Saturday August 17th - Par

Regular rain during the week saw more casual water across much of the course, severely limiting the areas that could be mown, and even after the cold nights the grass had continued to grow making for quite hairy fairways. Despite the water on course all surrounds had been cut providing a neat surface to pitch or chip from, but players had to make sure they landed on the green as the lack of bounce and roll made "chip and run" approach shots virtually useless. A steady, cold northerly wind also kept players on their toes. The skies looked threatening for much of the round however the rain held off until all groups were safely in the clubrooms. The day's results were; **Winner**; Shannon Wright (11) -1 from Anthony Lakey (18) and Andrew Laing (17) -3. **NTPs** went to 15 - Les Gaunt.

Saturday August 10th - Stableford.

After steady rain throughout the latter half of the week there was a deal of casual water across the course and the fairways were again quite soft. Some added pressure came from both dams; they were full to overflowing and sat like spiders in their webs just waiting to feast on an errant shot. The round began under steady sunshine with almost no wind; the afternoon remained clear with a temperature of around 14C, the best weather conditions since early June. To top off the day, for the first time in a number of weeks all players were thankful to get through the afternoon without any drizzle or rain. So on a fine afternoon, on a very wet course, the day's results were;

Winner; Mal Mottram (17) - 36 points from Les Gaunt (5) - 34 points (another 5 cm would have picked up the \$140.00) and 16 - Les Gaunt.

Saturday August 3rd - Stroke

Well, they say golfers are a hardy breed, that was certainly true for the Romsey members who tested the fates on Saturday. Players were met by heavy, overcast skies, powerful, gusting northerly winds and drizzle sweeping across the course, just what you want on a Saturday afternoon. Conditions were so tough one player decided to stay indoors and another only lasted six holes before calling it a day. Soft fairways provided little run, cold air caused many shots to fall short and the gusting wind continually pushed shots well off line. Recent vandal damage to some of the greens also increased the challenge of the afternoon. To add some final spice the drizzle turned to steady rain over the final few holes catching all bar one group. Despite all those tribulations it was a very happy, if somewhat damp, group who sat down for a quiet drink and a chat before the day's presentations were made. On a very difficult afternoon the day's results were; Winner; Les Gaunt - 83/5/78 from Anthony Freeman - 97/17/80 and Anthony Lakey - 98/17/81 NTPs - 15 & 16 Pat Chisholm.

Saturday July 27th - Monthy Medal, stroke & putts.

The July Medal was contested under very trying conditions, the fairways were soft, the temperature rarely got above 8C, there were overcast skies and strong, gusting NW winds blew across the course. On another tough day at the office the results were; **Winner** and July Medalist - Adrian Poulton; 99/26/73 from Pat Chisholm; 91/16/75 (The Medal of Medalists will be played on Sat August 31st) **NTPs** went to 15 - Dean vanDenHeuval & 16 - Adrian Poulton **Least putts** was a tie; 29 - Adrian Poulton & Steve Poulton

Dear Friends

Do you travel to Melbourne and need help attending medical or dental appointments?

Approximately 50,000 regional Victorians travel to Melbourne each year for medical treatment. But a lack of familiarity with Melbourne's public transport network can be problematic for many older people from regional Victoria. When this is compounded by a disability or medical condition, navigating to a medical appointment can seem a formidable task.

There is a terrific service available to anyone who needs assistance to negotiate Melbourne to get to a medical or dental appointment.

The service, provided by Travellers Aid, will arrange for a Medical Companion Service volunteer to meet you at Flinders Street or Southern Cross Stations and accompany you to your appointment.

If you find it difficult to get about there is a free buggy service also offered at Southern Cross Station. Buggies need to be booked with 48 hours' notice when arranging the Medical Companion service.

The Medical Companion Service operates Monday to Friday 8.00am – 6.00pm and weekend or out-of-hours services can be requested depending on volunteer availability. Travellers must purchase their own public transport tickets, but the cost of the volunteer's transport is covered by Travellers Aid.

You make a booking by calling 1300 700 399 between 7.15am – 9.45pm (7 days per week). Or leave a message on the Travellers Aid answering machine with your name, contact number and a Travellers Aid staff member will return your call to finalise your booking. If you are deaf or hard of hearing, you can email scs@travellersaid.org.au for a booking form or call the relay service on 133 677 before calling 1300 700 399 to make your booking. Please allow 48 hours for confirmation of email bookings

Early blossoms are coming out, the bulbs are poised to open – daffodils, crocus, freesias, etc – and the ground will be warming up to plant those pumpkins, corn, tomatoes in September. I'm loving the perfumes in my garden at the moment – the jonquils, woodbine, daphne, violets...

HALL COMMITTEE: No time to rest after our Great Centenary celebrations! Our annual Spring Fair and Daffodil Show is coming up fast, and we plan to make this Fair our best ever! New this year – a wonderful Pet Show! Your chance/the kids' chance to show off your special little (hopefully!) critter and win a ribbon ... Conditions to be the same with the substitution of the points system for deciding winners of the tournament.' Serious business, playing euchre! Also 'moved... that the Hospital Ball be held as usual in August on the nearest Wednesday to the full moon...moved that 100 tickets be purchased...' Wednesday seems an odd day for a ball to be held - and obviously, the reguirement for a full moon meant that many folk still came by horse and carriage or by foot. And 100 tickets!! We have wonderful photographic evidence that this did happen; some very clear photos of the large crowd were copied for our Centenary by Mrs Jill Challis. Some opportunistic photographer lined everyone up... There is an extra entry showing a great local community spirit 'moved...that an offer be made to the Kerrie Hall Committee to assist them by donating expenses on the Hall for a night's entertainment.'

