1 John: 1: 1.

That which was from the beginning, which we have heard, which we have seen with our eyes, which we have looked at and our hands have touched – this we proclaim concerning the Word of life.

A neighbour of mine took his family for a week's holiday on the canal. They hired a narrow boat. The weather was kind, the landscape on the river banks green and gentle. The pace of life was slow, undemanding, apart from the locks which punctuated the journey with commas rather than full stops on the way.

A few days after their return he and I were both in our drives washing our cars. I asked him about the holiday. "Great", he said, "We relaxed, watched the life around us. One day we noticed butterflies on the river bank, and realised they were travelling faster than we were. It gave us a new perspective."

Life is fast these days. There's little time for anything but the immediate demands of work and daily living. The 'human' things are in danger of being squeezed out.

A poet W.H. Davies wrote:

"What is this life if full of care, we have no time to stand and stare..."

He wasn't thinking of an aimless idleness where nothing registers, but of a long look which takes in the world around us. A look which wonders and delights in the intricate beauty of butterflies and all that nature offers. It may renew our perspective and help us understand that life is more than a mad rush from one commitment to another.

St.John links it to our spiritual awareness.

"That which we have looked at" he says, and the word means gazed at, taken time over. Whether it is the river bank, butterflies or the revelation of God's love in Jesus Christ, we need to take time to consider it, absorb its beauty and reflect on how it can change our lives.

### 35m Optus Tower Proposal Still in the Pipe Line

The Romsey Primary School community was saddened to hear that Optus through Aurecon has applied to VCAT to fight the refused permit for a 35m Optus telecommunication tower at the rear of the school. Despite a unanimous vote by the Macedon Ranges Shire Council to refuse the permit, and strong community support for the relocation of such a tower away from the school and the middle of town, Optus continues to fight.

Macedon Ranges Shire Council is planning to support its refusal of the original application at VCAT. The school and local residents who lodged original objections to the 35m Tower are also able to submit objections to VCAT and are able to speak at the VCAT hearing. This is expected to be heard in December this year. The premise for the refusal by Council for a 35m Telecommunication Tower was on the basis of aesthetics not in keeping with the regional area in which we live. The location of an industrial estate in the middle of town and at the rear of the school was also described as a "planning anomaly". The school objected and continues to support the refusal of the tower application at 11 Park Lane with the following key objections:

**Aesthetic Impact:** Romsey is a rural town in a rural environment; trees, space and nature are key lifestyle choices for people choosing to live in Romsey. A telecommunication tower at the rear of the school and in the middle of town does not align with this choice.

Romsey Primary School prides itself on its environmental programs, including the garden program, the student vegetable garden and chook shed, and the native corridors attracting native flora and fauna. The presence of a 35m telecommunication tower negatively impacts on this.

**Health Risks - No substantive proof**: for or against, on the potential health impacts of a telecommunications tower on the school community immediately beneath it, however World Health Organisation research suggests that these towers should not be placed near children.

**Future Developments at Romsey Primary:** a post primary and recreational and sporting facility on the north side of school would be directly impacted by the tower in terms of potential health risks and aesthetics.

**Choice:** By placing a tower in an already populated or built up area removes people's choice about where they live and what they want to live near. Rural environment is not complemented by a 35m telecommunications tower.

If you share these concerns please forward a letter of support to Romsey Primary School, Station Street, Romsey VIC 3434. Your letters of support will assist us to demonstrate the strong community view at the VCAT hearing in December.


### **Chess Tournament**

### VIEW FROM THE VICARAGE.

Dear Friends

Commandment number six says "Do not murder."

Moses intended this command to mean that no human being, on his own initiative, should ever take the life of another person. God gave life and only God may take it. It did not refer to war or capital punishment inflicted by the state for murder.

Jesus extended the application of this law, telling his followers not to be angry with another human being. He did not pronounce explicitly on war or capital punishment, but a number of his sayings place a very big question mark over killing another human being under any circumstances. The inference in this is that even if we think about murder, it is murder.

One of the key things about the last six commandments is that they are about relationships with one another. However, this also applies to both the way we think and the way we act. Living God's way is about thinking, feeling and doing the things of God. Good works are based on God's standards and we need God's help to do this.

For us today, we have to constantly ask how the commandment applies beyond the clear and explicit command not to take violently another person's life. Could this apply to war, capital punishment, dangerous driving, abortion etc., etc.?

That's this month's view from the vicarage as we continue to seek the divine in 2009.





### **REFLECTIONS. (5)**

Is IMAGINATION more important than KNOWLEDGE? If you have No imagination, how do you apply knowledge?

I was asked to set up the 'Pastoral classes', a program to settle year seven students into the secondary system. The main tasks were to find out their expectations, their participation in school activities, how they saw themselves and eliminating fears. How to get confidence in the teachers. Some of the students still consulted the Pastoral teachers in future years.

This again was a whole different task than class and subject teaching. Teachers needed to be trained but as usual in the department it costs money and is not available. More to learn...

I was then asked to work with an American teacher specialist who I am convinced came here to finish a thesis for a masters degree or higher, in the remedial section of the school. We were to study the remedial problem and to report on findings. Again a different field and again more to learn.

Not all pupils sent to remedial classes were remedial at all. Some were sent out of classes as they were bored, frustrated and became hard to handle. Actually they were smart youngsters. We talked to them and asked if they were prepared to help us with the real remedial youngsters.. Once they said yes then they took charge of one or more students and the truth is they were good at it. It gave them a sense of self-value. These non-remedials began to see themselves as assistant teachers. They discussed successes and failures with the two of us.

I set up a St John Ambulance Cadet group and used the same manner of allocating responsibility. I organised leadership training. The shyest most withdrawn when in Year seven, now 15 became the cadet leader, and two boys who did not think to belong anywhere became sergeants. They took command of the cadets, organised duty rosters, training schedules. What did I do? I taught first aid and theories, the cadet leader took the practical classes. Interesting to note that teachers reported that the cadets class room performance also improved.

I was often asked to help those fresh from teachers' college start the new task as a teacher. I did not believe in just sitting in to supervise their teaching. I always spend time to talk to them first to find out more about their personality, their aims and expectations. Just sitting in class watching is scary, and on these occasions the new teachers would worry more about what the supervisor thought and as a consequence lose track of what they were attempting to teach. I can still remember my first days, and I was an older, mature and experienced person and I was

I have seen new teachers, bright and full of enthusiasm give up in sheer despair. That amounts to a frightful waste

On the matter of subjects I was very puzzled. Subjects were changed at short notice whilst authorities in Mel-

bourne, without prior discussion, dropped others seemingly. The subject 'Clear thinking' was dropped, yet I believe it was one very important subject as it not only taught how to read and the ability to analyse and understand what you read, but it also taught the students to separate truth from fiction. The students were given an article, any type of article, including advertisements to analyse and debate the contents.

Today we read newspapers and accept what is written is the gospel truth.

Schools, primary, secondary, TAFE and universities can only bring a student to a certain level. After that achieved level, any further knowledge only comes with peoples' own efforts.
