



BOLINDA PRIMARY SCHOOL NEWS

For those readers that don't know us, let me briefly introduce Bolinda Primary School to you. We are situated on the Romsey-Lancefield Road just south of the Monegeetta store in Mullalys Road. We are a small school of 58 children (having grown from 24 just 6 years ago), with a total of 12 staff who work varying times during the course of the week.

We run 4 classes, P-1, 1-2, 3-4, and 5-6, and of course teach the 8 Key Learning Areas that all Government Schools are required to provide. We are also able to help those children who may require additional assistance.

There is great excitement amongst the children at the moment as the new Bolinda Community basketball court adjacent to the school, has just been completed. You can imagine that the goals will get a fair workout in the months ahead!! We thank local identity Doug Newnham and his company for the great job done on the court, and also Cr. Geoff Neil for his tireless work on behalf of the school.

- Our 6 new Preps have started their school life with enthusiasm and are extremely happy to join in the activities of their school. They particularly love collecting the eggs from the school chooks every day along with their teachers Mrs. Julie Cooke, Mrs. Janet Cain and Integration Aide, Marg Fraser.
- The 1-2 class with Mrs. Lorraine Lee and Mrs. Heldi Carroll, will be joining the P-1 class on an excursion to the Melbourne Aquarium shortly to complement their work on The Sea.
- The 3-4 class with Mrs. Anita Batty is already hard at their morning aerobic sessions and are working on a theme of developing tolerance by studying the different beliefs of people around the world. Tables work is also a high priority in the class.
- My grade 5-6 are naturally following the Winter Olympics (2 Gold for Australia at time of writing fantastic!!), and in science are looking at how their bodies work.

The whole school will be joining with Clarkefield and Darraweit Guim in a few weeks for a day of French activities, arranged by our French teacher Mrs. Caroline Smyrk. French music presented by a French musician, cooking crepes and French games will all be enjoyed by the children.

Naturally, we as a school will take part in Harmony Day on March 21st. This day coincides each year with the United Nations International Day for the Elimination of Racial Discrimination. On Harmony Day we think about the different cultures and lan-

guages that people contribute to our community. The theme for Harmony Day 2002 is YOU + ME US.

The last event for the Centenary of Federation last year, was the Peoplescape exhibition in Canberra. Bolinda participated by decorating two life size figures of important heroes in our school community. These were 2001 Grade 6 student Tim Ivone, and well known children's author, media personality and also our school penfriend, Jackie French. (I'll tell you more about Jackie another time.) The 2 figures have now been returned from Canberra and are on display in the 5-6 room.

Fundraising is always a constant in schools and Bolinda is no exception to that rule.

We are having a \$12 Family Portrait Photo Session by Vision Portraits on Friday March 15th. All proceeds to the school and photos will be back by Mothers Day.


Please ring the school if you would like an updated framed family portrait.

Every 3 years the school has a Triennial Review and we are having ours next week.

Independent reviewers, (this year from Ballarat) and quite separate from DEET, will come to the school to speak to staff, School Councilors and Principal to assess how the school has performed in the past 3 years. They will look at Annual Reports, records, benchmarks and statistics and then make recommendations for the next 3 year School Charter. This is a very thorough process that all schools are required to undertake. Knowing what the school and staff have achieved over the past 3 years, I am confident that Bolinda will perform very well.

Gardening and Fire Safety

A well-planned and maintained garden not only provides refuge from the hot sun in summer but also

helps to reduce the impact of bushfire on home and property.

"Developing a bushfire plan for summer is not something that should be restricted to the lead-up to the fire danger period, thought should be given to both short term and long term planning in terms of planting, landscaping and garden maintenance," said Romsey Captain Ron Cole.

"Unfortunately many well meaning people get caught out when it comes time to remove the r sh and clippings. The mild weather has luned them into believing that it's safe to burn off." he added.

While restrictions remain in force it is illegal to have any form of fire in the open without a permit (obtainable from the Macedon Ranges Shire Council). If you have an incinerator, firstly check with the local council to see if there are any restrictions on the use of incinerators in your area. Secondly check that the incinerator to see if it's in good condition with an effective lid that completely contains the fire. There must be an area of 3 metres all round and above the incinerator that is completely cleared of all flammable material with someone in attendance at all times. It is important to have sufficient water or hand in case of an emergency.

