ROMSEY BANK - TALK TO US

Things will be really happening in the town over the next few months as we push ahead with the project to open and rester our own Romsey Community Bank Branch. Residents will see street signs, a big thermometer charting our ress, a mailout of information and Saturday morning street stalls as the members of the Romsey Steering Committee work towards achieving our aim.

But the best way of finding out what our Community Bank is all about, where we're at in terms of progress and how we go about getting our Bank up and running is to talk to someone who knows what's going on - a member of the Steering Committee. The Steering Committee is chaired by Romsey solicitor Maureen Wiltshire. Other local members are retired school principal Trevor Turnham, earthmoving contractor Doug Newnham, butcher Peter O'Rourke, estate agent John Woodham, management consultant and vigneron Bruce Knight and barristers' clerk Ric Howells. Also on the Committee are Lancefield publican John Chisholm and journalist Graeme Walker.

Mrs Wiltshire, Mr Newnham, Mr Chisholm and Mr Walker are on the Board of Lancefield & Romsey Community Financial Services Ltd, the community-owned company which already runs the Lancefield Community Bank Branch.

"If people want to know where we're at with the project to establish our Bank - come and talk to us," Mrs Wiltshire said. "People will see us around the streets of Romsey on a regular basis, and we will be a regular fixture in the shopping centre on Saturday mornings."

e first step required by Bendigo Bank in establishing a Community Bank Branch is to generate pledges, which show amount of funds residents will be willing to invest as share capital in our Bank. Our Romsey Community Bank Branch needs \$400,000 in pledges before we take the next step, and I urge people to talk to us, read the documentation and pledge to support our Bank project."

Pledge boxes and forms are located at the butchers, newsagency, bakery. IGA supermarket and southside service station. In Lancefield, there's a box at the Community Bank at 20B High St.

"The community working together to own, operate and use the services of our own Bank will ensure we are in full control of our own financial future," Mrs Wiltshire said. "Owning our own Bank will 'waterproof' Romsey against ever being a town without a Bank - as had happened to Lancefield before the community there pulled together to open a Community Bank Branch of Bendigo Bank a year ago. Our future is in our hands, through Bendigo Bank's innovative Community Bank concept.

"Unlike the other financial institutions, Bendigo Bank is in a growth phase, opening new Banks around Australia when others are closing branches. Romsey can and should be part of this," Mrs Wiltshire said.

The Golfer's Handicap

Did you hear about the blind golfer with a very low handicap? He challenged a touring professional to a game. The professional hesitated, not really wanting to take advantage of a player with such an obvious disability. But the blind challenger insisted. "I don't mind at all," he said. "Let's have a game anyway. At nine o'clock tonight."

Disability is certainly about people in wheelchairs but it is also about disabilities you cannot see. Disability is about old people, young people and everyone in between. Top Olympic athletes become disabled through injury. Parents with small children in pushers have toruble with steps and heavy doors.

People with disabilities are not necessarily better of worse than anyone else. There are saints and sinners among them, the same as you would find anywhere. People with disabilities themselves have a whole range of attitudes to disability. There are differences in attudes between those who were born with a disability and those who become disabled through, say, an illness or a car accident. Few regard themselves as undergoing heroic struggles against overwhelming odds. Most have an attitude of simply getting on with life.

A Rural Access project runs in all rural shires in Victoria. In Central Victoria it covers the shires of Macedon ranges, Mount Alexander and Central Goldfields. The project is about including people with disabilities in the community, and information is an important part of that.

Once a month I will send a short item about disability. We will discuss things like access, attitudes, numbers, and some mistaken beliefs, and some local services. I'm very happy to respond to queries or talk to you. You can contact me by leaving a message at the local shire office, or through SMS to 0409 253 236, or via e-mail to ruralacc@netcon.net.au

We will never know whether the professional golfer ever took up the offer. It's hard to imagine him enjoying it. He might lose a hundred balls and fall into 20 bunkers. But we can imagine him at the 19th hole, enjoying a drink with his blind companion, and realising that there isn't a lot people with disabilities cannot do. Acces is the key!

