WHAT'S MISSING???

Give you a hint - travel north through msey - go over Five Mile Creek and look to your left. It's like a smile with a missing tooth. A row of terrace houses with a vacant block in the middle. No its Romsey's magnificent avenue of trees with one GONE!

A naughty fallen limb did cause power problems for us all but within 24 hours we didn't just have a tidied up limb, Romsey's avenue was minus a whole mature tree. The Romsey Rag team felt this needed further investigation. We had many questions. How did a major work happen so quickly in Romsey? Who authorised it? What are the processes? Do people get notified?

Naturally many calls to the Macedon Shire Council turned a couple of uestions into a saga but we are glad to report a professional response came from Mr Rick Keen who as part of the Contract Management Unit of the Council initiated the sending of a The Romsey Rag April 2000



contracted Arborist to tidy up the problematic limb. The Arborist identified that the tree was suffering with a fungal disease and not safe. The decision was made to remove the tree for safety reasons and in the winter replant with a new tree. Mr Keen has procedures of notification he follows in various circumstances but as this tree was considered unsafe to the public it was acted on immediately. To clear up

any other fears about our beautiful treed avenue, most particularly the Elms, the next edition of the Romsey Rag will publish snippets from the Council's 'think tank' looking into the discovery of the Elm Leaf beetle in our region. The missing tree was not cut down due to the Elm Leaf beetle. We hope this little investigation alleviates any questions residents have.

= Primary School News School Carnival an Explosive Hit!

All the fun of the fair came to Romsey Primary School on Friday 24th March. There was tremendous excitement as the school bell rang with a feast of attractions available for children of all ages. ROMSEY-LANCEFIELD CENTENNIAL TRACK Inc.

We held a very busy meeting on Monday, 20th March, at the Romsey Shire Office. Applications for grants have been lodged with the Victorian Federation Grants Scheme and the Minor Facilities Funding through the Macedon Ranges Shire and we should know if we have been successful with those later in the year. We have also lodged an expression of interest with the Queen's Trust for Young Australians.

Around 2,500 letters have been sent out to all ratepayers in the Romsey-Lancefield district inviting them to purchase a metre of track (or two or three!) for \$20.

We have received part of the Federal Government Centennial Grant of \$27,000 (balance of \$3,000 will be paid on completion of a progress report due in February, 2001) giving us a total contributions in cash and kind to date of \$31,136.30. We still have a long way to go to reach the estimate of \$150,000 but we are confident that we can do it with your help!

Please be assured that if the project is not totally funded, all donations will be entirely refunded.

Our next fundraiser is a Luncheon to be held at the Romsey Hotel on Wednesday, 12th April, with Dr. Jeff Brownrigg our Guest Speaker. Dr. Brownrigg is the Director of the Peoples Choice Project promoting the Centenary of Federation and is currently touring Australia lecturing on life as it was back in 1901. He is reportedly not to be missed! Tickets are \$15 each which includes admission, a two course lunch and coffee. ROMSEY-LANCEFIELD AMBULANCE AUXILIARY

At our August meeting last year, Mr. Rob Knowles - Minister for Health and Aged Care, announced that the funding for an ambulance station in Romsey was in place and would be well on its way by June, 2000. Mr. Knowles was well and truly questioned as to the fact that this was just an election stunt as, although an election had not been called, rumour was in the air. He emphatically denied that this was the case and stated that even if there was a change of government we would get our station! We were all over the moon that this was now going to happen after

3-1/2 years hard work on the part of Ambulance Victoria and ourselves.

Then the government did change - we heard nothing - so late last month made enquiries only to find out that Ambulance Victoria had just been requested to do yet another feasibility

study! We immediately held a meeting with Joanne Duncan over in Gisborne and our President, Cr. Geoff Neil, Mr. Doug Kimberley, CEO Ambulance Victoria and two of his Department Heads and myself attended. Ms. Duncan was very sympathetic - of course - and would make enquiries to the Health Department and in Parliament on our behalf. I think she got the message that we were not too happy about the whole situation!

