



The word on the ward

The Council has decided to look at new names for our three wards, which offer a better connection to our Macedon Ranges region than the current East, West and South wards. And the views and suggestions of the community are going to play a key role in the decision. I realise that we've officially had our "new" ward names only since the last election, but I support the proposal to select names that are more reflective of who we are and our own unique identity.

The suggestions we are seeking should consider such things as the historic, cultural and environmental characteristics of each ward – and could include honoring the name of a person or family who is significant in our history. My preference is to rename the East Ward as Deep Creek Ward. Our wonderful creek meanders through much of the east of the Shire



That's my view. But we want everyone's views and ideas on the name change proposal, and I urge everyone with an interest to have their say. The Council will be undertaking a comprehensive community information campaign over the next couple of months seeking suggestions, and we will send letters to local community groups and schools for their input. Submissions are required by June 9, and then a working group will present a report to Council in July. A shortlist of suggestions will then be put back to the community.

Not taken for granted

The 2006/07 round of Council's community funding scheme, which provides grants for local clubs and organisations, is being launched this month. The scheme has distributed around \$1 million to worthy groups over the past 10 years, and I urge any of our hard-working volunteer groups to apply if they need funding for a project. The categories are for recreation and facilities grants, community services/youth grants, and culture, festivals and events grants. Interested groups should attend the launch and information briefing at the Kyneton Town Hall on May 16 – during Volunteers Week – to obtain advice and more detail of eligibility. They should also go to the *website www.macedon-ranges.vic.gov.au* to get further information and contact details. **Applications close on June 9, and I would expect that the successful applicants will be notified in early August. I urge all groups within the East Ward to consider an application.**

The Touch - Colleen McCullough

I gave up wading through McCullough's 'First Man in Rome' series when I spent more time flicking back to the cast of characters than actually reading the story. Sometimes her books just get bogged down in too much detail (and too many Julia's and Julius's). Happily, The Touch, sees her back to her best with a family saga set amidst the NSW gold rushes of the late 1800's. Alexander Kinross definitely has the Midas touch when it comes to making a fortune and he decides to write back home to his native Scotland to acquire a young bride to breed his future descendents. Accordingly 16 year old Elizabeth Drummond is despatched to Sydney - lonely, frightened and overwhelmed with the imposed changes in her life. Needless to say she and Alexander are not brilliantly compatible, and as he also has a mistress, Ruby, who he is passionately in love with, the plot can only thicken.

Bravemouth: living with Billy Connolly - Pamela Stephenson

In 2002 Billy Connolly turned 60. This book tells the story of that year in his life when he tried to grow old disgracefully, or at the very least, 'beigelessly'. Interspersed with anecdotes from the previous decades of his life, are the plans for his 60th birthday celebrations, his work commitments and his family's responses to his dress sense! Definitely a tad more light-hearted than her biography Billy, 'Pamsy' has managed to draw a picture of this famous comedian as a mainly relaxed, easy-going, banjo-picking, loving father and grandfather. A selection of photos compliments the text and I particularly like the one captioned, "So you want to date our daughter?" A must for admirers of this man's work.

Romsey Football & Netball Club


Well, the season has now started. At the time of writing we have played once and achieved mixed success in both the Netball and Football matches. It's too early to make comments yet.

The following is a letter that we received from Jenny Ellis outlining some of the work done by Uniting Care's Share Community Appeal.

"Just before Christmas, I travelled with a film crew across regional Victoria, making a new national DVD on UnitingCare.

Our first stop was UnitingCare Ballarat's meals program, funded by donations to UnitingCare's SHARE Community Appeal. This program opens every day of the year to provide hot, nutritious meals for homeless people. While waiting for filming to start, I spent two hours in the company of a wonderful old man, whom we will call Jim.

Jim is 80 years old, and sleeps huddled in doorways on the cold streets of Ballarat. With his grey hair sprouting from beneath a tattered hat and possessions bundled in a plastic bag it was difficult not to feel sorry for Jim.

When Jim left, a social worker told me that he has a mental illness. While he now lives on the streets, he once had a job and a beautiful home in the local area. He still has the house, but it is filled to the rafters with rubbish, rotting food and rats. You can't even open the front door. In desperation and unable to control his compulsion to hoard junk, Jim has resorted to spending the years he has left living on the streets.

"I don't know what would happen to me without UnitingCare," he told me.

