the next meeting time and other ways of expressing you view. I will put the next meeting in my diary very carefully!

The roadside management strategy for the Shire is progressing well with a very committed team including shire officers and knowledgeable community members involved. There are a number of goals with the ultimate one being that everyone doing works of any kind on the roadsides will be aware of and follow the management plans for that area. In this way we will ensure that our unique remaining plants and animals will have a better chance of survival. We have basic maps of the significant native vegetation on our roadsides and need to improve these. The aim is work in consultation with landowners, shire and contract workers, CFA, utility companies and community groups to develop clear guidelines for all work on the roadsides. Weed control is a very significant issue and I believe a partnership between landowners and the Shire to be successful. My vision is of weed-free roadsides with flourishing native vegetation providing continuous wildlife corridors between our forests. I also see sections of beautiful well-maintained avenues of introduced deciduous trees near our heritage townships and good firebreaks cleared appropriately of fine fuel. All of this can be achieved with cooperative, well-planned, long-term action. I am very interested to hear from any group of neighbours, which is interested to explore ways to improve their roadsides, through some kind of partnership arrangement with the Shire.

I have been to a number of meetings organised by Shire officers this month, relating to the economic development of the area. These included separate meetings with members of both the Romsey and the Lancefield BATA's (Business and Tourism Associations). In both towns streetscape works are being planned and the particular issues about town amenities for locals and visitors are being planned. New ideas are always welcome so watch this newsletter for information about your local BATA meetings. A lively workshop sponsored by the Community Employment Council addressed the question "What environmentally sustainable projects will generate wealth, employment and enhanced lifestyle for this Shire?" The ideas

generated were numerous and fell into a number of groups such as: developing regional identity, new land-use opportunities, accessible cultural and environmental activities and industry clusters. Industry 'clusters' are groups of businesses in a geographic region which are similar enough to work cooperatively in ways which benefit all members of the cluster. Research has shown that the existence of such industry clusters in a region is very important for excellence in production and economic success. Interestingly, clusters flourish best where people meet each other a lot, through leisure activities such as sport and cultural events. If anyone is interested in knowing more detail of the projects of being involved in further discussions please contact me.

I had a very interesting couple of hours meeting with a dozen Mt William Rd residents one Sunday recently. Thanks to Fran and Frank Williams for organising the gathering with a sausage sizzle at their place. It was excellent to meet a neighbourhood group in this informal way and discuss their day to day issues. I have noted many areas of discussion relating to things like road safety and maintenance, garbage on roads, speed limits, planning permits, roadside weeds and removing fine fuel which I will be following up. I look forward to further meetings of this kind with this and other neighbourhoods.

The Environment Strategy, the Cultural Recreation Strategy and, not least, the Aquatic Facilities Strategy, are all moving along well. I seem to be at a lot of strategy planning meetings these days! It's very interesting and a great way to meet community members involved in these processes and to learn more about a broad range of Shire issues.





Jim says there are two issued: Firstly, there are currently not enough Cherokee volunteers to keep the Shed going. The small number of hard core, trained volunteers we do have is simply not enough to man both the Hesket and the Cherokee Sheds. Secondly, the Hesket-Kerrie district is about to be taken out of service as CFA regulations will not allow tankers of this age to continue in Brigade operations. we all know, Cherokee is one of our prime fire areas, and one in which it is vital to have an active group of trained volunteers, with resources, to fight the fires which inevitably come. We simply can't afford to lose one of our key firefighting bases.

Please - lets get behind the Cherokee Shed, and let's get moving on a new Tanker so that we can be our own best protection in the bushfire season. Come to the community meeting so that we can act.







#### What's News

The Olympics and Paralympics are over, and the cricket season is well under way. Summer is here, and we are winding down for another year, or in some cases winding up for the Christmas and holiday season.

After three or more years of below average rainfall, it's been good to have had a bit of rain, beginning with the 7-8 inches last Boxing Day. If you drive around Victoria and New South Wales, the widespread impact of rain and September warmth is obvious. Everything is green and lush, which probably makes the farmers happier than they have been, but makes firefighters very nervous.

In the last three weeks in September, the NSW CFA responded to around 500 fires. Everything points towards a long and dangerous fire season.

Drought, flood and fire are to a certain degree a part of nature. Without human intervention, they all occur, and life goes on. We strive to minimise their impact because of the way they affect us, putting property and lives at risk.

Nobody wants to see houses destroyed, sestock suffer or people killed in these natural disasters. Yet we need to recognise the power of nature and the order of creation. The flood and drought cycles are necessary in some places for the land to be fruitful. Bushfires can restart the cycle of life for some plants. The movement of the seasons, even night following day, is all a part of life and growth for all living things, including us.

Our calendar is partly artificial and partly a reflection of nature. We mark the cycle of time with festivals and celebrations, but we know that life will continue. By the grace of God, we can go to sleep tonight in the comfort of knowing that morning will come, that life does go on.

another, as we get a little older and the world around us goes through yet another change, let us remember that life does go on. That's the beginning of my faith. What does it mean to you?