If the day is a day of total fire ban then **no fires**, even in incinerators are allowed.

The value of growing Local Indigenous Plants -

by Kerri Mewett, Deep Creek Landcare Group.

Do you live on a property or a block in town and are wondering what type of plants to grow? There are many good reasons to grow indigenous (or local native) species.

Values of Indigenous plants:

- 1 Indigenous plants are perfectly adapted to local weather conditions including frosts, wet, cold winters and dry summers.
- 2 Indigenous plants are perfectly adapted to the local soil types, which are variable.
- Indigenous plants need less water and maintenance than exotic species. Watering over the first summer will give plants an excellent start and then, once established, will need little or no watering. Depending on your situation and the plant species, a light prune once a year would benefit plant growth. *Do not prune trees* Less water = less dollars spent.
- 4 Indigenous plants attract local birds and wildlife by creating habitat and a food source. Animals may include
- 5 honeyeaters, wrens, small possums, koalas. There are prickly species of shrubs that provide excellent protection for nesting sites. (Remember that Macedon Ranges Shire Council has a curfew for all cats at night, so be fair to our threatened wildlife and lock up your cats).
- 6 Many indigenous plants are fast growing. If you are wanting to grow a windbreak or screen, a mixed group of indigenous plants would be an excellent choice.
- 7 bu can match indigenous species to suit your situation. For example, there are species adapted to wet sites; steep, rocky sites; along creeks and rivers; sites that are wet in winter and dry in summer, to name a few.
- 8 Indigenous grasses and sedges have a fibrous root system that is excellent for soil stabilisation and erosion con-
- 9 Indigenous grasses, herbs and sedges produce green growth over summer, and so could reduce potential fire hazard.
- 10 And finally, by planting indigenous species you can help in preserving the unique local character of our area.

The Macedon Ranges Shire Council can provide a list of indigenous species.

To help choose the correct plant for your situation there are two excellent books for you to research.

Flora of Melbourne – a guide to the indigenous plants of the greater Melbourne area by The Society for Growing Australian Plants Maroondah, Inc.

Native trees and shrubs of south-eastern Australia by L.F. Costermans, published by Weldon Publishing. ISBN 0947116761

Indigenous Plant Profile

Eucalyptus viminalis - Mana Gum

The Manna Gum grows the leaves favoured by koalas. Its size is variable in height from 20m to 50m with a spread of 8-15 m. he Manna Gum grows along water courses, moist valleys and also on drier, higher levels and tablelands. It is a feet growing tree which sheds its bark in summer in "ribbons" leaving a white trunk. This tree is best suited to large go ans, parks and larger properties.

Melaleuca ericifolia - Swamp Paper Bark.

The Swamp Paper Bark is a useful plant for wet areas with poor drainage, but will tolerate dryness once established. It varies in height from 3-9m and may sucker to form a dense copse. Swamp Paper Barks have narrow, dark green leaves and cram flowers in spring. When the plant matures the trunk forms an interesting "papery" effect. A useful plant for screening or part of a wind break. The Swamp Paper Bark is suitable for gardens, parks and properties. It responds very well to an annual prune.

I have planted the Swamp Paper Bark in a wet spot in my Romsey garden as a visual screen. The plants have grown 1.5 metres in 9 months and have not been watered once over summer.

HOW TO ENJOY THE MITCHELL LIBRARY WEBSITE - Part 1

Once upon a time you had to visit the library to check out the new books or make a reservation or just chat to the friendly staff. Well, if you have access to the Internet and type in the above address a whole new world will be at your fingertips, so welcome to the 21st century. However, don't forget that even with all this new technology the library staff are still friendly and still like to chat!



On opening the Mitchell Library Service's home page you will see that it is divided into 2 sections. The top section is information about the Library's services and now is the time to find out more about what is on offer. Click on the following and see what happens...

About Us - Lists the customer service charter with general information about using the library service. Includes information on accessibility, service standards, rules & penalties and borrower obligations.

Branches - Lists the hours and days of operation for all Mitchell Library Service branches including a comprehensive timetable for the Mobile giving exact site locations, as well as precise times of service.