Your support of Pancake Day, UnitingCare's only national fundraising event, will enable us to fund more than 50 programs like Ballarat UnitingCare's meals program.

Your support will also enable us to distribute \$200,000 in food vouchers through our CommunityCare program. These food vouchers help UnitingCare agencies feed those - like Jim - who are very hungry and have nowhere else to turn.

Thankyou again for participating in Pancake Day and helping us to support more than 1.3 million men, women and children across Australia.




We cheered our team on and the other teams too. Everyone in our team finished their race whether it was 2Km or 3Km, they all finished. At the end of the day all of us had had a great time.

BOLINDA PRIMARY SCHOOL NEWS

We have had such a busy start to the term but when you are working with children, you are always busy, life is never dull and how time flies!!!

Tuesday morning Assembly sees the students recite our Statement of Commitment after the National Anthem. This is followed by the presentation of weekly Principal's Awards, and any news that has to be passed on to the whole school. It is always nice to see a good attendance of parents at Assembly as well.

Every morning (weather permitting) we all walk our "K a Day", which means we walk a kilometre or more around the Bolinda Reserve on the new Bolinda Walking Track that was officially opened by Cr. John Connor just before the holidays. Some days the children walk with a ball to catch or bounce as they go, reinforcing ball handling skills as they walk. Many parents also take the opportunity to walk and talk with their children at this time as well.

We have had three clinics from Victorian Golf Association professional, John O'Halloran, who took the children through the basics of golf, how to stand, the different clubs and how to approach the game. They were very well received by the children and some could see that maybe golf was the game for them. Several parents have since been asked to have a round of golf with their children. Maybe the next Baddeley, Scott, Webb or Norman are just starting their career!!!

An AFL clinic with two Essendon players was also a recent highlight. Jason Winderlich and Kepler Bradley did a terrific job going through the skills necessary for a footy player and a great question and answer session followed with both players signing many autographs and footy cards for the children. Our children were very pleased to hear that Jason had come from a small rural school in Gippsland with only 50 children like us at Bolinda. He was very encouraging to the children that coming from a small school did not stop them from achieving their aims and dreams as long as they were prepared to work hard at what they wanted to do.

Under the marvellous instruction of one of our parents, all children have been participating in the preparation of healthy meals for the whole school as part of our Bolinda Blooming Lunch Program. Peta Heine has worked with reknowned chef, author and personality Stephanie Alexander at the Collingwood Children's Kitchen Project and has brought her expertise to our classrooms to assist in the education of our children. It has been a wonderful success. The children take part in planting vegetables in the schools vegie garden, they then harvest the crop, prepare the food in the kitchen and all enjoy the healthy lunch afterwards. They see the whole picture regarding the food they eat. Then they take a copy of the recipe home to help in the kitchen and show off their skills to mum and dad.

Older children wrote to Commonwealth Games athletes before the holiday and they were very fortunate to receive 4 replies including a hand written letter from Bowls Gold medallist, Kelvin Kerkow, encouraging the children to have a go at Lawn Bowls.

Correspondence continues between the Grade 4-5-6 children and our very dear, long time pen friend, Jackie French. When Bolinda children first wrote to Jackie in 1995, Jackie had only written 2-3 books, she has now taken that total to well over 100, with three books having been dedicated to the children of Bolinda. Jackie still hand writes letters to every child from the school who writes to her. She truly is our "special friend".

We certainly have been and continue to be very busy at Bolinda. At the time of writing, our ANZAC Day service is being planned with all grade 5-6 children to take part in the proceedings with readings or explanations about the ANZAC story. We will all sit around our pine tree in the school grounds that is a direct relative from the original seeds brought back from Lone Pine in Gallipoli in 1918. Lest We Forget.

Our 4 new Preps are thriving after a term with all the exciting activities of their new classroom and school. How quickly they learn to mix with the older children in the different playground activities. One of the really wonderful things about a rural school is seeing children of all ages mixing in together and learning to get along with each other.

All schools have many hard workers behind the scenes that help the school in ways that everyone does not often see and don't necessarily know about. This is often the case during school holidays just passed. People who water gardens, feed the school cat, clean out chook pens, sweep pathways, check out water pumps, cut grass, check spouting and a lot of other little jobs that just have to be done. In a small school like ours, people just tend to jump in and help where and when they can. A very big 'Thank You' to all the helpers.