We have now received a letter dated 7th March from her and I quote...

"I have received correspondence from the Hon. John Thwaites, Minister for Health.... At this stage it appears that no funding has been allocated for a new station at Romsey. Opportunities for extending the Governments policy platform to expand ambulance resources will be considered once the Service Delivery Plan has been prepared, which is due for release after mid 2000. I have met with Mr. Thwaites over this issue and I am mindful that the people of Romsey have worked hard for this. I continue to lobby the Government over this issue and will continue to work at achieving a new station at Romsey. We have also put in a submission for consideration in the May budget."

That's about all Ms. Duncan can do at this stage and we will not let up in our fight - and that is what it has now evidently turned into - to get our station!

Just a pity politicians can't be recalled and made accountable for their actions!

HELPFULHINTS

HINTS FOR APRIL:

The inside bladder of a wine cask can be used as a cushion/back support with as little or as much air blown in as required through the one way tap. Great to keep in the car. Let down when not needed.

Need space in the kitchen cupboal Screw hooks into a piece of wood which can be secured across the ceiling of your cupboard, great for hanging cups and mugs.

Recycling idea - A Great job for the older kids to prepare for our cold winters - Making Newspaper Logs

Boil 2 or 3 litres water and add washing soda. When it has dissolved, add newspapers and boil for 10 minutes, stirring and prodding with a stick. When cool, mould into tightly squeezed balls and allow to dry thoroughly. Start your fire as normal then add a 'log' or two. They should burn for an hour.

THE LATEST NEWS FROM EUROPE

The ROMSEY RAG has received this bulletin fresh from our Brussels based European union hack. 

from the Council Chambers = COUNCIL NEWS-MONEGEETTA WARD

Results of the Council election on Saturday 18th are as follows - Barringo Ward, Clemence Gillings - Black Forest Ward, John Connor - Bullengarook Ward, Deb Dunn - Campaspe Ward, Greg McIntyre - Hanging Rock Ward, Donna Petrovich - Jacksons Creek Ward, John Letchford - Monegeetta Ward, Geoff Neil - Mt William Ward, Alice Aird and Pastoria Ward, Noel Harvey.

Council now comprises 5 males and 4 females with four of the previous councillors returned (5 if you count Donna Petrovich who was elected 3 months ago to fill the vacancy left by the former Cr Gilbert Gordon - deceased).

Works have begun on the footpath in Main Road, Riddells Creek. I am aware that access to shops etc at the moment is difficult and causes inconvenience, particularly to the elderly, but I again ask for residents to be patient. Good weather will ensure the works are completed in quick time. We have been notified of Federal Gov't Black Spot funding for the next financial year to

seal the shoulders of the Melbourne-Lancefield Road between Monegeetta intersection and Bolinda Bridge (\$450.000) and intersection improvements (splitter islands) at Barry Street/Main Street intersection at Romsey (\$20,000). Whilst the shoulder sealing works are in progress, I have requested that Council staff look at including turning lanes at all intersections along this stretch of road to improve safety. Residents will note that turning lanes have recently been completed at the Mullalys Road intersection (outside Bolinda School). Works at the Barry/Main Street intersections will be to enhance the visibility of the intersection to motorists travelling along Barry Street and put an end to the collisions and near misses that occur.

Rectification works on the Main Street of Romsey, through the town centre, due to the road surface breaking up are hoped to be completed by the end of this financial year. This will include making the pedestrian refuges a permanent structure. Due to feedback received, a reduction in refuges from three to two (deleting the northern most one) may occur. This will enhance parking along the main traffic lanes for larger vehicles. Also Dalys bridge construction is due to commence in May with at least one weekend road closure (Wallan Road - end of May/start of June) programmed. We are also working towards the replacement of the Forbes Road Bridge by the end of June. After some contractual difficulties, work on the Romsey Mechanics Institute rejuvenation is due to start by mid April.

Finally, just a short note to remind residents that I am available to them virtually 24 hours a day. Ring to number below and if I don't answe please leave your name and phone number on the machine. You are assured of an early response.