Football Team Success



Kyneton hospital launches major appeal to give community touch to new building

Kyneton's largest community building project in history has put down its footprint at the town entrance, with works on schedule and on budget for the opening of a new hospital and aged care centre early next year. And what a year 2003 is set to be, with the hospital celebrating 150 years of continuous service to the communities around Kyneton, Woodend, Lancefield, Romsey, Macedon, Gisborne and Tylden.

Hospital board president Judith Hedstrom said that, with the new \$14 million building taking shape, attention was now focused on a major fundraising appeal among district communities and business leaders to give the new hospital its local touch.

"As with all major infrastructure projects such as this, it is the final touches that become the hallmarks of community support," Ms Hedstrom said. The community effort will distinguish this building as coming from this community and will cover a myriad of personal touches, from new curtains and cushions to the community spaces that will make this hospital a vibrant centre for good health and well being."

Ms Hedstrom said that the hospital board had appointed Kyneton funeral director and good health advocate John Scott to head up its fundraising team.

"Over the next few months, John Scott and his team will be contacting philanthropic trusts and other major donors, as well as offering ways individuals can lend their support to this exciting new era in health services for our communities," Ms Hedstrom said. "This new hospital is going to set the standard for health services for the next century and more."

Ms Hedstrom said the new building was a dream come true for members of the hospital board, who had worked long and hard to bring it to reality despite many setbacks.

"Firstly, we fought and won the right to keep a hospital in Kyneton," she said. "Then we fought and won the right to extend the Thomas Hogan wing so that we can offer a viable and realistic service to the increasing numbers of frail, aged people in our communities."

"With a new building on the horizon, plus a viable 30-bed aged care centre, hospital reserves have been stretched to the max and now it is time for our communities to back the efforts we have made on their behalf."

Ms Hedstrom said the hospital board was hoping to raise around half a million dollars from its community fundraising appeal, which will kick off in earnest in September.

"We have engaged fundraising specialist Keith Martin, who has worked with several major regional hospitals in recent times on their community campaigns, many of which have required a significantly greater contribution than we are asking of our communities. Mr Martin will work with John Scott and his team to help us with this critical stage in the lead-up to our opening next year."



Q Fever is an acute illness with flu-like symptoms and occasional long-term complications. Those most at risk are shearers, dairy and livestock workers. The Department of Human Services has recently launched a program to vaccinate high risk occupational groups.

Q Fever is transmitted by contact with contaminated animal faeces, urine, milk, blood and products of conception, or by inhalation of dust from a contaminated premises such as an abattoir, etc.

To be vaccinated against Q Fever you are required to have a skin and blood test to determine your immune levels prior to being vaccinated and then, if necessary, receive the vaccine one week after the initial test. Therefore it is necessary for you to attend **both sessions** (which are free to farmers and shearers) listed below to ensure you are vaccinated.

If you or a family member are in any of the above categories of risk and require further information please do not hesitate to contact the Central Highlands Division of General Practice on 5428 4848 or talk to your local GP.

- Guidelines in place for managing asthma on school camps and excursions

By adopting the Asthma Friendly Schools Project our school is not only helping those students with asthma, but will also minimise the impact of asthma on our school community. Asthma Victoria recently conducted an information session at the Centrevic, Lancefield, for local school personnel and later in the evening, for interested community members. Both sessions were very well attended, and some important issues and points were raised and emphasised:

- **People do not "grow out of asthma".** Once a person has had an asthma attack, there is always the potential for further attacks.
- Schools, under the policy set down by the Department of Education and Training, must have an asthma management plan on record for each child in the school who has asthma. This needs to be reviewed regularly by the child's doctor.
- Children with asthma need to have their medication with them at all times, including when they are at school.
- All school staff need to be trained in emergency asthma management, and schools must be equipped with approved medication and equipment.

