


School's Garden Competition

Where are our Koalas and when did you last see one in the wild? Are Koala numbers lower today?

Can you help find them?

Koala surveys conducted over 30 years by the Macedon Ranges Conservation Society Inc. on and around Mt Macedon show that the population of Koalas has declined by 85% and by all indications, numbers are still declining.

Pressures on the Koalas in the last 10 years include increased numbers of fires, clearing

of trees for development, Koala disease and an alarming increase in numbers killed on the roads and by dogs. Apart from the Koala Counts at Hanging Rock Reserve, by the Australian Koala Foundation, Macedon Ranges Shire Council and Hanging Rock Committee ... there appears to be no current documented knowledge or information available on how large, healthy or fragmented the Shires Koalas populations are.

Between 24th and 31st October residents are asked to pick ONE day to count koalas on their property and fill in our sur-

Our communities must start to take action now, if we don't take care and protect our Koalas, there is a very real probability that they will become rare if not extinct in this Shire in 10 years or so.

Information on this survey and other Wildlife related topics will be available. All funds raised are used to support wildlife shelters, carers and rescuers to continue their work in the rehabilitation of injured and orphaned Wildlife.





Commandment number 7 says, "You shall not commit

Marriage is between one man and one woman. Marriage is the God given sexual relationship between one man and one woman. This gift was given to Adam and Eve right at the time the world was created. It is the most important relationship that God has given a man and a wom-

Adultery is sleeping with someone of the opposite sex who is married. It is forbidden because it was the main sexual sin of the day. Until of marriageable age, young people were under the strict supervision of parents, hence the command, "honour your mother and your father". There was no sexual freedom. Dear friends

As we all enjoy the warm Spring days and the occasional rainfall, we know that Summer and the bushfire season is just around the corner. s a community who is all too familiar with the devastating affects of bushfire, it is critical that we all ensure that we are prepared for the upcoming bushfire season. I urge everyone, especially new residents to attend a Community Fireguard meeting, contact your local CFA and visit www.cfa.vic.gov.au

In preparation for this year's bushfire season, the Government is holding community bushfire awareness week on **11-18 October** to help make our communities as prepared as we can be. New rules will allow landowners to clear any vegetation including trees within 10 metres of a house and any vegetation except for trees within 30 metres of a building used for accommodation. Fence lines can also be cleared for a combined maximum width of 4 metres either side of the property boundary fence.

These rules only apply to land which you own. You need the written consent of the land owner to clear vegetation on neighbouring land including roadsides. These exemptions seek to clarify and simplify rules around the clearing of vegetation for the purposes of fire protection and will be reviewed within 12 months. It is important to remember that the removal of vegetation is for the purposes of fire prevention and there are many things we can do to manage vegetation to improve our fire safety. Fine fuels (thinner than a finger) contribute most to the heat and speed of fire, so mowing, raking and slashing can reduce State Member for Macedon fine fuels around the house.

The Government is committed to increased fuel reduction burns subject to suitable weather conditions. Since July, we have undertaken 30 controlled burns across the state. and will continue to control burn throughout October and November when conditions are suitable. As conditions can vary dramatically from day to day, the planned burning in Spring will focus on protecting small ecological areas and townships, and selected roadside reserves in high risk areas

Further changes will allow residents to remove fallen firewood without permit for personal use from the nominated roadside road reserves for 2 weeks prior to the burns. Roadside reserves will be selected by Road Management Authorities in consultation with the CFA and the Department of Sustainability and Environment (DSE) because of

an identified fire risk and low biodiversity impact.

You can see where controlled burns are planned, and where burns have already taken place on the DSE website - www.dse.vic.gov.au

Knowing that there are many ways to prepare for bushfire, the Victorian Government has adopted all of the 51 recommendations by the Victorian Bushfires Royal Commission in their Interim Report. Most recently, a new national fire danger rating system which introduces a new category 'catastrophic' Over the coming months you will see more of these recommendations put in place.

REFLECTIONS. (6) The young are the world's future. Think about it.

When I discuss with adults the young people of today the responses usually are:" The young do not know what they want, or the young are not interested". I make a suggestion and am told:" we tried that before and it did not work". Ask then:" Why did it not work?" The response is normally a grunt, a growl or some sarcastic comment.

I attended a group, which were going to talk about youth. When I turned up with year 4 and 5 students. I was told that the young were not invited. How are you solving the problems of the young if you are not willing to listen to them? An Inspector of the Police appreciated the contribution the young people made at the meeting and asked if he could come and talk to my students, at school. He came and as he entered the room. I said: "The group is all yours, it is time to listen and learn" I left and had a cup of tea. After he finished he tried to compliment me with the students contribution. I responded:" Do not complement me, compliment the students". He then saw the viceprincipal and tell her of the interesting morning, He got from her the same comments." It is time to learn to lis-

I attended two meetings called by the young in Romsey. At both meetings I had to say." The youngsters called for this meeting, let them present their case". At the end of the second meeting I realised the meeting went the adult way and the youngsters lost their case.

What are we forgetting? All children are different. There are fast and slow learners. I do not believe there are dumb youngsters. I believe that all people are born with a talent and that should be seriously considered.

There are lots of things young people can engage in, Boyscouts, Guides, Ambulance-cadets, Sport -groups, Church groups, Air-cadets, Military-cadets, CFA-cadets, SES-

If that satisfies a young person that is fine and should be encouraged. All these organisations provide learning situations and develop leadership and how to work together. It should be all encouraged and be positive. Being negative destroys the future.

There are some youngsters who just do not fit in anywhere. These are the forgotten ones. I often think back to my youth. I was an angry young man. Luck was with me as I met my wife, a well-balanced young person with a calming mind.

Having been a volunteer probation officer, I prepared court reports on youngsters in trouble, volunteered at youth services which involved night work, dealt with the homeless youngsters, the drug or alcohol affected youngsters and those suffering the disaster of the pokies. There was anger, a frightening anger amongst the young.

After 15 years of all this work and worry I was tired and worn out. I had to stand aside.

Only a short while ago, when I could still move about, I got into discussion with a group of young and found the traces of the same anger.

Have faith in our young; learn to listen to help them ma-






Book Review - Fiction

How many of us sometimes get frustrated when only two people in the organization sign up to help with an all day sausage sizzle and yet soldier on so as the whole group/ club can reap the benefit for the greater good? Ah, yes – the experience of volunteering can be sometimes a paradoxical one....

The Good

The friendships made, the new skills acquired and the atmosphere of (mostly) unconditional contribution from those participating are undeniably great.

The ultimate joy or reward of volunteering is, essentially, a selfish one in that we usually feel good about the effect of the work we do and the work itself. Satisfying the desire to make a difference is a powerful thing.

The Bad

The mostly precarious balancing of work life, family life and volunteer life can be testing. "What's for dinner, Mum" has a whole new meaning as Mum frantically does kitchen gymnastics having not long returned from swim lessons after school pickup. As the clock ticks towards scheduled departure time for a committee/subcommittee etc meeting and husband has failed to return home, the stress levels start to rise. And yet the need to attend – the sense of commitment and obligation - is strong, despite the washing not vet folded, the dishes from breakfast not vet put away, and some unopened mail piling up! And don't forget the inevitable compromise of one's paid work commitments.

The Ugly
