



OUTCOME OF PUBLIC MEETING

Thank you to the 60 local residents, and senior and regional CFA people who attended the very positive and most successful public meeting on Sunday 12 November. It was a terrific turnout and a great show of support for the Cherokee community's fire shed. Very importantly, it also sent a strong message to CFA that we are serious about our firefighting responsibility.

One of the clearest issues to come out of the meeting is that local knowledge is the vital element in fighting a fire in our area. To that end, we need more trained firefighters so that we have an initial response team and a relief crew for the present firetruck and also for a second truck to replace the old tanker which has now been taken out of service.

The practical outcome of the meeting was that 7 volunteers and 1 auxiliary member signed up, and several of the new volunteers have begun training.

IN ORDER TO HAVE TWO READY CREWS, AND STRENGTHEN OUR APPLICATION FOR A REPLACEMENT FIRETRUCKWESTILLNEED ANOTHER 5 OR MORE VOLUNTEERS.

Some minimum training is require, to crew the trucks, and this involves approximately 3-4 training sessions and 4 attendances at the fire shed per year.



They are moving to Mansfield parish.



STOP PRESS


CONSTRUCTION OF SECTION 1 OF THE TRACK HAS COMMENCED

Work has started on the Romsey end and approximately 400m will be constructed to granitic sand stage. Lancefield end will be started soon after and is in the region of 500m.

Macedon Ranges Shire will construct the track for us (we will pay them) and sections will be completed as and when we have the funds - through applying for grants and residents purchasing a metre of track for \$20.00

The entire track will be completed to granitic sand stage then sealed where appropriate.


The official opening (in accordance with the conditions of the Federation Fund Project Grant we received of \$30,000) will be held on Australia Day - we do not have a confirmed time yet, but plan two opening ceremonies - one at the Romsey end and one at the Lancefield end - then all meet in the

Welcome to the December issue of Your Health.



COUNCIL NEWS - MT WILLIAM WARD

Letter to the Mt William Ward Community

Hello everyone. The rains continue! Was it the wettest November in living memory? Perhaps it's getting to be a little too much, at least for some crops, such as grapes. I hope it's turning out to be a good season for our primary producers - and all the home vegetable growers too.

Lancefield Waste Water Treatment

I joined a group of Macedon Ranges councillors and officers at Western Water re ly to spend a morning discussing th, ancefield sewerage issue. It was excellent meeting, demonstrated to me yet again what a thorough and professional job Western Water are doing with this. Every issue that was discussed in depth and the concerns of residents, expressed either through us or directly to Western Water during the recent meetings, were taken very seriously. I am impressed by the efforts of Western Water to genuinely consult the people of Lancefield in order to meet their needs with the least disruption and cost.

Aquatic Facilities Strategy

I will have a go at covering the main points only here. I hope that anyone wants to know more will pick up a cyry of the draft strategy from one of the Shire offices or read the Shire page in the local newspapers.

The draft document has been released and the working party is very pleased by the favourable response from the members of various community groups who have a particular interest in pools. All these groups have also contributed greatly to the working party's discussions, which we appreciate and value very much. It is very pleasing that all councillors supported the adoption of the strategy.

This is an aquatic strategy for the whole shire, with the goal of providing a work of modern, affordable indoor a wide provide for a wide range of community needs. How fast we can do

this depends of course on the availability of funds, in particular a grant from the Better Pools funding scheme (Dept. Sport and Recreation Victoria). With such a grant and effective community fundraising, the rest of the costs could be met without significant change to the Shire's 5-year financial strategy.

The plan is to bring Lancefield and Woodend pools up to today's standards in order to provide excellent outdoor summer swimming for at least another 15 years. Gisborne and Kyneton pools need replacing with indoor pools, as they have been shown by the technical audit to have at most 2-3 years of life left, without very major expenditure. We hope to apply for and receive funding to build both of these pools concurrently (over a 2-3 year period) and also to do the first stage of upgrading Lancefield and Woodend pools. Funding would later be applied for to build an indoor pool at Romsey and improvements at Lancefield and Woodend. All investigations and consultations over the last few years have shown that the community would not accept the closure of swimming pools and that building new outdoor pools is a waste of money. Also our current outdoor pools cost \$40,000 each to run for only 12 weeks of swimming. Financial modelling indicates that a new, indoor, programmed pool could be run for less than this all year round.

So what is a PROGRAMMED POOL?

Programming means making the pool available to different user groups at different times. Groups hiring the pool, such as swimming clubs or schools, would provide their own supervision. Only one Shire staff member would be on duty at those times. General public swimming time needs the most staff on duty and would be compressed into about seven hours per day (eg, 1pm -8pm). This has an enormous effect on the costs. So much so, that with clever marketing, it's even possible for a programmed pool in a rural area to make money.

To me, the programmed pool concept is the most exciting idea resulting from


the working party process. Having established the key goals of shire-wide equity and access and affordability, it became clear that one pool was not the answer. To build two, and eventually three indoor pools, meant we needed a lower capital cost AND much lower operating costs. Capital costs can be reduced by simplifying the design. For operating costs staffing is the major factor, as most other costs are for essentials items. So programming the pool is the new management idea that makes it possible to envisage building three indoor pools in our Shire. Department of Sport and Recreation representatives have attended most of our working party meetings and therefore understand how programming would work, and why it is an important part of our shire-wide strategy. We can only hope that this will lead to a favourable outcome of our grant application to the Better Pools fund. Whether it does or not, I believe that we are in a far better position than ever before in relation to aquatic facilities. We know exactly where we stand regarding the condition of our pools and we have a clear direction for the provision of appropriate facilities for our whole shire in an affordable way. With a clear intention and unity I am sure we will achieve our goals.