HOW TO ENJOY THE MITCHELL LIBRARY WEBSITE #5

Well, how did you enjoy exploring the Pandora's box of goodies to be found in the Gulliver Website? This time we are going to explore the remaining area of Gulliver – the <u>Health and Wellness</u> website

So, leg ropes on and here we go again. Starting with the Mitchell Library Service home page, click on Gulliver, then Health and Wellness and then proceed.

There are a couple of different ways to access the information that you require from this database depending on how much information you already know or how much information you are after.

Basically you have 2 options -

1. If you already know what you are researching then type in the topic that you want information about in the SEARCH FOR: box at the top of the page and hit SEARCH. You will notice that you are given the option to limit your search to full text articles and/or referred publications and dates. For instance if I type in fibromyalgia and limit the search to full text... then 7 items come up under Reference, 258 pop up under Magazines & Journals and 5 books about the topic appear under Resources.



in

All of these I can explore further and mark them so that the information they contain can either be printed off, emailed to an email address or saved to disk.

There are helpful see also subjects printed down the left-hand side of any articles that offer even more information.

2. The other option, if you are not too sure what you want or just want a basic level of information, is to live dangerously and go exploring in the Quick Start areas. Click on an area and follow through eq:

<u>Medical Encyclopaedia</u> – Hit f for fibromyalgia and scroll down until you come to it. Click to open it up and you will find an extract from the Gale Encyclopaedia of Medicine about this condition.

Once again there is the choice of saving, emailing or printing what you have read.

<u>Drug & Herb Finder</u> - does just that – type in what you are after and up comes the information both mainstream and alternative. Some even come with a photo.

<u>Health Assessment</u> – offers you other websites to access and enhance your own health and well-being.

<u>Health Organisations Directory</u> – unfortunately this is limited to organisations the USA and so has limited use here in Australia

Medical Dictionary - gives you a definition for the term that you requested. Short and succinct.

<u>Health News</u> – Recent up-to-date newspaper articles from around the world cover an amazing array of medical subjects. They are listed in most recent chronological order rather than subjects.

<u>Alternative Health Encyclopaedia</u> – Information about various conditions presented from an alternative point of view.

<u>Links to other Sites</u> – provides links to other sites offering further information on health related topics.

As you can see this website could be somewhat overwhelming with the amount of current, relevant information that it provides. However it is an excellent

source for authoritative information about any medical subject and you can extract as much or as little data as you require.

I wonder if it's possible for humans to truly trust one another to be fair.

Consider firstly the World Cup. There were a number of players who 'took a dive' to try to get a free kick or penalty. And this has begun to enter AFL, as was freely admitted at the tribunal last month. As one commentator said, the only word for this type of play-acting is cheating.

Consider the public liability insurance crisis. This form of insurance is primarily intended to cover 'accidents'. However, insurance holders are being held ransom by unscrupulous operators who aren't interested in safety, as well as people interested in making a quick and easy dollar (or thousand).

Consider industrial relations, and the on-going parliamentary debate. Unfair dismissal laws exist to protect employees from unscrupulous employers. The so-called 'Fair Dismissal' legislation is intended to protect small business owners from unscrupulous employees. In both cases, the fear is that the provisions are be or will be abused by those looking for loopholes.

In each case, fairness and justice appear to be lacking, whilst suspicion and exploitation prevail.

So, what can we do about it? If we try to do the right thing, then we are just as likely to be taken advantage of by those who are only interested in themselves. And that is the root cause.

"For the love of money is a root of all kinds of evil," says the Bible (I Timothy 6:10). In other words, greed and self-ishness is at the heart of our distrust and injustice. In order to truly trust one another and work for a fair and just world, we need to think about others. Can we do that? Advertisers are constantly telling us to think about ourselves, what we need and deserve. To care for another human being at some personal cost is completely countercultural.

That is the ideal of the Christian faith. History and experience shows that the church has fallen well short of this ideal, suffering from selfishness just as much as anything



else. Yet we keep going, keep trying. Who knows – maybe one day we'll get there, and then, as Jesus says, "By this everyone will know that you are my disciples, if you have love for one another." (John 13:35)