HISTORY SUB-GROUP: At present, we are concentrating on photocopying and filing the material which was displayed at the Centenary Celebrations. Easier to collect the material, than it is to file it for easy retrieval. And storage is always a problem. We are still interested in any documents you might have of the Bolinda and Monegeetta areas.

BOLINDA HALL(Melways 610 J9; cnr Mullaly's and Melb-Lancefield Road): Don't forget our community hall is available for hire at very cheap rates. We want to see it used. That's why it was built! Great for adult or children's parties with lots of safe outdoor space available. Excellent for corporate functions, with data projection available.

BOL-DARRA (Bolinda-Darraweit) GARDEN CLUB: We had a great time at our local Webbers Garden Centre in Riddell. I was looking forward to looking at their bare-rooted stock – a great range, I've heard – and getting down to their shade-house stocking up on some vegies, etc...but unfortunately I didn't get past the natives! Such a great range of colourful, bird-attracting plants of all sizes and shapes and hardy for our variable climate; a couple of interesting Hakeas (I love those seedpods, too) and Eucalyptus 'Moon Lagoon' (Eucalyptus latens,) which is now grown for lovely, fine grey foliage and red seedcaps for 6 months of the year! Trim it to the size you want .This month we fe looking at Bonsai – and afternoon tea-ing at the Bay Tree. Spring Fair and Community Dinner takes up September, though we plan to have an extra outing to visit a private Daffodil garden in Kyneton. Oc-

tober is a visit to a Bolind Garden and November to a Malmsbury garden.

Remember, you are always welcome to join us. We meet at Bolinda Hall at 1:30 for a chat and brief discussion session...and then we move off to our garden visit about 2:00. (You might like to phone us first, if you haven't been before; we occasionally have earlier starts). PEOPLE OF THE MONTH: We were delighted to have Helen Clement (Pennington) as our one of our Speakers (Living Historians) for the Centenary and we'd like to share with you some of the memories she shared with us. Born in Bealiba on 17th February 1937 (she likes to remind us that she is the same age as Pope Francis – the youngest pope ever - but luckily, has less problems, though considers herself also richly blessed) she gives thanks for wonderful parents, a sister and 2 brothers. They lived in a caravan while their house, Penmore, was being built in 1941. Why 'Penmore'? Dad wanted to 'pen more' sheep on the unimproved property. (Helen inherited wit from both parents!) Helen was delighted to be allowed to begin school at Bolinda Primary. where they needed her 'to boost their declining numbers'. (She had attempted to attend school, under her own initiative, at Bealiba but had been returned home by the local unamused policeman!) Helen and sister Ann initially both rode a big 17 hand horse "Big Black Joan" which she remembers as 'an ideal kid's pony she was so quiet but so big we could only get on her by getting her near a fence to clamber on!' The 3 and a half mile ride to and from school each day took 3 quarters of an hour each way – for 8 years. This was together with Roma and Jim Heath, Ken, Doug, Joy and Jill McIntyre and brothers John and David Pennington. All in convoy. Ann went ahead on her pony "Bluebell" and Helen on her pony "Black Bess". 'I remember swapping our ponies for the bicycles ridden by our friends from the Monegeetta Army Camp. We always went to the store at Monegeetta on Thursdays to spend our pocket money on Violet Crumbles, PollyWaffles and Life Savers...the worst falls I had were not off "Bessie" but off borrowed bicycles! Mary McIntyre and Eileen Brady often rescued us when we fell off wayward ponies!! Jock Jamieson (From Darraweit Guim) in his old vehicle always spooked our ponies when his gas producer backfired!' Helen continues, "I have enjoyed the ups and downs of my life (we all enjoy the "many ups" and help each other through the "occasional downs"!! Now at 76 and slowed down somewhat by a series of health problems, I am humbled to be the only survivor of my "Pennington" family and wish that they could be present!! I'm learning to live one day at a time and as I "climb every mountain', I hope to finally "fly over the rainbow" safely, with my simple faith in a loving god still intact! May God bless us all and keep us all safe in a more peaceful world soon! AMEN (to all the above!!)" Wow! Thanks, Helen for sharing these delightful memo-

New Local Law on public exhibition

A new local law for the Macedon Ranges, now on public exhibition, proposes new or revised controls around open air burning, the keeping of animals, septic tank maintenance, and shipping containers on residential land.

After a period of public consultation to draft the new local law, on Wednesday 24 July Council stated its intention to formalise the law at its Ordinary Council Meeting. After the formal exhibition period and hearing of public submissions, it is anticipated the law will come into operation on 1 October 2013.

Among the proposed changes are the requirement for a permit to burn on land less than 4,000 square metres, and more stringent requirements around the maintenance of septic tanks in an effort to minimise odour, discharge and damage to the environment

New limits have been introduced for keeping roosters (prohibited on land less than 4,000 square metres), pigs (prohibited on land less than 10,000 square metres) and farm animals (prohibited on land less than 2,000 square metres).

There will be a new permit requirement for the placement of a shipping container on any land in a township for longer than 6 months, and tighter controls around unsightly buildings which are not adequately maintained.