Just Arrived - Lists a heap of new books available for loan from the library. Also has a pretty colourful display of a number of front covers from some of these items to browse through.

Library Catalogue - This is the fun part!! There are 2 ways of accessing the catalogue.

<u>1. QUICKFIND</u> - type in your search request and then click OK. When the next screen (hopefully) satisfies you request, it will tell you where the item is located. If

you click on the underlined title it will then give you further details as to whether the item is on the shelf or on loan.

Or

- 2. You can select from *TITLE,AUTHOR,SUBJECT or an ADVANCED search* and type in your specific request. When your selection comes up just continue with the same steps as in #1 above. Easy! In both cases you can then click on PLACE RESERVATION at the bottom of the screen if you would like to reserve your find. There are 3 important things to remember with this -
- 1. BORROWER NUMBER is the last 7 digits after 33/_____ on your library card. If you are one of the few lucky people whose number ends with an A then type a hyphen instead eg: 200558A = 200558-.
- 2. PIN NUMBER is the last 4 digits of your phone number. (If the computer rejects your reservation request it is possible that you do not have a pin number recorded at the library or it has changed since your initial registration.) Check this out at the library if you are having problems.
- 3. DON'T FORGET to specify a pick-up location so that the item can wing its way to you as quickly as possible!

Services - This covers information about joining the library, borrowing, returning, reservations, activities on offer and charges, which if you are already a member you are probably familiar with anyway.

Feedback - This link is currently under construction, although there is a Guest Book if you would like to enter your name and any comments that you might have about the Mitchell Library Service.

My Survey is Still On!

Thanks to the 16 people who responded to the survey! I will be following up the issues raised and considering the viewpoints expressed. The most frequently mentioned issue was a pedestrian crossing at Newham. A campaign to lobby Vicroads will be discussed at a meeting at Newham Hall on Tuesday 5th March at 7.30 pm. The next_most frequently mentioned were development issues (see below), care for forests and listening and responding to the residents. A range of other issues were raised by only one person. Particular thanks to those who gave their names. I have already spoken to some and attempted to contact all of them. Forms are now available at each of the survey box locations. Please keep the responses coming in to give me a clear direction! Should I assume that all non responses indicate that everything is perfect?? (Joke!)

Getting the Development We Want

There's a significant development issue on the books for Stawell St Romsey. Four house units have already been built on one average house block and now there's an application for four more next door. A meeting with residents about their objections has profoundly affected me. I will be opposing this application. Yes, the towns should be contained with a clear boundary and the central core should have a higher density to make better use of facilities and service? Yes we need to provide a diversity of housing. But this does not mean that a street of single houses should go fro. two bare blocks to 8 houses overnight. It does not mean we should allow development that does not suit our rural towns.

I want to raise the bar, to have higher expectations of our developers. To get the kind of development we want, we have to clearly define it in the planning scheme.

We need time to develop neighbourhood character overlays. There is nothing to define the special development of Romsey in the planning scheme now. For perhaps a year we need a moratorium on medium density development in Romsey. A Romsey Planning Advisory Committee with reps from say business, historical society, interested community members and local people with appropriate expertise, would develop the detail of what locals mean by 'Romsey character'. As well as a definition of the specialness of Romsey we need to define how this is to be achieved in practical terms. We need to do this for all our towns, but first the pressure is in Romsey, so lets start there. There are many specific ways to do this. Other communities are further along. Research is needed. *World's* best practice. Let's find the best ideas around. To produce rural towns which remain uniquely *our* towns, as they change and grow. Should we settle for less?

I will be calling for a moratorium on the development of more than two units per block in Romsey while neighbourhood character overlays are defined. Are you with me? I need your support. This is vital for Lar field and Newham too, and for rural areas. If defining the style of development in the place where you live what you want, tell me via the survey forms.

Come to the next Mt William Reference Group Meeting. It will be in Romsey at the Mechanics Institute on Tuesday March 12 at 7.30. Come along and make the development of your town the hot topic. Please remember that these meetings are about defining broader issues and finding ways to work on solutions together. Please contact me directly on 5427 0156 with your individual concerns.




